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Head Coach Erica Janssen

The 2008-09 season will mark the first for University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee head coach Erica Janssen.

Janssen has spent the past two years as the top assistant coach for the Milwaukee swimming & diving teams, helping the Panthers rewrite the record book. School records have been broken 33 times the past two years with Janssen helping lead the women to their best finish at the league championships since 2001 and the men to their best showing since 2000.

"This is an incredible opportunity for me here at UWM," Janssen said. "A lot of work has been put in over the past two years in changing the culture of the swimming & diving program at UWM and improving our finishes at the league championships. For the student-athletes, not that much changes. There will be a smooth transition - just the face of the program will change - philosophy, direction, all of that is going to stay the same. [Former head coach] Dave (Griffore) and I worked together on every decision and now that will just fall on me, not both of us."

The program has made great strides over the past two seasons with Janssen on the staff. Last year, the women finished third at the league championships and the men also placed third for the second-straight season after three-consecutive fifth-place showings. The women set 12 new school records and the men five. Janssen also had a hand in helping Chase Gravengood qualify for the 2008 Olympic Trials.

"It is great to have a seamless transition in the leadership of our swimming and diving programs for this coming season," UWM Athletic Director Bud Haidet said. "Erica has already had a major impact on the growing success of our teams over the last couple of years and she has a bright future ahead of her. A solid foundation has been laid down the past two seasons and we want to keep the momentum in our swimming and diving programs going in the right direction."

In 2006-07, she helped lead UWM to numerous achievements as a first-year assistant. In addition to a runner-up finish on the women's side at the Horizon League Championships - where the team recorded its highest-ever point total - she helped the men to their best finish since 2000.

The women broke 11 school or league records and earned 12

Horizon League Swimmer or Diver of the Week awards. Their 6-3 dual record included six-straight victories and marked the team's best winning percentage since going 8-4 during the 1997-98 season.

In addition to placing third at the league championships, the men broke four school records and recorded a 5-4 dual record. It gave the squad a winning dual record for the first time since going 7-4 in the 1998-99 campaign. They also enjoyed their first five-dual winning streak since the 1999-2000 season.

Janssen takes control of a unique situation given her age and gender. She will be one of the youngest head coaches in NCAA Division I as well as one of the few women at this level to be coaching a men's team.

Janssen came to UWM from Ball State, where she spent one season as the graduate assistant coach for the Cardinals while finishing up her master's degree in sports administration. She was at UW-Stevens Point prior to that, where she was a four-year letterwinner for the Pointers from 2000-04 and served as a volunteer assistant for the program for one season after her swimming career was over.

While at UWSP, she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in business administration and coaching. In addition to serving as a volunteer assistant at her college alma mater, Janssen was also a volunteer coach at her high school alma mater, Oshkosh West. Additionally, she spent three years coaching the Stevens Point Area YMCA Swim Team.



Janssen was a five-time All-America selection, four-year NCAA qualifier and an academic all-conference honoree in the pool for the Pointers. A team captain as a junior and senior, she helped guide the program to the WIAC title in 2001. A four-time conference relay champion, she earned all-league honors eight times. During the 2000-01 season, Janssen swam the third leg for the 200 freestyle relay team that broke the school record with a clocking of 1:36.85.



Question & Answer Session With Head Coach Erica Janssen...

What are you looking forward to most as a head coach?

"I am looking forward to continuing the success I have helped build over the past two years, recruiting and developing the student-athletes that will continue to build these teams into championship programs. As an assistant, my role was different in the day-to-day operations of the program. Instead of taking care of most of the behind-the-scenes efforts, more duty will be in designing workouts and executing decisions. Previously, I always had large hand in these decisions, but ultimately, the final plan falls on the head coach and to that I am looking forward."

What will be your biggest challenges this season?

"The biggest challenge the programs face is improving on our Horizon League finishes. Just as we have at UWM, other league schools have recruited well this past season and there will be three to four teams - on both the men's and women's side - vying for a Horizon League championship. We have a great amount of talent in the programs, we just all have to be performing at our best at the right time of the season."

How has swimming & diving in the Horizon League changed in your first two seasons?

"The talent in the Horizon League has dramatically deepened in the past two seasons. It continues to become more of a challenge to place into finals at the Horizon League Championships. We have seen this with the addition of Valparaiso last season. With the continuous improvement of the league, it will attract more talented student-athletes to every league school."

How would you describe your coaching style and philosophy?

"Naturally, it is the hope that the student-athletes maximize their potential. As coaches, we hope to positively influence that by focusing our goals on the little things such as training, technique and continual improvement. This will set us up for success at the end of the season, where we expect to achieve our highest level of performance. The goal of the program is to win Horizon League titles. We train to achieve these goals both mentally and physically. Having experienced collegiate success, it would be extremely rewarding for our student-athletes to experience that for themselves as well. It is an incredible and lifelong feeling to be a part of a winning team and it is something they all deserve to feel for their hard work and talent. Each student-athlete is an individual, not just a member of the swimming & diving team. I care tremendously for each of them as a person and for their success in college and beyond. These programs emphasize not only athletic success, but also the importance of academic success. I hope each member of the team is a great ambassador for the program, the sport of swimming & diving, the university, and their respective community."

What strengths do you bring to the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee swimming program?

"By being a part of the program the past two years, I have already had a great impact on both teams. With stepping into a different role as the head coach, I bring my passion for the sport of swimming & diving and experience as a former student-athlete to both teams. As a former collegiate swimmer, I have had the opportunity to experience success at this level and I continue to carry those experiences and attitude with me every day. I can relate to our student-athletes by understanding the incredible hard work that is put in on a daily basis and the rewards from that hard work. By growing up in Wisconsin and my past experiences of coaching, I am very familiar with swimming & diving in the midwest which will continue to help tremendously with recruiting."

Why should a potential student-athlete choose UWM?

"UWM is a great place to get an education, which is always the number one priority when a recruit picks an institution to attend college. The city of Milwaukee has a lot to offer outside of the classroom. The athletic component of picking a school should never be the number one decision factor. We have two great swimming & diving programs that are on the rise that have proven to show tremendous improvement among individuals. A student-athlete can get both a great education and can maximize their athletic talent at UWM."

What is the ideal recruit?

"The ideal recruit is an individual who has a strong desire to succeed not only in the pool, but also perform at their highest level in the classroom. As coaches, we look for potential student-athletes that are competitive and share our desire to be successful individually and win team championships. Individuals that can contribute as a member of the swimming & diving team with points and to the overall positive atmosphere of the teams are desirable qualities for which we look. We want someone that supports teammates and cares about their success just as much as their own."

What are your goals for the team in the 2008-09 season?

"Our goals for 2008-09 are to win Horizon League titles on both the men's and women's team. We aim to perform at the highest level that we possibly can by individually performing our best, which will hopefully contribute to a league title and setting new freshmen, school, and league records in the process. A league title can never be guaranteed but as long as we are in the mix to compete for that title, that's all that we can ask. It is a great opportunity to have the chance to win a title."

What is your vision for the UWM swimming & diving program?

"I would like to see both of our teams win league titles and continuously compete for titles every year. In this process we will continuously improve freshmen and school records and qualify individuals for the NCAA Championships. Alumni can be a huge factor in the success of a program and I hope to continue to build upon our strong alumni contingent that supports both our programs."

What are some of your favorite memories from your first two years?

"Many great memories will remain with me from the first two seasons at UWM. Some of the most memorable from the first season are having our women's breaststrokers, Shannon Berndt and Kerry Rossow, place first and second in both breaststroke events at the Horizon League Championships. On the men's side, it was very rewarding to watch our team improve from the previous year's fifth place finish to a solid third place showing. They swam very well and I was extremely proud of our men on the 2006-2007 team."

"From last season, beating UWGB in a dual meet for the first time in numerous years was an incredible feeling. Our teams swam amazing and it was fun finally getting past Green Bay. Watching Danielle Wenger take out the three-time defending Horizon League Champion in the 1650 at the league meet was an incredible race to watch. She worked very hard all season and deserved the success she achieved. On the men's side, it was memorable watching the men compete for second place and having a phenomenal meet in the process. They set numerous school records and supported each other tremendously. Watching Chase Gravengood swim at Olympic Trials was also one of the most memorable experiences."



**Kyle Clements****Assistant Coach**
First Season

Kyle Clements begins his first season as an assistant swimming coach at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. He joined Erica Janssen's staff in early September of this season.

"Kyle is a tremendous addition to our swimming and diving program here at UWM," Janssen said. "He brings enthusiasm, experience, determination and the familiarity with a variety of programs that I was looking for when naming an assistant to the staff. His knowledge and contacts with recruiting will benefit the program immediately."

Clements comes to Milwaukee from Marshall University, where he served as the volunteer assistant coach for the women's swimming & diving team last season.

Clements earned his undergraduate degree in aquatics from Ball State in 2007, while also minoring in teaching aquatics. He spent four years as a student assistant coach for the Ball State swim team while earning his degree.

**Todd Hill****Diving Coach**
Sixth Season

MILWAUKEE

Todd Hill enters his sixth season as Milwaukee's diving coach since coming back to UWM following an illustrious diving career with the Panthers.

Hill continued his stellar and award-winning coaching run, earning Horizon League Diving Coach of the Year honors three times in the past four years. Over the past three seasons, his divers have combined to earn 22 Horizon League Diver of the Week honors, with seven advancing to NCAA Zone Diving competition.

He led a team effort at the league championships in 2007-08, placing seven divers in the top 10 on the one-meter board and seven in the top nine on the three-meter. Ashley Hall led the way after finishing second (1-m) and third (3-m) overall.

Hill had the women's league diver of the meet for the third-consecutive year in 2006-07, guiding Crystal Szymanski to the honor after claiming a league title on the one-meter board and second place on the three-meter board, despite her missing well over half the season to injury before coming back. In addition, Emily Duesler claimed All-Horizon First Team honors on the three-meter board.

In 2005-06, he helped guide Erin Blemberg to Diver of the Meet honors in back-to-back seasons, with Blemberg setting a new school mark on the three-meter board en route to winning league titles on both boards. Additionally, Panther divers placed 1-2-3 on the three-meter and 1-2-4 on the one-meter at the championships. The previous season, Blemberg won the three-meter crown and took second on the one-meter, as UWM had three finalists on the one-meter board.

In addition to his duties with UWM, Hill is currently the head diving coach for the Schroeder YMCA diving team. He joined the swimming & diving program after working as the head diving coach for Whitefish Bay High School and Homestead High School. During that time, Hill served as the assistant for the Schroeder YMCA diving team.

In becoming the Panther diving coach, Hill had added to an already impressive list of credentials that includes coaching many young athletes to the Junior Zone competition and coaching one Junior National Champion. He has also instructed six high school state champions, numerous high school All-Americans and has led many athletes to become finalists in state competition.

The list also includes seven YMCA National Champions, five AAU National qualifiers, three Junior National qualifiers (while also assisting a Junior National Champion in 2001), five Senior National qualifiers and a compilation of Junior and Senior National Zone competitors too numerous to list.

