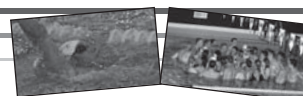
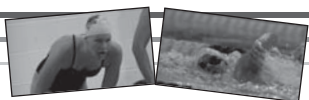

Erica Janssen Head Coach Second Season



The 2009-10 season will mark the second for University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee head coach **Erica Janssen**.

She made quite a lasting first impression a year ago, as her teams combined to lower school records on 57 different occasions over the course of the season, eventually establishing four new Horizon League records, 27 school records (14 women's/13 men's) and 15 freshmen standards (seven women's/eight men's) after all was said and done during the year.

On the women's side, Janssen coached the Horizon League's Swimming & Diving Athlete of the Year in sophomore Danielle Wenger, and also had the Horizon league Co-Diver's of the Meet - senior Ashley Hall and sophomore Kelsey George - on her roster.

The Panthers finished the season with a dual meet record of 13-3 to set a school record with 13 victories, topping the former mark of 11 set in 1991-92. Included in that was a stretch of 13-consecutive wins (not losing from Oct. 31 through Feb. 7 of the regular season) - to tie the program mark. She then led the team to a second-place finish at the Horizon League Championships.

On the men's side, she led the team to a solid third-place finish, trailing second by 40 and first place by less than 60 points with its best point total as a team since 2000. The men finished 10-5 in dual meets on the year, the most victories as a team since the 1995-96 campaign.

Janssen had spent the previous two years as the top assistant coach for the Milwaukee swimming & diving teams, helping the Panthers begin to rewrite the record book. School records were broken 33 times during that stretch, with Janssen helping lead the women to their best finish at the league championships since 2001 and the men to their best showing since 2000.

"This was an incredible opportunity for me here at UWM," Janssen said. "A lot of work was put in over my first two years in changing the culture of the swimming & diving program at UWM and improving our finishes at the league championships. For the student-athletes, not that much changed. There was a smooth transition - just the face of the program changed - philosophy, direction, all of that is staying the same. [Former head coach] Dave (Griffone) and I worked together on every decision and now that will just fall on me."

The program made great strides over the first two seasons with Janssen on the staff. Two years ago, the women finished third at the league championships and the men also placed third for the second-straight season after three-consecutive fifth-place showings. The women set 12 new school records and the men five. Janssen also had a hand in helping Chase Gravengood qualify for the 2008 Olympic Trials.

In 2006-07, she helped lead UWM to numerous achievements as a first-year assistant. In addition to a runner-up finish on the women's side at the Horizon League Championships - where the team recorded its highest-ever point total - she helped the men to their best finish since 2000.

The women broke 11 school or league records and earned 12 Horizon League Swimmer or Diver of the Week awards. Their 6-3 dual record included six-straight victories and marked the team's best winning percentage since going 8-4 during the 1997-98 season. In addition to placing third at the league championships, the men broke four school records and recorded a 5-4 dual record. It gave the squad a winning dual record for the first time since going 7-4 in the 1998-99 campaign. They also enjoyed their first five-dual winning streak since the 1999-2000 season.

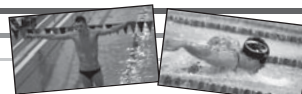
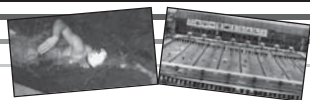
Janssen took control of a unique situation given her age and gender. She is one of the youngest head coaches in NCAA Division I as well as one of the few women at this level to be coaching a men's team.

Janssen came to UWM from Ball State, where she spent one season as the graduate assistant coach for the Cardinals while finishing up her master's degree in sports administration. She was at UW-Stevens Point prior to that, where she was a four-year letterwinner for the Pointers from 2000-04 and served as a volunteer assistant for the program for one season after her swimming career was over.

While at UWSP, she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in business administration and coaching. In addition to serving as a volunteer assistant at her college alma mater, Janssen was also a volunteer coach at her high school alma mater, Oshkosh West. Additionally, she spent three years coaching the Stevens Point Area YMCA Swim Team.



Janssen was a five-time All-America selection, four-year NCAA qualifier and an academic all-conference honoree in the pool for the Pointers. A team captain as a junior and senior, she helped guide the program to the WIAC title in 2001. A four-time conference relay champion, she earned all-league honors eight times. During the 2000-01 season, Janssen swam the third leg for the 200 freestyle relay team that broke the school record with a clocking of 1:36.85.





