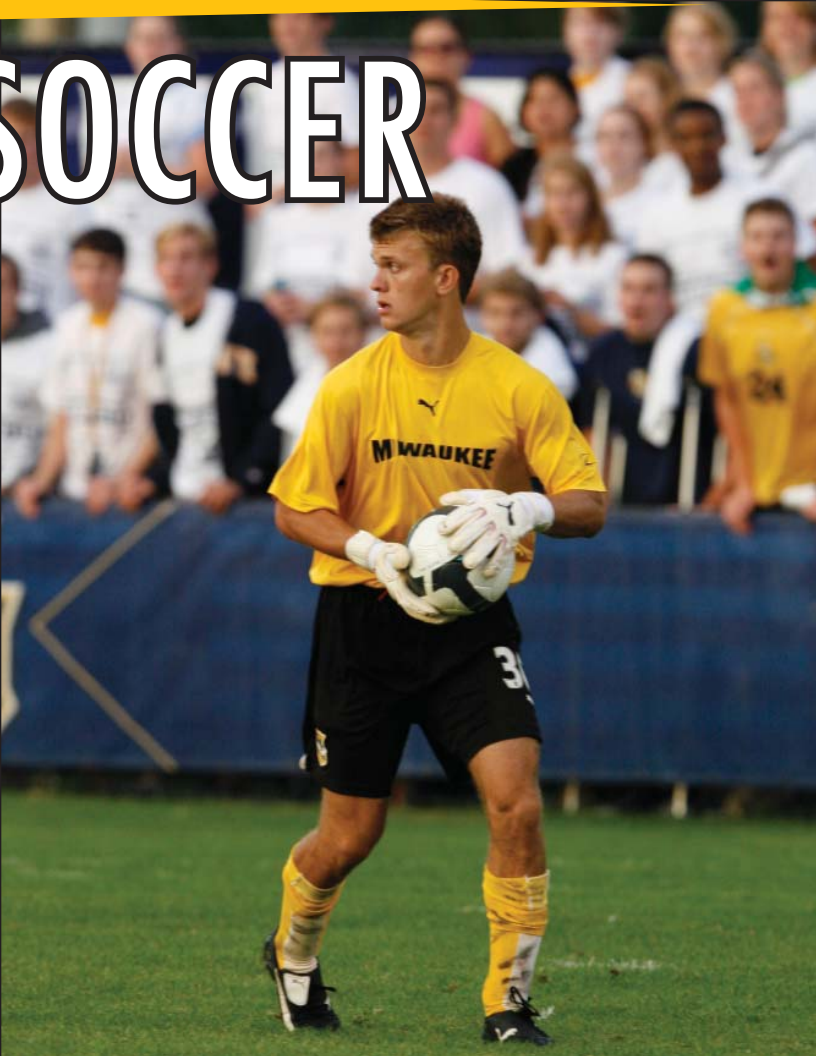
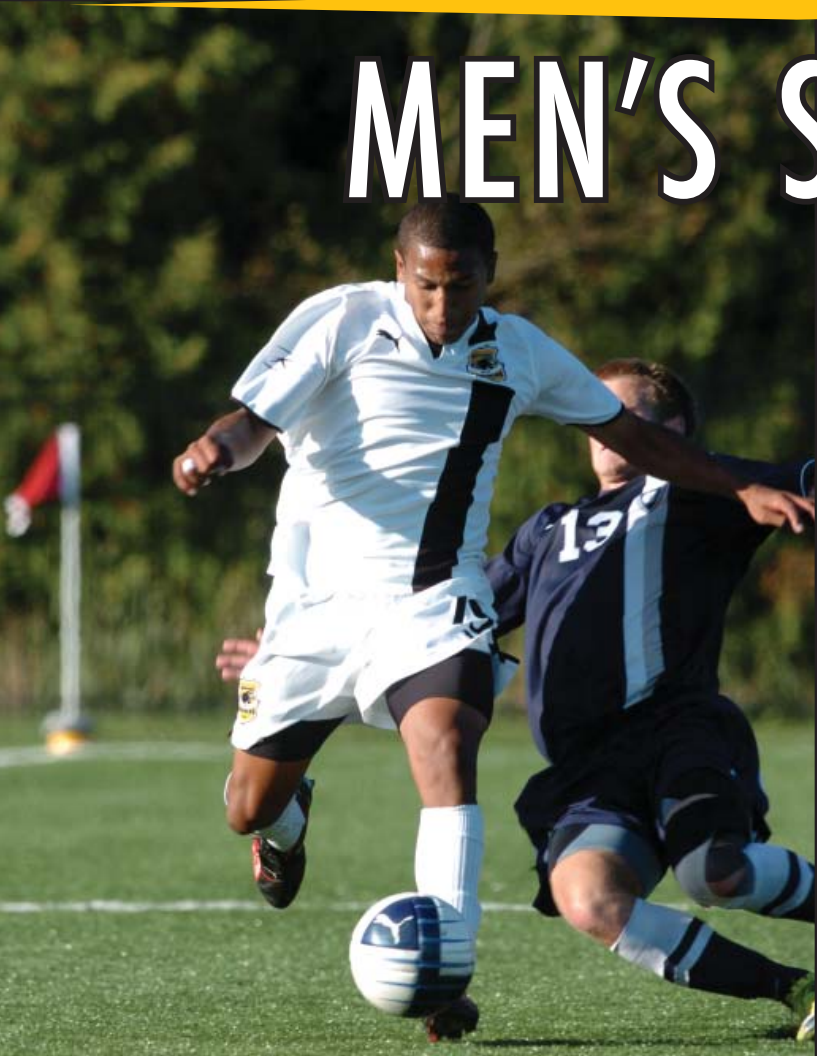