Besides being considered one of the best diving coaches in the league and area, Hill had a distinguished diving career at UWM. He won Midwest Collegiate Conference Championships three times and was a four-time NCAA Zone qualifier. He was named the MCC Diver of the Year in 1999 and 2000. Hill graduated from UWM in the spring of 2001 with a bachelor's degree in psychology.





Chris Zills is the UWM Sports Information contact for the Milwaukee swimming & diving teams. He joined the athletic department in July of 2005, after spending four and a half years as the head sports information director at Marian College in Fond du Lac, Wis.

At UWM, Zills is the primary media relations contact for baseball and men's soccer, in addition to swimming & diving. He also assists SID Kevin O'Connor with the men's basketball team.

Zills received his undergraduate degree in sports management from UW-La Crosse and his master's degree from Marian College. He has been an active member of the College Sports Information Directors of America since 2001 and has received national publication awards from CoSIDA for his work on media guides 13 times, including one for "Fifth in the Nation" for last year's swimming & diving media guide.

He currently resides in West Bend with his wife, Bridget, and two sons: Quinn, born in December of 2005, and Lucas, born in July of 2008.



This February, the Horizon League Swimming and Diving Championships will return to southeast Wisconsin for the first time since 2001. UWM will be the host for this year's event that will be held Feb. 25-28 at the Walter Schroeder Aquatic Center at the Rite-Hite Family YMCA in Brown Deer, Wis.

"We are really looking forward to hosting the Horizon League Championships at the Walter Schroeder Aquatic Center. The facility is in close proximity to many of the League schools and has been host to many regional and national meets," said UWM head coach **Erica Janssen**. "We are looking forward to having many family and friends there to support us at the championships. The availability of seating for all fans will create an exciting atmosphere for the student-athletes who are competing."

Wright State University is the two-time defending Horizon League men's swimming and diving champion and has won five of the last six titles, while the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay has captured the last four women's championships.

Home meets in **BOLD**



The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee women's swimming & diving team will be out to prove itself in the 2008-09 season. After being in contention until the final relay of the league championships two seasons ago, the Panthers finished a surprising third after running into a red-hot Green Bay team.

After losing just four seniors from last year's squad, including none of the seven student-athletes that won all-conference honors a season ago, the team is set to challenge for its first title since 2001. The Panthers will be young as well, with 17 freshmen and sophomores among the 27 on the roster. But, they will know how to deal with the championship pressure after second and third place finishes of the past two years.

"Green Bay just could not do anything wrong those four days," UWM head coach **Erica Janssen** said. "We had a good meet. Our times were good and our freshmen did well but we just need to build off that. It is all part of the process of changing some things in the program and bringing in the type of athletes we want to bring in."

One of the graduated seniors will be tough to replace, as **Jess Kelly** was not only the team captain, but a big piece of the sprint events and a main cog in the relays – at one point she was a member of all five record-holding relay squads.

"Filling in the holes will fall on everybody," Janssen said. "We didn't lose a whole lot. We brought in a strong class that will need to develop. You can just see the potential of the kids we brought in the past two years and it is very exciting to be a part of it."

The team has made its mark in the past two seasons – school records have been set 22 times in that span.

"Our goal is to always win championships, but it's nice when you take over a program to feel like it's yours – and one of those feelings is breaking all of the old records," Janssen said.

Sprints

Kelly was Milwaukee's top finisher in the sprints at the league championships a year ago, taking fourth in the 100 and sixth in the 50 freestyle. That opens up the door for the freshmen, and a pair that will be looked at will be high school All-American **Sarah Wardecke** and **Danielle Chapman**, two of the top high school swimmers in the state. Sophomore **Elle Gross** will also play a key role in the sprints.

"Sarah Wardecke will do a little of everything for us, while Danielle Chapman was brought in solely for sprinting," Janssen said. "Along with Elle, those are our sprinters ... it was a bit weak last year. Losing Jess is tough – her leadership was outstanding and an important piece of what we did. Now we have the talent, it just needs to come out."

Middle Distance/Distance

Some of the younger members of the team play key roles in the distance events, led by a pair of swimmers who broke school records as freshmen a year ago. **Danielle Wenger** finished the season on quite a high note, becoming just the second freshman in program history to win two league titles. She topped the field in the 1000 and 1650 freestyles, both in school-record times. **Kelsey Ogle** also had a record-breaking campaign, setting new freshman marks in the 200 and 500 free. The team has great depth in this area, as senior **Kelsey McDonough**, juniors **Alex Nelson** and **Jenny Westfall** and sophomores **Rachel Rebitski**, **Suzy Paasch** and **Gross** all contribute. The team will also have freshman **Heidi Niespodzany** in the mix.

"Danielle Wenger was one of those kids that came in under the radar and just needed to develop more," Janssen said. "Our program really helped her reach more of her potential and she just took off. Heidi (Niespodzany) is going to be very good. She only swam two years in high school but is an outstanding kid and will be one to watch out for. Kelsey Ogle is back and coming off shoulder surgery, but will be ready to go."

Butterfly

Senior captain **Molly Finn** leads the way for UWM in the fly events, but after that, the team will be looking for depth. Finn has been outstanding in her career and won her third-straight 200 fly league crown last year with a league-record time.

"Molly (Finn) is a great leader," Janssen said. "The kids respect her; she works hard every single day and never complains. She is just the ideal athlete you want to coach and has always been that way."

McDonough, junior **Bailey Nennig** and sophomore **Katelyn Brittain** will also fill large roles, but after that Janssen will be looking for people that will step up and show they want those spots.

Backstroke

The backstroke events were a weak area for the Panthers last season, as senior **Kristina Hansen** was the only one to finish in the top 10 in either the 100 or 200 back at the league championships. Wenger even stepped up last season in the event despite never swimming it before. Freshmen will be looked at to develop quickly in this area, as **Jennifer Schober**, **Hannah Egger** and **Maggie Pease** will all be given an opportunity to show what they are capable of doing.

"The two things we will be counting on in the backstroke events this year are for Tina (Kristina Hansen) to have a great senior season and for our freshmen to come into their own," Janssen said.

Breaststroke

For the past two years, UWM breaststrokers have dominated the top spots in both the 100 and 200 at the Horizon League Championships. Junior **Kerry Rossow** led that contingent last season, winning a league crown in the 100 and a second-place showing in the 200. Two years ago, **Shannon Berndt** won both crowns and then proceeded to place second and third a year ago. However, Berndt has transferred so that leaves a big hole for UWM to fill.

This will be another area where freshmen have been brought in: Wardecke was probably the best out of the state in the event in high school last year. Schober will contribute and all-state swimmer **Taylor Jozwiak** was brought in solely for the discipline.

"Kerry Rossow will definitely be leading that group," Janssen said. "She has the potential to make an NCAA cut and will continue to develop. She needs to be the leader for the newcomers. She has never been in that role [has been behind Berndt], so hopefully she will flourish."

Individual Medley

The Panthers were very solid in the IM events a year ago, placing both Finn and Nennig in the top five of each event. Finn has actually won two league titles in the 400 IM and will be the leader of this group. Junior **Ali Winus** adds valuable depth.

Diving

The UWM diving team dominated the league meet last season, placing seven divers in the top 10 on the 1-meter board and seven in the top nine on the 3-meter. Senior **Ashley Hall** will lead the way after finishing second (1-m) and third (3-m) last season in addition

to winning 13 times. The list goes on, as junior **Rachel Grimm** and sophomores **Kelsey George** and **Lauren Roy** are set to return.

"No one expects Ashley (Hall) to have anything to prove after last season, but she feels she has something to prove to the rest of the Horizon League that she is that good," Janssen said.

Despite the great depth, Milwaukee went out and got state champion diver **Morgan Hearn**, the WIAA Division II Diver of the Year.

"Morgan and Ashley can lead that group," Janssen said. "Rachel Grimm has been here two years, knows how it runs, has been work-

ing with [UWM diving coach] Todd Hill in club season, so it is time for her to shine as well."

The Panthers have one other thing going for them: hosting the Horizon League Championships in February. The last time the team played host in 2001, UWM brought home the league crown.

"We are really looking forward to the meet," Janssen said. "Wright State will be good and UIC too, after bringing in some solid recruiting classes. Green Bay will be there as well but it will be great to have the home crowd there for us when going for the championship."

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee men's swimming & diving team will have youth on its side this season. With 19 of the 27 student-athletes on the roster being either a freshman or sophomore, head coach **Erica Janssen** will be leaning heavily on the potential of her underclassmen to combine with the experience of a small group of juniors and seniors to improve on last season's third-place finish at the Horizon League Championships.

The team has made strides in recent years, finishing third at the championships for the second-straight season. That comes on the heels of three-consecutive fifth-place finishes.

"The team's goals were very high last season," Janssen said. "And, more importantly, we were much closer to second place than we were the year before. If we have holes, we cannot win the championship and we feel we filled those."

The newcomers jumped right in last season, scoring points in numerous individual events at the league championships and playing key roles on several relay teams and in the diving events, as well.

"As a group, our freshmen really excelled last season," Janssen said. "We needed them to step up and they did. Coming into this season, we did have a lot of holes, but filled them with our recruiting. We are very strong across the board and have no real holes. We added depth in diving and picked up good sprinters and breaststrokers to give us the depth and versatility we needed."

The squad lost five seniors a year ago, including team captain and five-time Horizon League champion **Chase Gravengood**. He concluded a brilliant career with 10 different school records to his credit.

"Chase is someone you cannot replace," Janssen said. "He was a leader and we will need someone to step into that role. We will miss Chase, but as athletes move on, we need others to step up."

Despite the losses, Janssen brings quite a bit of optimism into the season, based on the talent returning and the 11-member recruiting class that was brought in.

"I think we have a real good chance, especially after signing one of our best recruiting classes," Janssen said. "Our freshmen have to improve and get better. But, coming in where they already are time-wise, they are pretty talented and should contend to win."

Sprints

Sophomore **Jake Kalinowski** made a nice first impression in the sprints for UWM. He was the top finisher in the 50 and 100 freestyles at the league championships last year, including a seventh-place showing in the 50 free. Returners will have to step up to help replace departed seniors **Tyler Jefferson** and **David Yugo** and one of the key people being looked at will be senior **Andrew Belton**. Others looking to fill key spots will be **Sam Parent**, **Ed Lichinsky** and freshman **Nolan Sinkler**.

"We do have Jake (Kalinowski) returning and he really developed as the season went on," Janssen said. "We are looking for him to do some big things this season. Nolan Sinkler will be looked at in this group, as will Ed (Lichinsky) after a great season last year. Sam Parent came off an injury as a freshman, and hopefully with another year under his belt will develop. Lastly, Andrew Belton

is a great leader who will mold that group.

Middle Distance/Distance

The Panthers will be strong, as well as experienced, in the middle distance and distance events. Senior **Robby Leibold** will look to close out his career on a high note after setting school records in the 1000 and 1650 freestyles as a junior. Senior **David Adams**, junior **Matt Mahoney** and sophomore **Dan Heraly** also had nice showings at the league championships a year ago and will be an asset to the team.

"We have Robby (Leibold) coming back for his senior year and he is our 'big-time' guy," Janssen said. "David Adams is the other senior in this group and has had a couple of successful seasons under his belt and is always looking to improve. Dan Heraly had a phenomenal year and can be the real deal in these events."

Butterfly

The butterfly events will need someone to rise to the occasion, as UWM's top finishers in the events last season were now-departed seniors Gravengood and **Ross Bittner**. Youth will be served in the area, as Janssen has brought in several newcomers who are looking to make their mark.

"We brought in a tremendous group," Janssen said. "**Greg Wise**, **Sky Boggio**, **Jordan Diel** and **Evan Green** will all contribute, as will **Ed Lichinsky**. It will be a very young group, but it was a hole we needed to fix. This group will become a big strength for us this year. They are young and inexperienced but have plenty of potential to develop into great college swimmers."

Backstroke

Junior **Jeremy Waldhart** followed a strong freshman campaign with an improved sophomore season, placing in the top eight at the league championships and setting a Klotzsche Natatorium record in the 200 back over the course of the year. In addition to Waldhart, others who will be counted on include sophomore **Matt Kluczinske** and newcomers **Brady Huemann** and **Kyle Trelka**.

"Backstroke is really strong for us and we didn't really need to bring much in," Janssen said. "Adding Kyle Trelka to that mix will help them flourish. Jeremy Waldhart has done a great job. He is one of the hardest-working kids on the team and deserves everything he gets."

Breaststroke

UWM had just one point-scorer in the breaststroke events a year ago and that came from the graduated **Jeremy Seibel**. This will be an area that Janssen hopes to improve on greatly. Senior **Andrew Belton** will be asked to step in and newcomers **Sam Keele** and **Huemann** will also be looked at.

"This was one of our weakest areas last year, so we brought in some solid additions in Huemann and Keele," Janssen said. "Andrew Belton will swim some, too. They will be young and Belton will help lead them, but we need them to be successful for us to be successful and we will be counting on freshmen to do just that."

Individual Medley

Gravengood leaves a large hole in these events, but Milwaukee still has Waldhart (top-eight in both at the league championships) to lean on heavily. Freshmen will loom large in the IM as well, as **Nathan Rahe**, Sinkler and Brady will all be given a look.

Diving

Milwaukee's top diver a year ago has transferred, so this will give the youngsters yet another chance for a starring role. Sophomores **Nick DeWitt** and **Josh Lindquist** both have a year of experience behind them and the team brings in **Jake Koll**, the state runner-up as a senior, and **Shane Conner**, who placed sixth.

"We needed to develop our diving team, so we brought in Jake Koll and Shane Conner – two of the top divers in the state," Janssen said. "Nick (DeWitt) and Josh (Lindquist) have a year under their belts and really needed that. Now that they have it, they

can build and develop."

As the team continues to progress, it also knows that the other league schools continue to improve as well. The team will also have 'home-pool' advantage going for it at the league championships this winter.

"The Horizon League will be full of tough competition once again," Janssen said. "Having the championships here will be great ... our kids love Schroeder [pool] and a lot of them grew up swimming there. It will be a great way to close out the season."

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee men's and women's swimming & diving teams were once again named to the list of the College Swimming Coaches Association of America (CSCAA) Academic All-America teams, announced in August by the organization.

The Panthers were one of four Horizon League schools to make the list on the men's side and one of four on the women's as well. The inclusion of each extends long-established streaks for the UWM swimming & diving program.

The women have now been honored for 38-straight semesters with their 3.20 GPA this past spring semester. Wright State, Butler and UIC also represented the Horizon League on the women's side.

For the men, Milwaukee earned the distinction for the 14th-straight semester, with its 3.11 GPA ranking 38th. The other league teams on the prestigious list included Wright State, Butler and UIC.



The lists, consisting of all the NCAA Division I level, were comprised of 215 teams from 113 institutions. The University of South Carolina led the way in the women's side with a 3.61 GPA. For the men, it was Georgetown University with a 3.50 GPA.

The team awards capped an impressive year for the student-athletes in the classroom.

Last Year In Review



RECORDS WERE MADE TO BE BROKEN

The women's swimming & diving team broke one Horizon League record, seven different school records and four freshmen marks a season ago. They included the following:

200 Butterfly: Horizon League and school record
Molly Finn

Finn won the Horizon League title in the 200 butterfly for the third-straight season, setting a new school and league record with her winning time of 2:03.79. That eclipsed the league standard of 2:04.45 by Brittany Czoch in 2005 and lowered her own school mark in the event that she set in 2006. She became just the second-ever UWM women's swimmer to win three-consecutive league titles, joining Lindsay Caldwell on that short list.

1000 Freestyle: School and freshman record
Danielle Wenger

Wenger went wire-to-wire with Catalina Martinez of Wright State at the league championships, surging ahead in the final lap to claim the title in a time of 10:17.43. Martinez, the three-time defending champion and Horizon League record holder, was just behind in 10:17.97. The time was less than a second behind the league standard and broke the UWM school and freshman records that Wenger set earlier in the season of 10:26.62. It also marked the first time a Panther has ever won a Horizon League title in the 1,000 free. The former mark of 10:31.47 was set by Emma McKeith in 2005.

1650 Freestyle: School and freshman record
Danielle Wenger

Wenger earned her second league title when she smashed the school record in the 1,650 freestyle. Her time of 17:13.65 topped Susan Harmsen's school-record effort from 2007 of 17:31.71 by over 18 seconds. It was a great race for Wenger, who overtook last year's champ - Catalina Martinez of Wright State - early in the race and then jumped ahead of UIC's Kelly Hashoian at the 9:22 mark. She then held off a late charge by WSU's Cara Briggs to set the mile record and earn the crown.

200 Individual Medley: School record
Molly Finn

Finn set a new school record in the 200 IM at the league championships, finishing in a time of 2:06.75 to better the record of 2:07.30 she already held. It was good enough for a third-place finish, with Wright State's Jessica Weidert winning in a new Horizon League record time of 2:04.16.

500 Freestyle: School and freshman record
Kelsey Ogle

Ogle ended the 500 free at the league championships with the new school and freshman marks in the event, touching the wall in 5:04.27 in the consolation heat. The former school record of 5:05.94 was set by Leslie Brock in 2001 and Emma McKeith held the old freshman mark with a time of 5:07.48.

200 Medley Relay Team: School record
Danielle Wenger, Kerry Rossow, Amanda Nelson, Jess Kelly
 The final event of the first day of the league championships was a record-breaker, as Wenger, Rossow, Nelson and Kelly set a new school standard in finishing second in the 200 medley re-

lay. Green Bay won in 1:45.93, just ahead of the Panther time of 1:46.35. That broke the school record of 1:46.77, set by Julie Olson, Lindsay Caldwell, Briana Fergusson and Bridget Fargen in 2005.

800 Freestyle Relay Team: School record
Kelsey Ogle, Danielle Wenger, Molly Finn, Ellie Gross

The 800 freestyle relay team of Ogle, Wenger, Finn and Gross set a new UWM record at the league championships, but had to settle for third place when both Wright State and Green Bay broke the Horizon League record in the event. Milwaukee finished in 7:39.78, handily beating the UWM standard of 7:42.00 set by Lindsay Caldwell, Kristin Skiba, Finn and Jess Kelly in 2006.

200 Freestyle: Freshman record
Kelsey Ogle

This record was broken by three different swimmers (Ogle, Ellie Gross and Danielle Wenger) during the season, and was finally lowered again by Ogle with her performance at the league meet. She topped the old mark of 1:55.98 by Kelly Goetsch with her fifth-place effort of 1:54.62 to lower the standard she had already broken earlier in the season (1:54.78 in early February).

AND THIS WEEK'S WINNER IS...

A year after winning 12 Horizon League Swimmer or Diver of the Week awards (a league high), the Panthers earned seven of the weekly honors in 2007-08. Included in that was two weekly sweeps: Molly Finn (swimmer) and Ashley Hall (diver) the week of Dec. 11 and then Jess Kelly (swimmer) and Hall (diver) again on Feb. 5.

Hall actually had quite a successful year. In addition to 13 individual victories on the season, she was named Horizon League Diver of the Week five times (Oct. 17, Nov. 13, Dec. 4, Dec. 11 and Feb. 5) as well as Horizon League Scholar-Athlete of the Week a league-best three times.

STREAKING PANTHERS: PART II

UWM started the 2006-07 campaign 0-2 before reeling off six-straight dual wins in finishing 6-3.

It was nearly the same a year ago, as the team got rolling after an 0-3 start. Seven-straight victories later, the team finished the regular season 7-3. The last time UWM won more than six-straight was during the 1990-91 season.

AHHHH..... FINALLY

Jess Kelly's two individual victories helped lead the way as the Panthers finally defeated the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay Feb. 2 in Milwaukee by a score of 137-106. The Panthers won eight events overall on the day to post their first victory over the Phoenix since 1992, snapping a long dual losing streak in the process. After falling by a single point in their dual at Green Bay the previous year (losing, 122-121), Milwaukee came out with victories in the first three individual events to get things rolling.

After winning the first two meets in the series in 1990 and 1992, the Panthers had lost 15-consecutive times to their league foe.

RECORD BREAKERS

The men's swimming & diving team broke seven school records, one freshman record and two Klotsche Natatorium marks a season ago. They included the following:

200 Butterfly: School record
Chase Gravengood

Gravengood was involved in one of the closest and most entertaining races of the league championships. The top three swimmers in the race finished within less than a half-second of each other (.47), with Wright State's Warren Thompson taking first in a new league record time of 1:47.93 and UIC's Andrew Schmitt second in 1:48.04. Gravengood was third in 1:48.40, lowering his own school record in the event which he set at 1:49.17 in 2006.

200 Individual Medley: School record
Chase Gravengood

In a sport timed by the hundredths of a second, Gravengood actually tied his own school record in the 200 IM, but came up 24-hundredths short of a league crown. His time of 1:50.06 was touched out by Cleveland State's Jakob Dobies time of 1:49.82. He won a league title in the event when he also swam it in 1:50.06 at the Horizon League Championships in 2007.

400 Individual Medley: School record
Chase Gravengood

Gravengood established new school, meet and pool record in the 400 IM at the Wheaton Invitational in December, topping the field in a time of 3:59.32. That broke the school record of 4:03.29, which Gravengood set back in 2005.

1000 Freestyle: School record
Robby Leibold

Leibold set a school record in the 1,000 freestyle at the league championships. His time of 9:29.29 clocked in just ahead of the school record time of 9:29.53 that Leibold set in December of last season and was good for third place in the event. It broke the former mark of 9:30.77 that was set by Michael Belting in 2004.