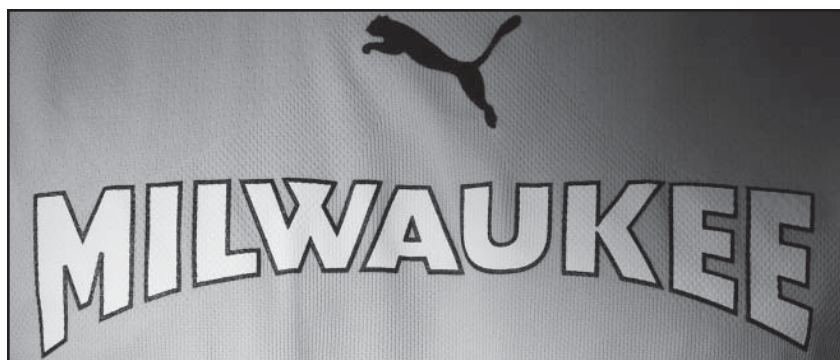

Chris Whalley Head Coach

Second Season



Chris Whalley was named the sixth head coach in school history in February of 2010. In his first season at Milwaukee, he helped the team double its win total from the previous year and had two players earn First-Team All-Horizon League honors - the most for the Panthers since 2007. He got things started with a bang, as the Panthers claimed back the Milwaukee Cup with a victory over Marquette in his coaching debut.

Whalley comes to UWM after a highly-successful stint as the head coach at Lees-McRae College in North Carolina. Whalley led the Bobcats to the NCAA Division II national championship game in 2009 while his team ranked eighth in the nation in scoring offense (2.74 goals per game) and ninth nationally in team defense (0.72 goals against).

In his five seasons at Lees-McRae, Whalley compiled a 72-22-11 record.

"I am extremely excited to take over such a prestigious program that has had such fantastic success over the years," Whalley said. "I am hoping we can work very hard to help the team improve and take the program back to its place of prominence in the city, state and nationally."

In leading Lees-McRae to the national-title game, Whalley helped the Bobcats to an 18-3-2 overall mark and a number-one ranking during the year. In fact, he directed his teams to three regular-season conference titles and a pair of league tournament championships in his final three years. Plus, in addition to the run to the national final in 2009, the Bobcats advanced to the Sweet 16 in 2008 and the Elite Eight in 2007.

He won almost 85-percent of his games his final three seasons at LMC, including a 21-win campaign in 2007. In that

same span, his teams went 26-2-2 in league play. Whalley's incredible success has been recognized when postseason awards are handed out, as he is a two-time honoree as Conference Carolinas Coach of the Year as well as being named the NSCAA Southeast Region Coach of the Year in 2007. His players have also been recognized regularly, as he has coached nine All-Americans, 21 all-region performers and 11 players that have gone on to play professionally.