1650 Freestyle: School record
Robby Leibold

Leibold broke the oldest record in the UWM record book and did it handily. He set a new school mark in the 1650 freestyle, finishing in a time of 15:41.89 at the Wheaton Invitational in December. That broke the school mark set by Brent Boock in 1991 by over 10 seconds, as Boock's former standard was 15:51.68. His time was also a meet and pool record.

200 Backstroke: School record
Tyler Jefferson

UWM placed five swimmers in the top 11 of the 200 backstroke at the league championships, led by a record-breaking effort from Tyler Jefferson who placed third with a time of 1:50.47. Not only did that time top his former career-best of 1:52.74 in the event, but also broke the former program standard of 1:50.66 set by Jason Procto in 2002.

800 Freestyle Relay Team: School record

Bill McCarty, Chase Gravengood, David Yugo, Tyler Jefferson
The relay team of McCarty, Gravengood, Yugo and Jefferson battled Wright State throughout the race at the league championships, taking second in a time of 6:45.25 in the final event of the day. That easily eclipsed the former school mark of 6:47.27, set by Josh Baseheart, Peter Clark, Michael Belting and Jason Procto in 2003.

500 Freestyle: Freshman record
Bill McCarty

Not only did McCarty place fourth in the finals of the 500 freestyle at the league championships, but he also set a freshman record in the race in the morning preliminaries in a time of 4:35.12, breaking the standard of 4:35.32 that Robby Leibold established as a freshman.

100 Butterfly: Klotsche Natatorium record
Chase Gravengood

Gravengood was the big winner against Valparaiso, as the senior captain claimed three victories and put his name into the record book once again. He won the 100 butterfly in a season-best time of 50.78, eclipsing the former pool record of 50.87 set by Green Bay's Joey Weber in 2006.

200 Backstroke: Klotsche Natatorium
Jeremy Waldhart

Waldhart won his specialty against Green Bay in February, extending his win streak to eight-straight races with a 1:52.96 clocking in the 200 backstroke. It was a new Klotsche Natatorium record, eclipsing the old standard of 1:53.06 set by UWGB's Joey Weber on January 20, 2007.

FIVE-STRAIGHT BECOMING ROUTINE

After starting the season 1-4, the Panthers went on an extended win streak to finish the season 6-4 in duals. Not only is the five-straight wins impressive, but noteworthy, as it has now happened two years in a row. The last time UWM accomplished the feat previously was the 1999-2000 season when they defeated Wheaton, UIC, Butler, Northern Iowa and Northern Illinois in November of that season.

SWIMMERS/DIVERS OF THE WEEK

The men's swimming & diving team won two Horizon League Swimmer of the Week and three Diver of the Week awards in 2007-08. Chase Gravengood was selected the week of Dec. 11 after a terrific weekend in the pool in which he won all five of his individual events and both relays he swam with to lead Milwaukee to two dual wins. Against SDSU, he won the 200 IM in 1:53.98 and the 200 breaststroke in a season-best 2:08.96. He also helped the 400 medley relay team to a victory. The next day was even better, winning all three of his individual events while also swimming with the first-place 200 medley relay team against Valpo. He won the 100 butterfly in a season-best 50.78, setting a new Klotsche Natatorium record in the process. He swept the fly events with a win in the 200 in 1:53.72 and also claimed first place in the 400 IM in 4:07.17.

Jake Kalinowski was tabbed Feb. 5 after playing an important role as Milwaukee snapped its seven-dual losing streak to Green Bay. He won both of his individual events and anchored the winning 400 medley relay (3:29.16). In the 50 freestyle, he posted a winning time of 21.73 and followed that up with a mark of 47.49 in the 100 freestyle.

Diver PJ Rongitsch was selected for Horizon League Diver of the Week Oct. 17, Nov. 13 and Dec. 4.

FIRST-YEAR CARRYOVER

In his first season, former head coach Dave Griffore led the UWM men to a 5-4 dual record, giving the squad a winning dual record for the first time since going 6-3-1 in the 1999-2000. For an encore, the squad went 6-4 in 2007-08, marking the first back-to-back winning campaigns since the 6-3-1 mark in '99-'00 followed a 7-4 ledger in 1998-99.

Coming off a second-place showing the previous season, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee women's swimming & diving team was looking to make a move up the standings and earn its first league crown since 2001 at the Horizon League Championships, held Feb. 20-23 in Ohio.

In the end, UWM placed third after running into a red-hot Green Bay team that won its fourth-straight league title. The meet also featured a change of venues midway through, as a broken water main forced the meet from Cleveland, Ohio, to Akron, Ohio.

Several highlights led the way for the Panthers, including a pair of titles from **Danielle Wenger**. Despite competing in her first-ever league meet, Wenger became just the second-ever Milwaukee freshman to capture two league titles, winning the 1000 and 1650 freestyles. Included in that effort was a victory over three-time league title holder Catalina Martinez of Wright State in the 1000.

Molly Finn had a great week, topping it with her third-consecutive league title in the 200 butterfly in a new school and league-record time. She also placed third in both the 200 and 400 IM, setting a school record in the 200. **Ashley Hall** earned all-league second team honors on the one-meter diving board and also placed third on the three-meter. As a team, UWM dominated the diving events, placing six in the top 10 on the one-meter board and six in the top nine on the three-meter.

In the breaststroke events, **Kerry Rossow** and **Shannon Berndt** nearly flip-flopped their results from the previous season when Berndt earned a pair of league titles. This time, it was Rossow who won the first league championship of her career, topping the field in the 200 breaststroke while also taking second in the 100 breast. Berndt, meanwhile, took second in the 100 and third in the 200.



Two relay teams earned second-team all-league honors, with the 200 and 400 medley relay squads each taking second - including with a school-record time in the 200. Wenger, Rossow, **Amanda Nelson** and **Jess Kelly** combined for the new school mark, while Wenger, Rossow, Kelly and Finn comprised the 400 squad.

On the men's side, UWM followed up a solid third-place effort in 2007 with another in 2008. But, this time, the team was much closer to second place than

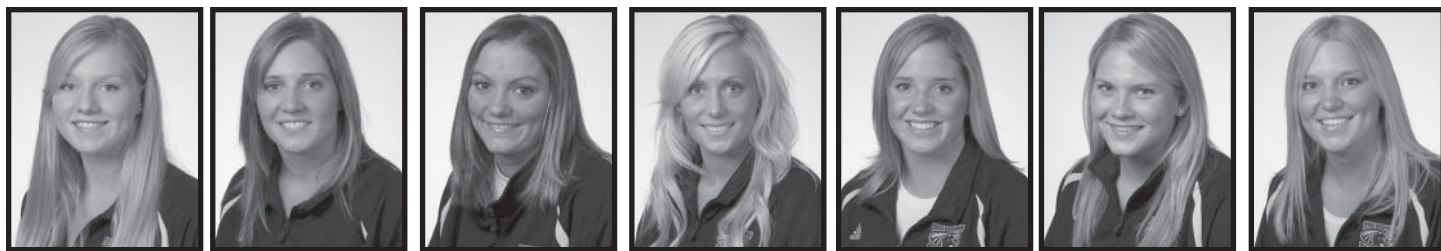
the previous season.

Chase Gravengood turned in a solid performance, breaking school records in the 200 IM (taking second) and in the 200 butterfly (taking third). He also placed third in the 400 IM. Gravengood teamed with **Bill McCarty**, **David Yugo** and **Tyler Jefferson** to earn second team all-league honors in the 800 freestyle relay, breaking the school standard in the process.

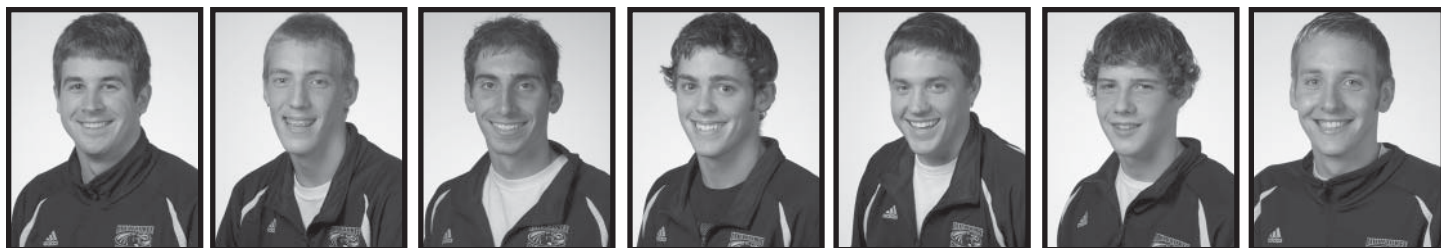
PJ Rongitsch fared very well on the diving boards for Milwaukee, earning second-team all-conference honors on both boards. Jefferson returned from injury just in time to have a solid meet, breaking the school record in the 200 backstroke (taking third) while also taking fifth in the 100 back and swimming on all of the relay teams.

Robby Leibold was one of the top finishers in the distance events for UWM, placing third in the 1000 freestyle (in a school-record time), third in the 1650 free and sixth in the 500 free. In the 500, McCarty set a new freshmen record in the prelims.

Other top finishers for the Panthers included **Dan Heraly** (fourth in the 1000 and 1650 free/fifth in the 500), **Jeremy Waldhart** (fourth in the 200 back/eighth in the 200 IM/sixth in the 400 IM) and **Jeremy Seibel** (fourth in the 200 breast/seventh in the 400 IM).

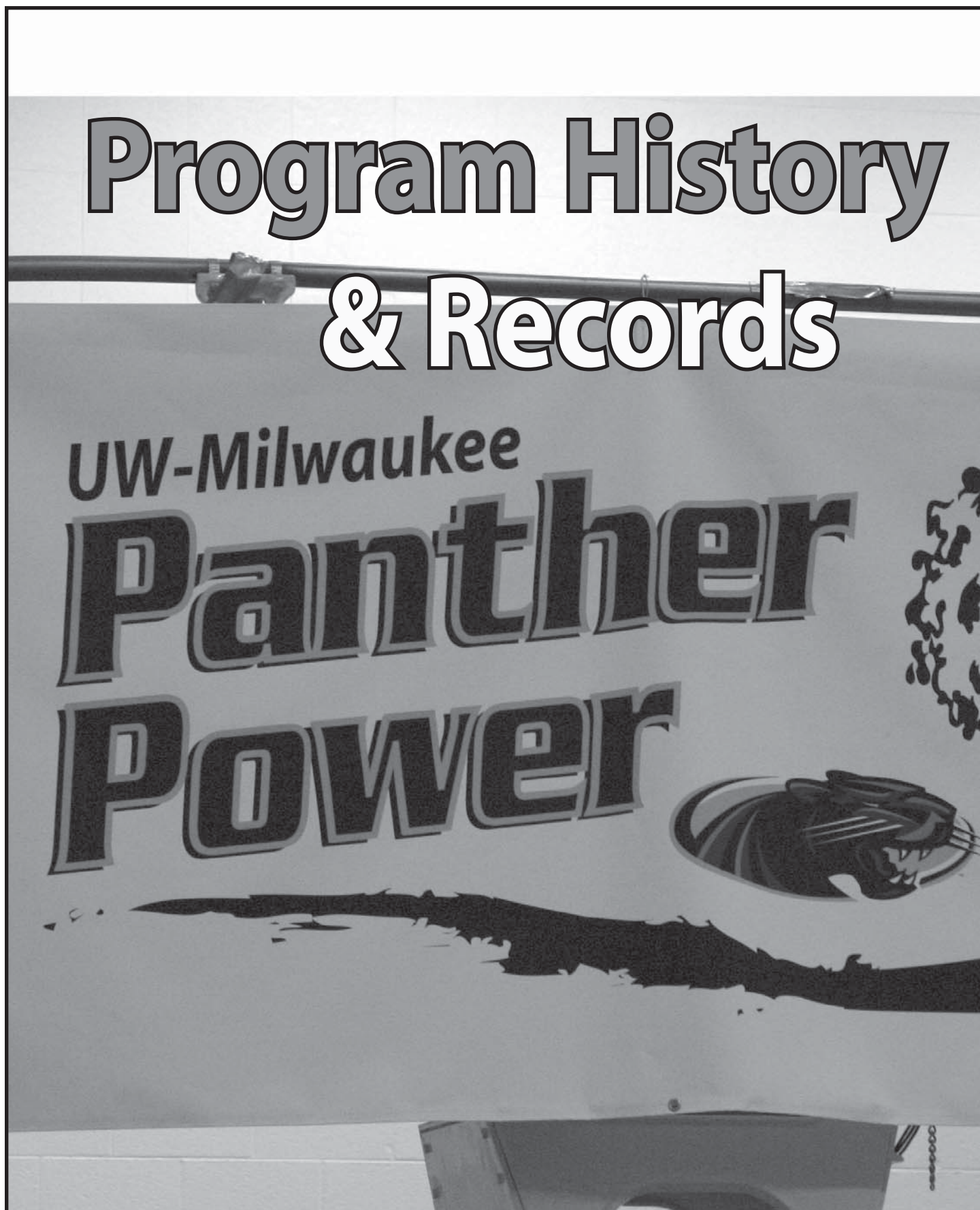

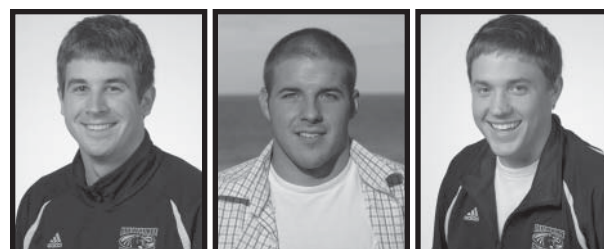

Two former UWM swimmers pursued their dreams of reaching the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing this past summer. Josh Baseheart and Chase Gravengood each qualified for the USA Olympic Trials that took place in Omaha, Neb., in early July. Both have taken the time to share their experiences...

Josh Baseheart: Upon arriving in Omaha, it was clear to me the city was going to make a big deal out of hosting Olympic Trials. One of the first buildings I saw as we exited the freeway was covered by a 40-foot tall banner of Matt Grevers, 2008 Olympian-to-be and Northwestern University alum. The hotel across the street from that had all of the windows of the lobby decorated to look like you were underwater in a pool. TYR had rented out a bar & grill right next-door to the pool, and had renamed all of their menu items after past Olympic Games. Before I even got to the pool, I knew this would be an event to remember.

After months of anticipation, I knew what to expect when I got to the pool, but I was still overwhelmed with how awesome a facility it was. The first part I saw was the warm-up pool, which consisted of an eight-lane 50-meter competition pool and a six-lane 25-meter pool. Not only were there pools – there were hot tubs, free massages, a full size scoreboard and video board, and TVs everywhere, so you could always watch what was happening in the competition pool. The competition pool was nothing short of spectacular – with a jumbotron, multiple scoreboards and even more TVs where the view was obstructed - this was to be no regular swim meet. Walking through the hallways felt more like walking through the hallways at an NBA game than at a swim meet.

Of course, at some point, I did have to get past all of that and focus on racing. I came into the meet very focused and ready to race, but found that the way the whole meet was set up was completely different than any other meet I'd ever been. Everything was very controlled, so you could only be in certain places at certain times before your race, and despite all the TVs offering constant coverage of the pool, my whole pre-race routine was thrown off - my whole race strategy vanished as I got up on the blocks for my first race, the 100 free. Needless to say, that race didn't go quite as I had planned, but my time was not too bad - just not as good as I had hoped. I recovered from that race and was much more prepared and relaxed for the next one, the 50 free, which was two days later.

For some reason, I just was not at the top of my game at that meet, but didn't let it bother me for too long. I quickly forgot the disappointment of not achieving my goals for the meet, because for so long, my goal had been just to make it there. And I was there. And so were about 30 of my closest friends and family, who came to cheer me and my teammates on.

My last race happened to be on the Fourth of July, and that night at the pool, t-shirts had been left on every single seat in the Qwest Center. Once everybody put on their t-shirts, you could see whole sections of red, white, and blue. The whole place was live on TV for a few minutes while the wave made its way around the 13,000+ person audience. It was an amazing experience, an honor to be a part of, and something that I will remember for the rest of my life.

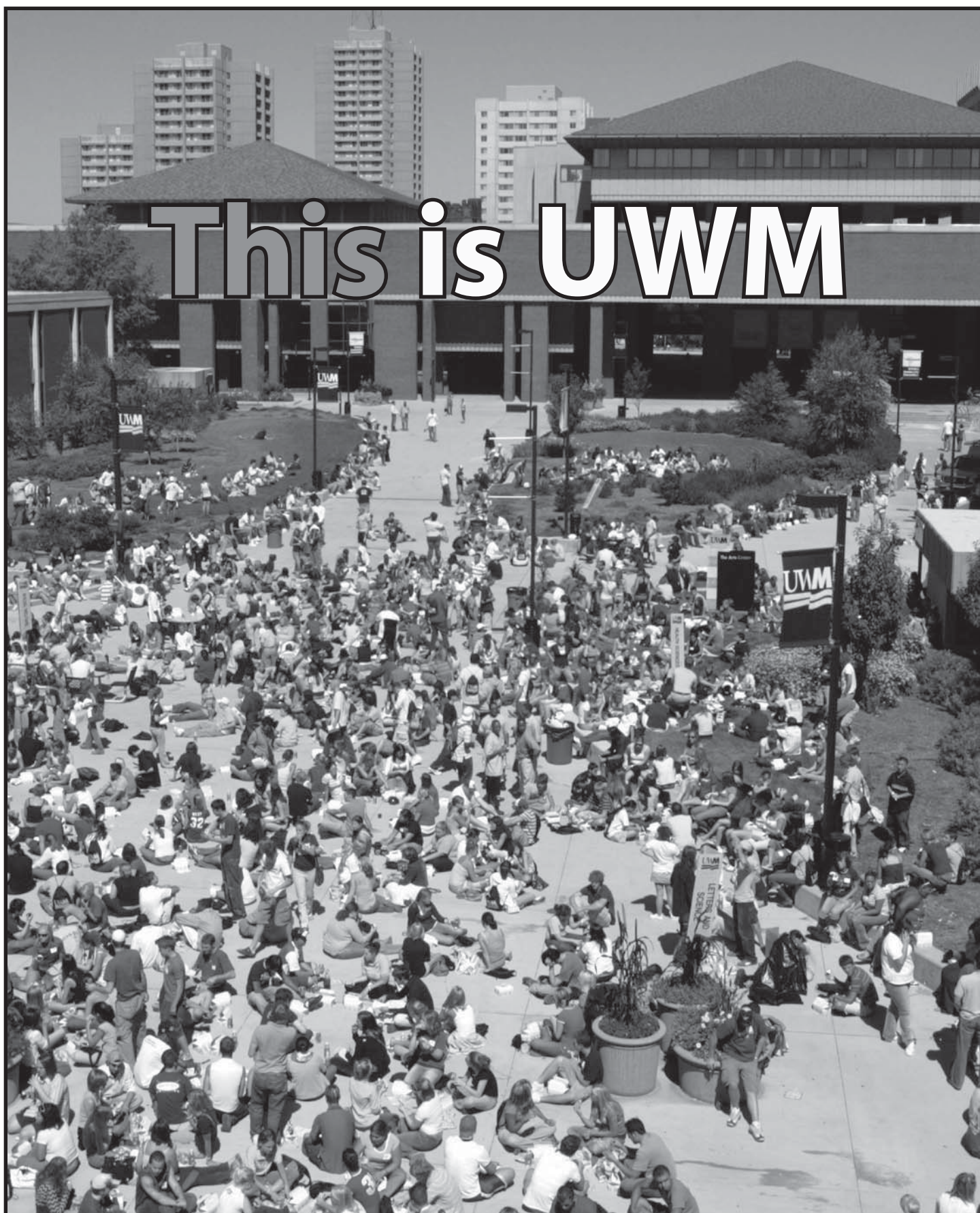
Chase Gravengood: Getting to compete at the 2008 United States Olympic Team Trials was the highlight of my career. An almost-packed house of more than 10,000 people for each session was a sight to see and a great atmosphere to compete in. Being able to watch world records fall and athletes celebrate making the Olympic team was something special. It was great to compete against all those people you read about. Everything about the meet was awesome. From the way the athletes were treated, to the state of the art pool, to the electrifying crowd, there was never a dull moment. It was an honor to compete at this meet and it was a good reminder of why I got up for all those 5:30 a.m. practices. All the sacrifices and hard work seemed so worth it, to compete against

the best of the best. Every competitor there was there for one reason - to swim fast. I learned a lot from watching all the celebrations of first time Olympians and the heart-breaks of third-place finishers.

I went there to finish my swimming career at the highest point I could possibly reach. It had been my goal since I was about 14 years old to make it to the Olympic trials and I am grateful for that opportunity. Sharing the experience with my family, friends and teammates made it even better. Although I did not swim my fastest, I gave it the best shot I could on that given day and I could not ask for more. It was an amazing experience, a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity and something I will remember for the rest of my life. I owe a lot to of my success to my parents, Dave Griffore, Dave Anderson, Dave Joyce and many others for their great coaching and guidance the past four years.

Heralded as "The City of Festivals," Milwaukee hosts more than 15 annual festivals, including the world's largest music festival, Summerfest, and over a dozen ethnic festivals all held along Milwaukee's spectacular lakefront.

The RiverWalk, which meanders through the heart of downtown, recently received a \$13 million facelift, and development continues to the north and south. Fine food, cultural venues, eclectic shops, exciting nightlife and a wide array of distinctive sports bars are located along the RiverWalk. Also prevalent along the RiverWalk are many brewpubs and microbreweries. Gondolas and water taxis frequently travel Milwaukee's scenic RiverWalk area.