In his first five seasons at the NCAA Division II level, Whalley made quite a name for himself, winning almost 75-percent of his career games to rank as the fourth most-winningest active coach at that level.

His teams ranked very high nationally in both total offense and total defense, leading the country in goals per game in 2007, scoring an average of 3.33 per contest. That season, the Bobcats were also ninth nationally in goals against average at 0.65.

In addition to his post with the Bobcats, Whalley served as the head coach of the West Virginia Chaos in the USL Premier Development League.

He joined the coaching staff at Lees-McRae as an assistant after a successful playing career with the Reading Rage of the United States Pro-Select League.

Born in Lincoln, England, Whalley played collegiately at Mercyhurst College in Erie, Penn., reaching the NCAA Tournament twice - including the Final Four in 2002.

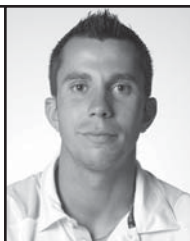

Ben Shepherd Assistant Coach Second Season



Ben Shepherd enters his second season as an assistant coach for the Milwaukee Panthers.

He came to Milwaukee before the 2010 season from NCAA Division II Limestone College in Gaffney, S.C. He spent five seasons as the assistant coach following a playing career at the same school where he was a four-year starter as a defender and in the mid-field and a three-time team captain. He helped lead the program to new levels as part of the coaching staff, with the Saints going 54-30-12 in his tenure, including 52-17-9 his final four years and 27-9-4 in Conference Carolinas play over that same span.

"Ben has basically been a rival coach that I went up against in South Carolina and was a big part of spearheading Limestone to become one of the powerhouse teams in the Southeast and in the national level at Division II as well," UWM head coach Chris Whalley said. "He has coached in the NCAA Tournament numerous times and he is a very hands-on, personable guy who is well-liked by the players. He is an astute thinker and is a 'modern-day' coach - up to date with all of the technologies and a great coach on the field as well."

Shepherd, a native of Cornwall, England, helped guide Limestone to its first Conference Carolinas Tournament championship and NCAA appearance in 2006. That year, the squad advanced to the Sweet 16 and finished No. 19 in the NSCAA/adidas national poll. The Saints were back again in 2008, finishing with a national rank of No. 23, when they went 16-3-2 with 10 shutouts.

He was also the program's recruiting coordinator and had a tremendous track record with his efforts. A pair of All-Americans, 14 all-regional selections and 24 all-conference choices played at Limestone during his tenure, including the league's freshman of the year twice in his five seasons. His teams excelled in the classroom as well, earning a pair of NSCAA/adidas Team Academic awards.

Shepherd received numerous honors during his playing career, including being named academic all-conference. He was also a finalist for the Carolinas-Virginia Athletics Conference's Murphy Osborne Award, which is given each year to the athlete determined to have the most outstanding academic achievements.

He graduated from Limestone in 2004 with a double major in psychology and English. He currently holds the Advanced National Diploma from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and assisted with the 1991 South Carolina ODP Program.

Mike Marchiano Assistant Coach First Season



Mike Marchiano enters his first season as an assistant coach for the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee men's soccer team.

Marchiano comes to Milwaukee after two seasons on the coaching staff at Maryland and also a four-year playing career for the Terrapins that included a pair of NCAA Championships.

"I want to thank Coach Whalley for the opportunity to become part of the Panther family," Marchiano said. "I am honored and privileged to have been given the chance to join such a fantastic soccer program here at UWM. The program is rich in history and tradition. I look forward to working with Coach Whalley, Coach Shepherd and the rest of UWM's excellent staff to contribute to the success of the program for the upcoming season and well into the future."

Marchiano played in 59 games at Maryland from 2005-08, capturing a pair of Atlantic Coast Conference championships and NCAA titles in 2005 and 2008. The Terps went 68-18-8 over his career and he was the team captain his final two campaigns. He also earned the team's Peter Lowry Award - given to the team member who exemplifies academic excellence, leadership and distinguished citizenship on campus - as a senior.

"We are very excited about adding Mike to the staff," Chris Whalley said. "He has a proven pedigree winning two national championships as a player and competing in the ACC. And he's been a member of the staff at Maryland - which is one of the finest programs in the country. With our connection with Sasho Cirovski [Cirovski, head coach at Maryland, played at UWM from 1981-84 and was also an assistant coach], Mike comes highly-recommended from one of the best coaches in the country and we are happy to have him on board and help this program get back to dominance in the city, state and region."