The Historic Third Ward is quickly becoming the "off-Broadway" of Milwaukee's arts scene. It is home to the new Broadway Theatre Center as well as another, smaller, experimental theatre. In addition, this restored warehouse district features a number of art galleries, the well-regarded Milwaukee Institute of Art and Design, coffee houses, cafes, and antique stores. An abundance of new housing in the form of loft-style apartments and condominiums are also becoming a part of the landscape in the Historic Third Ward.

Milwaukee's museum scene is also active. The Milwaukee Art Museum has wrapped up a \$100 million expansion featuring a dramatic wing-like sculpture rising high above Milwaukee's lakefront. The Milwaukee Public Museum is in the midst of a \$6.5 million project establishing a permanent interpretation of "Butterflies Alive!," the museum's most successful exhibit ever. The Milwaukee County Zoo is well-known as one of the finest in the nation.

Milwaukee also loves its sports. The city put its stamp on Major League Baseball with the arrival of Miller Park in the spring of 2001. The \$400 million, one-of-a-kind ballpark features a convertible roof and natural grass. Offering the finest in ballpark amenities, Miller Park is a park within a park - that is, it includes places to tailgate along the Menomonee River, a sports-themed restaurant, and an elegantly finished restaurant, the Metavante Club. Miller Park also played host the Major League All-Star Game in 2002.

Two of the city's other professional sports teams, including the NBA's Milwaukee Bucks, play at the downtown Bradley Center. In addition, the U.S. Cellular Arena downtown is now the home of the UWM men's basketball team, as well as the Milwaukee Wave of the Major Indoor Soccer League. The arena has undergone major renovations and also hosts a number of concerts and other special events.

The Milwaukee Mile, an auto racing track located at State Fair Park, is home to a NASCAR Busch Series and an Indy Racing League event, added just this year. Plus, the sports landscape also includes an annual PGA event and one of the best county park systems in the nation.

Milwaukee is also a tourist and business destination for travelers around the state and nation. The Midwest Express Center downtown serves as the city's main convention center, and draws groups from around the world to host their annual activities in Milwaukee.

Milwaukee is also easy to get to, located at the intersections of interstates 94 and 43. Milwaukee's General Mitchell International Airport has nearly 20 airlines and over 500 daily departures and arrivals, and Amtrak runs daily non-stop trains to Chicago.

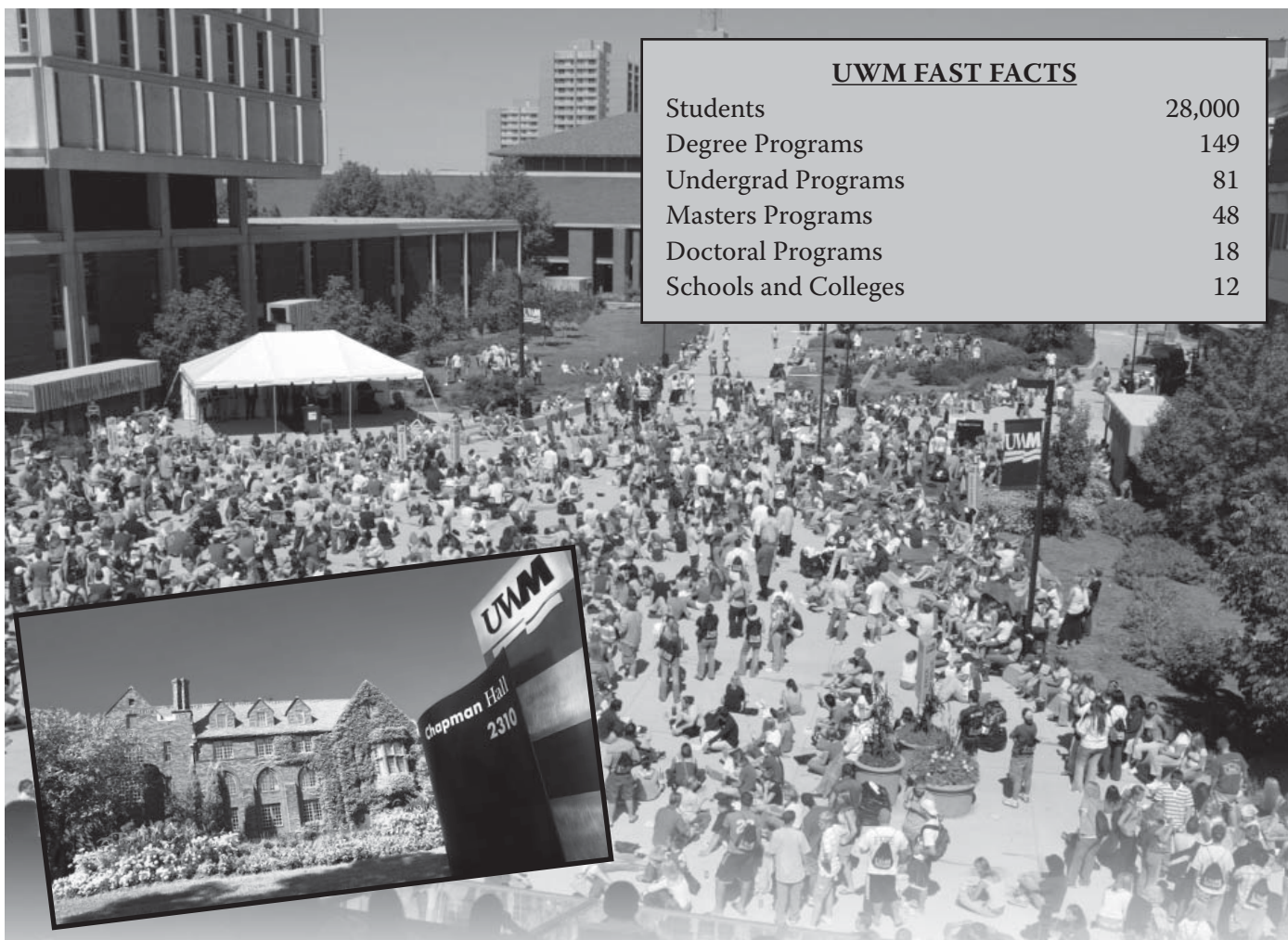

U.S. World Cup standout and Major League Soccer star Tony Sanneh also attended UWM, as did Illinois men's basketball coach Bruce Weber.



Carlos E. Santiago is beginning his fifth academic year as the Chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

Santiago is UWM's seventh Chancellor. In this position, he is the chief administrative officer of the university and a partner with a great number of constituents on and off campus.

Chancellor Santiago also holds the academic rank of Professor of Economics at UWM. As a labor economist, he has regional expertise in the Caribbean and Central America, with special emphasis on Puerto Rico.

Cooperation and collaboration to strengthen UW-Milwaukee's research portfolio, academic excellence and diversity have been the highest priorities of Chancellor Santiago since his arrival on July 1, 2004. Among the primary results that UWM has achieved during his tenure:

- Securing a historic reinvestment by the State of Wisconsin in the university's and Southeastern Wisconsin's future, especially in the targeted areas of advanced automation, biomedical engineering, health care and freshwater science.
- Completing the record-setting Campaign for UWM, the most ambitious fund-raising effort in university history.

Rita Cheng is the Provost and Vice Chancellor at UWM, a position she has held since April 2005. Cheng came to UWM in 1988 and has subsequently served the university in several high-level administrative capacities. She was the Interim Dean of the School of Continuing Education in 2004 and 2005, Associate Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs from 2002 to 2005 and Associate Dean of the School of Business Administration from 1998 to 2003. She holds a bachelor's degree from Bishop's University in Quebec, an MBA from the University of Rhode Island and a Ph.D. from Temple University. Cheng has also been actively involved with the athletic department throughout her career, serving as faculty athletics representative from 1996-2004.



for the university's benefit.

Santiago also has a strong background in working with athletics.

With the University at Albany, State University of New York, where he held the position of Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs, Santiago was a member of its National Collegiate Athletic Association Certification Steering Committee, worked closely with the athletics department on academics and admissions-related issues, and was involved with the New York Giants annual National Football League summer training camp held at the University at Albany.

"Universities must focus on creating the scholar-athlete," Chancellor Santiago said. "Winning is nice, but first and foremost you must focus on the academics. UWM's consistent performance -- in both winning championships and placing leading numbers of students on the Horizon League's Academic Honor Roll -- demonstrates our commitment to both of these objectives."

Dr. Santiago is the author or co-author of five books focusing on labor and economic development issues, with the latest being "Puerto Ricans in the United States: A Contemporary Portrait," co-authored with Edna Acosta-Belén. He has co-edited another book and has published more than 30 articles and book reviews in a wide variety of scholarly journals.

Along with Dr. Acosta-Belén, Dr. Santiago also is a founding co-editor of the Latino Research Review and was a member of the U.S. Congressional Hispanic Caucus International Relations Advisory Group.

Dr. Santiago's wife, Azara Santiago-Rivera, is also part of the faculty at UWM. She is an associate professor of educational psychology in the School of Education.

Chancellor Santiago has a Ph.D. in economics from Cornell University ('82) and M.A. degrees in economics from Cornell University ('79) and the University of Puerto Rico ('75).

Like most other boys growing up in Puerto Rico, Dr. Santiago played baseball year-round and aspired to follow national heroes Roberto Clemente and Orlando Cepeda to Major League Baseball. Dr. Santiago played third base throughout high school and earned a place on his division's all-star team. In recent years, his sporting interests have included golf, tennis, downhill skiing, walking and jogging. He also helped coach softball teams for his daughters.

Helen L. Mamarchev was named Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs in January of 2007. She came to UWM from Illinois State University, where she served most recently as the Special Projects Assistant to the President. Prior to her current position at Illinois State University, she served as its Vice President for Student Affairs from 2000 to 2006. At the University of Florida, she was the Associate Vice President for Student Affairs from 1985 to 2000 and the Assistant Vice President for Student Affairs from 1983 to 1985. Dr. Mamarchev has a PhD in Counseling; Organizational Behavior and Industrial Relations from the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor. She also has degrees from Indiana University and Southern Methodist University.





After more than 20 years of stellar service as the Director of Athletics at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, **Bud Haidet** will retire at the end of this school year.

The department has experienced unprecedented success on and off the playing surface under Haidet. In 2007-08, UWM won the Horizon League's Women's All-Sports Trophy for a seventh time while seeing teams in women's soccer, women's volleyball and men's indoor and outdoor track and field win league crowns.

This continued a long line of success for Milwaukee athletics under Haidet. In 2006-07, the Panthers' women's soccer team advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for a second-straight year, while in 2005-06, UWM won the McCafferty Trophy, the Horizon League's All-Sports Trophy, for the fourth time. UWM won 10 league titles and claimed a third-straight regular season league title in men's basketball. UWM has also won the women's and men's all-sports awards.

The biggest highlight of the 2005-06 campaign came after the Horizon League basketball season was completed. The Panther men again made their mark in the NCAA Tournament, beating Big 12 power Oklahoma before falling to eventual national champion Florida. At the same time, the Panther women were battling with Michigan State in the NCAA Tournament, only to fall in the contest. Those basketball accomplishments came on the heels of a 2005 postseason run that saw the Panther men advance to the Sweet 16 and garner national recognition.

Basketball is far from the only sport where UWM has experienced tremendous success. In fact, both the men's and women's soccer teams advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2005. The men knocked off Bradley before falling in overtime to national runner-up New Mexico, while the women beat Purdue before falling to Marquette on a last-second goal.

The success at UWM actually started long ago. UWM finished second in the McCafferty Trophy standings during the 1997-98 school year and during the 1999-2000 school year. In fact, following the 1999-2000 season, UWM finished just one point out of first place and won the MCC men's all-sports championship. The Panthers then won the league's all-sports trophy for the first time after the 2000-01 season, and then won it again after the 2003-04 campaign.

Many of UWM's teams have also gained national recognition under Haidet. The great success of the men's basketball team also includes an NCAA berth in 2003 and a National Invitation Tournament appearance in 2004. The men's soccer team has qualified for five of the last six NCAA Tournaments and has been ranked

as high as eighth in the nation. The women's volleyball team has qualified for six of the last nine NCAA Tournaments. The women's basketball team also made the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and 2006, the women's soccer team has been in the tournament four out of the last six years and the baseball team has also been a regular in the NCAA Tournament.

In the classroom, 78 UWM student-athletes were named to the Horizon Academic Honor Roll in June, giving UWM the highest number per sport offered in the league. Numerous Panthers have also won league and national academic awards, including three student-athletes earning Academic All-America honors this past school year. And, the current cumulative grade point average of all student-athletes is above 3.0.

Haidet has also directed an upgrade in facilities for all of UWM athletics. The recently-completed Klotsche Center renovation - the Pavilion - has vastly improved the office and training space for the athletic department and its student-athletes. Haidet has also led the extremely successful move by the men's basketball team to the U.S. Cellular Arena in downtown Milwaukee and shown the way for improvements at Henry Aaron Field and Engelmenn Field, which had lights installed for play in 2006.

Over Haidet's tenure, athletics at UWM has moved from NAIA Division II to NCAA Division I status, and from independent status to membership in two athletic conferences. Haidet notes that the strong commitment to athletics by the institution and student association has greatly contributed to the rapid and successful growth of the program. He also feels past student-athletes, coaches and administrators helped set in motion the success UWM enjoys.

Haidet is active in numerous NCAA activities. He has completed Level I-III NCAA Athletics Management courses and was a member of two NCAA Division I Peer Review Certification teams and two NCAA committees. He was also recently the chair of the Horizon League's Executive Council and is active in all of the league's activities. Prior to coming to UWM, Haidet was an athletics administrator at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, where he earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees. He was inducted into the Miami Athletics Hall of Fame in 2005. A former captain in the Marine Corps, Haidet enjoys weight training, hiking and fishing, and spending time with his wife, Beth, stepson, Drew, four children and 13 grandchildren.



Kathy Litzau Associate AD



After spending 14 seasons as the head volleyball coach at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, **Kathy Litzau** is now an associate athletic director and senior women administrator at the school.

In her new role, Litzau is overseeing a variety of sports as well as the areas of student-athlete support services and student welfare. She is also acting as the liaison between the athletic department and the campus and community while coordinating community relations projects for the department.

The numbers in the 14-year coaching tenure of Litzau in Milwaukee are astounding. She led the Panthers to nine 20-win seasons, eight Horizon League regular season titles and six NCAA Tournaments. Litzau was also named league coach of the year seven times and regional coach of the year twice. In all, she tallied 271 wins in her 14 seasons after taking over a program that won just three matches the season prior to her arrival.

Litzau is a graduate of Notre Dame, where she played volleyball for four years and was the team captain and most valuable player her senior season. She also has a master's degree from Illinois, where she spent time as an assistant volleyball coach. The Naperville, Ill., native also worked at Wisconsin and Michigan State before taking over at UWM in 1993.

Litzau and her husband, Steve, have three daughters - Lauren, Danielle and Kayce - and a son - Nicholas.

UWM ATHLETIC BOARD

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Athletic Board plays a role in connecting the athletic department to the rest of the campus community. Made up of a variety of staff and faculty members, students and alumni, the board meets monthly and gets involved in a number of the activities of the athletic department.

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's Athletics Department is committed to enhancing the opportunities of academic, athletic and personal success of every student-athlete. A partnership has been created between the academic and athletic communities on campus to give all student-athletes an opportunity to achieve academic success.

UWM has had a full-time athletic academic advisor since 1998, reinforcing its commitment to its student-athletes' academic success. All new student-athletes meet with their advisor on an individual basis to assess specific needs. Programs for academic advancement are developed, including monitoring courses, grades and academic progress. The Academic Assistance Center, located in the new Pavilion, provides student-athletes with a quiet place to study and one-on-one tutoring opportunities. The academic center also houses a full computer lab and numerous tutoring rooms.

Tom Vollman is UWM's full-time athletic academic advisor, working closely with all student-athletes. Vollman has developed a comprehensive program for academic enhancement while also providing tutoring and support service assistance, coordinating coursework and monitoring grade reports, academic progress and degree completion requirements.



PRIORITY REGISTRATION - ACADEMIC MONITORING
 Student-athletes receive priority when registering for classes. Academic advisors provide ongoing assistance with class scheduling and career planning. Progress reports from the professors of each student-athlete are sought periodically throughout the year, and academic progress is monitored regularly.

TUTORS

Individuals and group tutors are available in all subjects to student-athletes upon request. The new Pavilion has private tutoring and study rooms for student-athletes.

STRUCTURED STUDY

All freshmen are required to attend study table for eight hours per week. Students meet Monday through Thursday for two hours per night and are monitored by a member of the coaching staff. Upperclassmen with a cumulative grade point average of less than 3.0 are also required to attend, however their hours are pro-rated based on their GPA.

POST-GRADUATE OPPORTUNITIES

UWM boasts a 95 percent job placement rate through the on-campus Career Development Center. Approximately 200 employers interview on-campus each year. Workshops are offered to assist student-athletes in planning their career paths. Numerous internships and job opportunities are available in the metro Milwaukee area, the business and economic center of Wisconsin.

UWM is a member of the NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills Program. The mission of the NCAA and UWM is to maintain intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the campus educational program and the student-athlete as an integral part of the student body. With this in mind, the UWM program, "SUCCESS," was created to support student-athlete development and to enhance the quality of the student-athlete experience within the university setting.

The life skills program includes five major commitments:

- **Commitment to Academic Excellence** – support academic progress toward intellectual development and graduation
- **Commitment to Athletic Excellence** – build philosophical foundations for the development of athletic programs that are broad-based, equitable and dedicated to the well-being of the student-athlete.
- **Commitment to Personal Development** – support the development of a well-balanced lifestyle, encouraging emotional well-being, personal growth and decision-making skills
- **Commitment to Career Development** – encourage the student-athlete to develop and pursue career and life goals
- **Commitment to Service** – engage the student-athlete in service to his/her campus and surrounding communities

STUDENT-ATHLETE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The UWM Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) is composed of current Panther student-athletes. It is assembled to provide insight into the student-athlete experience by promoting, fostering, designing and implementing programs that encourage academic achievement, professional development, health-conscious life choices and social responsibility.

The UWM SAAC is committed to the following initiatives:

- Providing student-athletes with the opportunity to effectively communicate with the department administration and offer suggestions to enhance the quality of the student-athlete experience
- Promoting effective communication among coaches, the department administration and student-athletes
- Promoting an awareness of UWM Athletics throughout the campus and the Greater Milwaukee area
- Reviewing NCAA legislative proposals and make recommendations to the department administration

SAAC members serve as liaisons between student-athletes, the athletic administration and the campus community. Athletes are encouraged to communicate concerns and ideas to their captains and/or for discussion at scheduled committee meetings.

The UWM SAAC operates in conjunction with the Horizon League SAAC and the NCAA SAAC. Steve Bode of men's soccer and Sarah Moore of women's volleyball represented UWM on the Horizon League SAAC last year. Moore also sat on the NCAA SAAC.

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee has moved itself into a prominent position both regionally and nationally in the world of intercollegiate athletics.

In fact, UWM has consistently shown it is the top athletic program in the Horizon League. The school has won the league's McCafferty Trophy four times in the last eight years, including a stretch of three-straight victories from 2003-04 to 2005-06. UWM has also won the women's all-sports awards seven times and the men's all-sports award three times.

The 2007-08 school year was another banner one for Panther sports. In the fall, UWM's volleyball and women's soccer teams each claimed Horizon League titles. Then, later in the year, the men's track and field team captured both the indoor and outdoor league titles, bringing to 30 the number of team track titles UWM has won since 1998. Plus, the women's track and field team finished second in both the indoor and outdoor seasons while the baseball team advanced all the way to the title game of the league tournament.

The 2006-07 school year was another banner one for Panther sports, as UWM teams won seven league titles while a number of individuals also claimed league crowns. The success started in the fall as both the women's soccer and women's volleyball teams won the league regular season crown, with the volleyball squad also capturing the league tourney title. Both teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament, where the women's soccer team moved to the second round for the second-straight season.

UWM also continued its dominance in track and field, winning indoor and outdoor team titles on both the men's and women's sides. Those championships brought to 28 the number of team track league titles UWM has won since 1998.

But the 2006-07 season was far from the first successful one for Panther athletics. In 2005-06, UWM saw both of its soccer teams win league titles and advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, while the



men's and women's basketball teams also played in the NCAA Tourney. The men again caught the eyes of the nation with a win over Oklahoma in the first round before being eliminated by eventual national champion Florida in the second round.

The men's basketball team also helped put UWM athletics on the national map in 2004-05. UWM pulled off upset wins over Alabama and Boston College to advance to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The Panthers were eventually eliminated from the tournament by national runner-up Illinois, but UWM had already captured the hearts and minds of the nation's college basketball fans.

You have to go even further back to find the true start of the great run of success at UWM. In the 2002-03 season, UWM won five league titles and sent four teams to NCAA Tournament play. The Panther men's soccer team was ranked as high as eighth in the nation and the men's basketball team made its first NCAA Tournament appearance. UWM's first McCafferty Trophy came after the Panthers won nine league titles in the 2000-01 school year.

UWM student-athletes have also become known for their work in

the classroom. This past spring, 70 student-athletes were named to the Horizon League Academic Honor Roll. UWM student-athletes also regularly appear on the league's academic all-league teams and the cumulative grade-point average for the athletic department consistently is above 3.0, with a 3.172 cumulative GPA the mark as of this past June.

Quality facilities are also a part of the athletic scene at UWM. The new Pavilion, an addition to the Klotsche



Center, opened in January of 2006 and now houses all of the athletics offices, as well as new locker rooms, team rooms, training rooms, weight rooms and an academic center. The facility, which also includes a tremendous amount of space for the general student population, rates as one of the best athletic office and workout facilities in the Horizon League.