Marchiano spent the past two seasons on the staff at Maryland as a volunteer assistant coach. The team went 34-9-3, reaching the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals both years. He got into the coaching profession after a playing stint with Real Maryland of the United Soccer League and also after close to a year working with Wasserman Media Group.



2011 UWM Men's Soccer Preview

University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee men's soccer head coach **Chris Whalley** started his coaching tenure by reclaiming the Milwaukee Cup and went on to double the Panthers victory total from the previous season. He had two players earn first-team all-league honors, the most for a UWM team since 2007.

After scoring 12 goals and outshooting their opponent in just six games in 2009, the Panthers increased their goal output by almost 50-percent and outshot their opponents in 16 of 19 games overall. On the season, UWM played into overtime a program-record nine times and suffered four other one-goal losses. It ended the regular season on a high note as well with a 1-1 draw against Michigan State, ranked No. 22 at the time and went on to Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament.

"I think 2010 was a turning point for the program," Whalley said. "We got back to being competitive in the Horizon League. We had two results against nationally-ranked teams and that hasn't happened for a while. I feel like we made some big steps on and off the field. The boys are doing a much better job in the classroom and the team GPA is over 3.0. I feel that we are doing all the right things to get this program back where it needs to be."

In taking close to 100 more shots as a team in 2010 than 2009, the Panthers ended up leading the Horizon League in shots per game. This season, the coaching staff will look to find a way to finish more of those chances and continue to score more goals.

"Last year, we scored more goals than we did the season before, so our first goal is to do that again," Whalley said. "I think we need to continue to create more chances. We added some more creativity to the roster and guys that can score goals. Obviously, keeping clean sheets and defending well is also very important."

Whalley combined his scoring mentality as a coach, along with the recruits he continues to bring in, to bring a more aggressive offense on to the field for UWM than in the past few years.

"My philosophy is that we need to score goals and play open, attractive, attacking soccer," Whalley said. "I think last year one of the reasons we didn't score as many goals as we should have is that, even though we had a lot of shots and created a lot of chances, our quality of shots and decision-making

in the attacking third wasn't good enough at times. I think we added some good players who have that quality in the final third and are proven goal-scorers at the collegiate level. I think those guys can really help us take advantage of that and score more goals."

Defensively, Milwaukee was solid overall. If you look past a pair of games that got away from the Panthers, the defense allowed a very respectable 18 goals in the other 17 games. Bringing back an experienced keeper is a solid start for the back line. Junior **John Shakon** will be back in goal after starting 31 games over the course of his first two seasons.

"I think John is a very solid goalkeeper," Whalley said. "He's very steady, level, confident person and in goal that is what you need. John brings a calmness to our team and he is now becoming a good leader as well. I think he is respected by his teammates because he does the right things on and off the field. He comes ready to play, he works hard and makes big saves when needed. His job is to continue to do that and help us win games instead of tie them. We tied way too many games last year and went to nine overtimes. This year, if we go to nine overtimes again, we need to win a lot more of those."

Whalley's initial campaign came to an abrupt end in the league tournament after getting beaten by Loyola, but the spring campaign showed just what the team had

learned in the fall. Playing a nine game schedule, UWM went 6-0-3, netting 20 goals while allowing just six, capped off by a team title at the Wisconsin Cup that featured Green Bay, Wisconsin and Marquette.

"The spring is about player development, but we played a decent schedule and did not lose to a Division I program," Whalley said. "I think we have to take confidence from that. It takes time to instill discipline and philosophies and I think the spring was a continuation of instilling our philosophies and beliefs about the game to the team. I felt they really started to buy into that in the spring and because of that I think we are in a better position now than we were a year ago when we just took over the program."

The Panthers will look to a mix of old and new players to lead the way on both sides of the ball. On offense, junior **Cody Banks** will be the leading returning scorer from a year ago, when he finished second on the team with seven points (2G/3A). He started 15 of the 19 games he appeared in, ending the season ranked eighth in the league in shots. Another solid addition will be the return of senior **Robert Refai**, who ended up redshirting the 2010 season after an injury. He has appeared in 48 games in his UWM career, scoring 15 points (5G/5A).

Other leading candidates for the attacking positions will be sophomore **Robbie Boyd** and freshman **Gerardo Saavedra**. Boyd was named to the Horizon League All-Newcom-

er Team in 2010 after starting 18 games. Saavedra, a former member of the USA U-20 National Team, missed his first season a year ago with an injury as well.

"Cody Banks had a great spring," Whalley said. "He is someone who will get a lot of looks up front. We also have Robert Refai coming back. That will be like having a new player as well. Gerardo Saavedra is another returner who did not play last year because of an injury and he is an attacking player as well. And, Robbie Boyd also had a great freshman year playing a lot and we look for him to add to his offensive productivity on the field this season."

In the midfield, senior **Ross Van Osdol** is back after a junior campaign where he set career-highs in games played and games started while also finishing sixth in the Horizon League in assists.

Other returners who look to claim starting spots are a pair of sophomores who earned considerable playing time as freshmen a year ago. **Riley Weiner** (five starts in 12 games) and **Kevin Ferron** (seven starts in 19 games) both gained a wealth of experience in 2010.

"One of the nice things about Ross is he is very versatile," Whalley said. "He will play in numerous roles for us in different positions. I think Riley and Ferron have come back a lot more confident in the locker room and on the field with the experience they had from last year, you can already see it. Both of them played a lot in the spring as well, I am confident they can step up and play and they will be confident they can do that if called upon."

Whalley has plenty of options with the attacking positions. Seniors **Aaron Gibbons** and **Pedro Mejia** are both very versatile and give the squad much-needed depth and multiple newcomers will look to make their mark as well.

Alex Megna is the third-straight Wisconsin player of the year to join the Panthers, while in-state product **Kyle Neumann** netted 77 goals and added 66 assists in his high school career as well.

"Alex has been very good so far in training," Whalley said. "And Kyle is a local guy who works very hard and can play a variety of different positions. I think he will surprise a lot of people because he is a great athlete and is someone who has a good left foot. I think they can really help us out this year." One continuing twist for the Panthers is the addition of players from overseas, as **Nick**

Langford, Adam Hutchinson, Laurie Bell and **Richard Johnson** all come to Milwaukee from England.

"Nick is a proven goal scorer," Whalley said. "He has scored at every level he has played at and can be one of our forwards. If we get him chances, he is someone who can take those chances and finish around the goal and lead us to victories in those tight games."

"Adam brings good experience. He played at a high level back in the UK and was a leader there. He's just a freshman but plays well and organizes well and I could see him playing significantly straightaway."

"Laurie Bell is a freshman who could start for us and Richard Johnson could start centrally for us or right back. He is very versatile and a scrappy player that every team needs because he does a lot of the dirty work and allows the other players to play at a higher level."

In addition, a pair of transfers in **Jamie Bladen** and **Keegan Ziada** will give UWM much-needed experience on the field.

Bladen played the past two years Lees-McRae, winning a pair of league titles in addition to playing in the NCAA Championship as a freshman.

"I recruited Jamie to Lees-McRae," Whalley said. "He is just a proven winner who has won at every level he's been. He's a goal scorer. He scored the penalty that got us to the national final and he scored in the Elite Eight. Jamie is the kind of player that scores big goals in big games and that is what we need. He's played at a very good level again this summer and is someone who brings winning experience."

Ziada will have just one season of eligibility remaining at UWM after three seasons at Limestone College.

"Keegan was a three-year player at Limestone with Coach Shepherd and was an all-region player," Whalley said. "He has been very successful and is a proven entity who has scored goals and gotten assists at the collegiate level. Both Jamie and Keegan have proven they can score points in college soccer. I am looking forward to working with Keegan for once, rather than coaching against him."

The Panthers will be strong across the back line, returning a trio of players who played a lot of minutes a year ago. Sophomore **James Ashcroft** played nearly every minute of the 17 games he started, while classmate **Lucas Davey** appeared in seven games as a fresh-

man and junior **Ryan Whitehead** made six starts among 11 appearances.

"Jamie, Lucas and Ryan all played this summer and had a very successful season with the Bavarian NPSL team," Whalley said. "They all had good springs as well. Jamie was just named a sophomore captain and had a fantastic freshman year. We feel like Ryan has gotten himself a lot fitter and will push to play. Lucas started a handful of games as a freshman, so we will have a lot of people needing to battle on the training field to get a chance to play in the games."