The project also included a renovation of the 5,000-seat Klotsche Center, which is home to the women's volleyball, women's basketball and track and field teams. The facility now has air conditioning and a new sound system, as well as two new concession stands. Plus, with it standing adjacent to the new Pavilion, fans attending events can park in the Pavilion's new parking garage and attend events without ever stepping outside. The swimming and diving teams have their own pool in the Klotsche Center, located on the lower level.

UWM's men's basketball team has played at the U.S. Cellular Arena in downtown Milwaukee since the 2003 Horizon League Tournament. The move downtown has been a successful one, with attendance records set each season the Panthers have played in the historic building.

Meanwhile, UWM's other recent facility improvements have come at the soccer and baseball fields. On-campus Engelmann Field, home of the Panther soccer teams, is renowned to be one of the best collegiate soccer facilities in the country. Lights were added to the field in 2006 and a new team room has also been developed. The Panther baseball team plays at Henry Aaron Field, while occasionally getting the chance to play at Miller Park. A new scoreboard was added in 2008, while extensive work on the field, fencing and dugouts have been completed over the last few years, with plans for additional renovations on the table.

Athletics has a long history at UWM. Some sports records date back to the late 1800's and UWM fielded a football team until 1974. UWM has played on all levels of NCAA competition, including stints as a Division II and Division III institution along with its current run in Division I. UWM athletics also spent some years in NAIA competition.

The school's athletic teams have also competed in the Wisconsin state school league for a number of years, while competing in the Mid-Continent Conference and Midwestern Collegiate Conference/Horizon League since moving all of its varsity sports to Division I in the fall of 1990.

UWM has 15 varsity athletic teams and offers its prospective student-athletes aid in the form of athletic scholarships. Full and partial scholarships are available in all 15 varsity sports. Full scholarships include the cost of room and board, in addition to tuition and books. Scholarships are based on athletic ability and academic success.

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's newest on-campus building is the Pavilion, which is the home to UWM Athletics.

The Pavilion officially opened its doors to the public in January of 2006 and the building was officially dedicated by Wisconsin Governor Jim Doyle and UWM Chancellor Carlos Santiago on May 2.

Among the new athletics facilities in the building specifically are offices for coaches and staff, a student-athlete-only weight room, new locker rooms for all teams and team rooms and lounges for men's basketball, women's basketball and women's volleyball.



UWM student-athletes are also benefitting from the brand-new sports medicine center in the Pavilion, which more than triples the previous space available for UWM's athletic trainers. The facility also includes a 2,800-square-foot academic assistance center to help student-athletes in the classroom. The new academic center includes a computer lab along with group and individual study and tutoring rooms. A 618-space indoor parking garage is also part of the facility.

UWM's general student population is also benefitting tremendously from the new facility. A new fitness center has expansive rooms for cardio workouts, as well as a weight room. The state-of-the-art area is the most visible from the outside of the facility, as it features two levels of windows.



The recreation center has two expansive levels and houses four sport courts surrounded by a suspended 1/8 mile track. The facility is utilized by individuals seeking open gym space, run and walk space on the track, and the University's intramural programs.

The building also includes academic facilities for the College of Health Sciences along with accommodations for the new Physical Therapy and expanded Sports Medicine programs.

The \$40 million project, which broke ground in June of 2003, came in below budget due to a favorable bidding climate. Half of the funding is coming from UWM parking fees, while the other half is from state funds and student segregated fees. The athletic department has also undertaken a variety of fundraising efforts for even larger enhancements within its space in the facility.

The most distinctive feature of the 135,000-gross-square-foot Pavilion is the extensive use of glass "walls," creating a feeling of openness and allowing expansive views of nearby Downer Woods and the campus.

Architects for the project were Venture Architects of Milwaukee, a joint venture of Kahler Slater Architects and the Zimmerman Design Group. They emphasize that placement and tinting of windows, called "cool daylighting," not only allows a wash of daylight inside while reducing energy needs.

UWM Men Broke 10 Records in 2007-08 / Horizon League Champions - 2000

Celebrating its 30th anniversary in 2008-09, the Horizon League continues to aspire toward its goal of being one of the nation's leading athletics conferences while being recognized as a leader in the development of student-athletes as leaders and role models.



The Horizon League membership features ten public and private institutions that have impressive academic reputations and a storied tradition of broad-based athletic programs. Current membership includes Butler University, Cleveland State University, the University of Detroit Mercy, the University of Illinois at Chicago, Loyola University Chicago, Valparaiso University, the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Wright State University and Youngstown State University.

The Horizon League sponsors competition in 19 sports – nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and tennis) and ten for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis and volleyball). In all sports, all teams participate in their respective post-season League championships regardless of regular-season performance, allowing all student-athletes an opportunity to qualify for NCAA championships. The League receives automatic bids to NCAA championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

The Horizon League is headquartered in Indianapolis, the "Amateur Sports Capital of the World," with offices in the Pan American Plaza (201 S. Capitol Avenue), located a block from Lucas Oil Stadium and just minutes from Conseco Fieldhouse, the

State Capitol Building, Victory Field and the NCAA national office.

HISTORY

Founded on June 16, 1979, as the Midwestern City Conference with six charter members, the League changed its name to the Midwestern Collegiate Conference in 1985 and added women's sports for the 1986-87 academic year. Charter members of the conference included current members Butler and Loyola as well as the University of Evansville, Oklahoma City University, Oral Roberts University and Xavier University. Among other current members, Detroit joined in 1980, and Cleveland State, UIC, Green Bay, Milwaukee and Wright State came aboard in 1994 in the largest non-merger conference expansion in history, with Youngstown State joining in 2001 and Valparaiso in 2007.

On June 4, 2001, the Horizon League unveiled its current name and ushered in a new dynamic direction that has brought the League closer to its stated goal of being one of the nation's top ten conferences with a focus on enhancing the student-athletes experience by upgrading the League's market and competitive positions.

ATHLETIC SUCCESS

In the past few years, the Horizon League has enjoyed unprecedented success on the national stage, highlighted by three Sweet Sixteen appearances (Butler 2003, 2007; Milwaukee 2005) and eight wins in the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship in the past six seasons.

In other sports, League teams have won at least one game in their respective NCAA Championships each of the last six seasons in men's soccer (Milwaukee 2002-05, UIC 2006-07), with UIC just one win away from the College Cup in 2007. In softball, League teams won a game in the national tournament four straight years earlier in the decade (UIC 2002, 2004; Wright State 2003; Green Bay 2005) while advancing into the second round in women's soccer three of the last four seasons (Detroit 2004, Milwaukee 2005-06). Green Bay's women's basketball team added to that résumé with a victory in the 2007 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship. Butler's Victoria Mitchell became the League's first NCAA individual champion when she won the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the 2005 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships and then

finished fourth at the 2005 NCAA Cross Country Championships.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Horizon League student-athletes also excel in the classroom as more than 500 have been named to the Academic Honor Roll each of the past seven semesters for carrying a grade-point average of 3.2 or better, including more than 600 for the fall 2007 and spring 2008 semesters. Forty-eight student-athletes were named to ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-District teams in 2007-08, while 14 earned Academic All-America honors, including a pair of first-team selections.

DEMOGRAPHICS

Horizon League institutions boast a combined enrollment of more than 130,000 plus nearly a quarter-million living alumni centered in the League's Midwest footprint. League media markets include five of the nation's top 35 in Chicago, Detroit, Cleveland, Indianapolis and Milwaukee, covering more than ten million television households and encompassing more than nine percent of the nation's television audience.

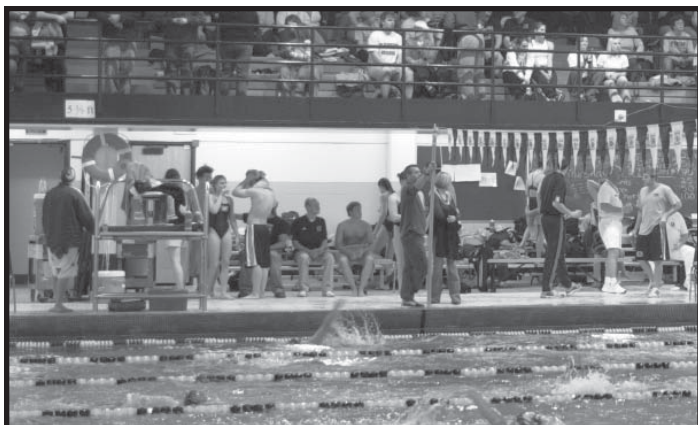
McCAFFERTY TROPHY

The Horizon League annually awards the McCafferty Trophy in recognition of its all-sports champion in honor of its first commissioner, James J. McCafferty. Cleveland State won its first McCafferty Trophy in school history following the 2007-08 academic year. The Vikings also captured their first Men's All-Sports Award, while Milwaukee claimed the women's honor for the third straight year and seventh time in the past eight years. As an indication of the League's competitive balance, eight of its ten schools won at least one team championship last year.

Erected in 1977, the Klotsche Center has undergone numerous renovations to help keep it a top-notch facility. The latest renovation project added new office space for the department of athletics, locker rooms and weight rooms, a practice gymnasium and new athletic training facilities. The project, called the Pavilion, was completed in January 2006.

The arena area was renovated prior to the 1998-99 school year. The \$2 million project including the addition of comfort and chairback seating. In 1996, new wood flooring and a new indoor track were added to the Klotsche Center. The floor has been renovated recently with the addition of the new Horizon League logo. Also, the addition of the new Panther and UWM logos was completed in the summer of 1999.

The Klotsche Center can hold as many as 5,000 spectators for a sporting event. The largest crowd to ever see a sporting event at the Klotsche Center is 5,015, present when the UWM men's basketball team faced Butler in January of 2003.



The Klotsche Center is used as a practice facility for most of UWM's varsity sports, and serves as the homecourt for volleyball and men's and women's basketball. A four-lane indoor track, added in 1996, is home to the UWM men's and women's track and field teams, and the Klotsche Natatorium, located on the lower level, is home to the UWM swimming and diving teams.

The Klotsche Center has been home to a number of major sporting events, including the 1999 MCC Indoor Track and Field Championships, the 2001 Horizon League Women's Volleyball Championship and the 2001 WIAA Boys' and Girls' Sectional Basketball Championships. The Horizon League Track and Field Championships were in Milwaukee in the spring of 2003 and the league's women's basketball tournament was played in the Klotsche Center during the 2003-04 season.



In 2002, the Klotsche Center played host to a game involving the Yugoslavian National Basketball team and NBA superstar Vlade Divac. The team wound up winning the World Basketball Championships. The arena also played host to an appearance by President George W. Bush late in the year.

The Klotsche Center is also home to UWM's intramural program and recreation center. It features a 25-meter pool, racquetball courts, weight rooms, training rooms and classrooms for instructional use, along with upstairs office space.