Milwaukee adds a pair of talented newcomers in back in true freshman **Zach Stevenson** and **Brandon Wolf**, who redshirted a year ago.

"Zach comes from one of the most successful club programs in the country," Whalley said. "Brandon also had a very successful spring for us. All of those players will make us better."

In goal, Shakon will be looked at to lead the way. Freshman **Josh Rohde** will be a capable backup after a successful high school career where he was named Classic Eight Conference Player of the Year as a senior, posting a 0.86 goals against average.

"It's John's job to lose heading into the season," Whalley said. "Josh is there and Josh is learning, but will be the backup right now. Josh is a very good keeper and we are excited to have him on board. He's a great worker and they are going to push each other. John is going to be a captain for this team and has matured into a good leader. Losing Greg Rosenthal is going to be difficult, but we have felt like we have added some good pieces into that back line and feel like John is going to be a great leader back there and continue to take this program forward."

Milwaukee heads into 2011 picked third in the coaches' preseason poll. That is quite the step up from a year ago, when they were picked seventh. The Horizon League will be strong again, but the top tier of teams continues to change.

"One thing we have to realize is that a lot of good players graduated from around the league last year," Whalley said. "We did as well, but we also started as many as six freshmen in games last season. We have an opportunity now, with our players already in place, to build on that. I think the league is wide open. I am excited. I think there are some good teams in the league and I think we are one of them. We will get the chance to prove that in and out of conference play."

Kyle Trimble Team Manager Second Season

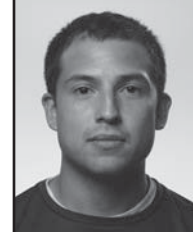

Home to the Milwaukee men's soccer team for all but one season since its inception in 1973, Engelmann Stadium holds the reputation as being one of the top soccer atmospheres in the region and it continues to undergo changes to improve the facility.

Prior to the 2010 season, a new, synthetic playing surface was laid down at Engelmann Stadium. Behind a three-year fundraising effort, the facility received a FIFA 2-Star rated field and was renamed in honor of Laura Moynihan, the former women's soccer coach and pioneer for girls' soccer in the state of Wisconsin.

The new playing surface from Poly-Tan was the first of its kind in North America. The company had installed 46 current FIFA 2-star rated fields in the world. FIFA final round competitions, Champions League matches and UEFA Cup matches can only be played on 2-Star fields. At the time of its installation, there were just five such fields in the CONCACAF region (North and Central America and the Caribbean).

Night soccer came to campus in time for the 2006 season. It was another fierce fundraising campaign that enabled the Milwaukee men's and women's

soccer programs to raise the money for lights to be installed on the campus soccer facility.

The lighting system for Engelmann Stadium is a state-of-the-art, four-pole system by Musco Lighting Company, a leader in stadium and field lighting, utilizing the latest technology.

With the ongoing improvements to the facility, Engelmann Stadium remains a unique atmosphere on the collegiate soccer scene. It exists among the urban University, tucked beneath a busy campus, unfolding into a stadium-like stage. The campus buildings that enclose the field, including the 80-year-old Engelmann Hall for which the stadium is named, provide an intimate setting for Panther fans to experience.

Engelmann Stadium has provided a distinct home field advantage for the Panthers, who have won over 70 percent of their games at the campus site.

Along with the changes on the outside, the locker rooms have also recently seen some upgrades. Most notable among the improvements has been the creation of the "Panther Room," a meeting place and film room for players and coaches that features

a large-screen television, VCR and DVD players and numerous amenities to keep the team comfortable and focused.

Permanent bleachers on the north side of the field, as well as temporary bleachers on the south side, provide seating for more than 1,500 fans. Space along the fences and grassy knolls are open for 500 more fans to enjoy the action.

The largest crowd to ever see a soccer match at Engelmann Stadium came in 2006 in the first night game ever played at the field. The Milwaukee men overcame a 2-0 deficit to score a 3-2 win over cross-town rival Marquette in front of 3,256 fans.

A number of post-season matches have been played on the surface, including Horizon League Championships in 1997, 2001, 2002, 2003 and 2004.

In 2002, the Panther men were awarded their first home NCAA Tournament game since 1980. A first for the storied facility, 1,864 fans watched UWM win the first NCAA Tourney game in team history, topping Oakland 2-1.