Question & Answer Session With Head Coach Erica Janssen...

What were the biggest things you learned in your first year as the head coach?

"Of the things I learned last year being a first-year head coach, the biggest lesson was that anything can happen at anytime. Just when you think you have a plan, everything can go in a completely different direction at any time. I learned to live day-by-day and take each day as a step towards our overall goal in February at the Horizon League Championships. As long as we do everything that keeps us on track to achieve our goals, we are making progress."

What will be your biggest challenges this season, especially in regards to the new suit rules?

"This year, just like any other year, we will have many challenges. I don't view the new rules with the technical suits to be an issue for our team. I know that we train our team very hard mentally and physically. Every team will be under the same rules. I believe the truly-best swimmers will rise to the top and the swimmers that significantly benefited from the suits will no longer be challenging the top swimmers."

How has swimming & diving in the Horizon League changed in your first few seasons?

"The talent in the Horizon League has dramatically deepened in the past few seasons. It continues to become more of a challenge to place into finals at the Horizon League Championships. We have seen this with the recent addition of Valparaiso. With the continuous improvement of the league, it will attract more talented student-athletes to every league school."

What are your goals for the 2009-10 season?

"Just like every other year, our goal is to win Horizon League titles for the men and women. We take each day, whether it's a practice or a meet, as a step in our preparation for the league championships. The entire team has goals of simply improving. If everyone has best times/scores this year, we know we did our job every day. Everything will fall into place if we concern ourselves with what we can control and not what other teams are doing."

How would you describe your coaching style and philosophy?

"Naturally, it is the hope that the student-athletes maximize their potential. As coaches, we hope to positively influence that by focusing our goals on the little things such as training, technique and continual improvement. This will set us up for success at the end of the season, where we expect to achieve our highest level of performance. The goal of the program is to win Horizon League titles. We train to achieve these goals both mentally and physically. Having experienced collegiate success, it would be extremely rewarding for our student-athletes to experience that for themselves as well. It is an incredible and lifelong feeling to be a part of a winning team and it is something they all deserve to feel for their hard work and talent. Each student-athlete is an individual, not just a member of the swimming & diving team. I care tremendously for each of them as a person and for their success in college and beyond. These programs emphasize not only athletic success, but also the importance of academic success. I hope each member of the team is a great ambassador for the program, the sport of swimming & diving, the university, and their respective community."

What strengths do you bring to the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee swimming program?

"By being a part of the program for two years as an assistant, I have already had a great impact on both teams. With stepping into a different role as the head coach, I bring my passion for the sport of swimming & diving and experience as a former student-athlete to both teams. As a former collegiate swimmer, I have had the opportunity to experience success at this level and I continue to carry those experiences and attitude with me every day. I can relate to our student-athletes by understanding the incredible hard work that is put in on a daily basis and the rewards from that hard work. By growing up in Wisconsin and my past experiences of coaching, I am very familiar with swimming & diving in the midwest which will continue to help tremendously with recruiting."

Why should a potential student-athlete choose UWM?

"UWM is a great place to get an education, which is always the number one priority when a recruit picks an institution to attend college. The city of Milwaukee has a lot to offer outside of the classroom. The athletic component of picking a school should never be the number one decision factor. We have two great swimming & diving programs that are on the rise that have proven to show tremendous improvement among individuals. A student-athlete can get both a great education and can maximize their athletic talent at UWM."

What is the ideal recruit?

"The ideal recruit is an individual who has a strong desire to succeed not only in the pool, but also perform at their highest level in the classroom. As coaches, we look for potential student-athletes that are competitive and share our desire to be successful individually and win team championships. Individuals that can contribute as a member of the swimming & diving team with points and to the overall positive atmosphere of the teams are desirable qualities for which we look. We want someone that supports teammates and cares about their success just as much as their own."

What is your vision for the UWM swimming & diving program?

"I would like to see both of our teams win league titles and continuously compete for titles every year. In this process we will continuously improve freshmen and school records and qualify individuals for the NCAA Championships. Alumni can be a huge factor in the success of a program and I hope to continue to build upon our strong alumni contingent that supports both our programs."

What are some of your favorite memories from your first year as the head coach during the 2008-09 season?

"Some of my favorite memories from last season include many swims/dives from the Horizon League Championships. Watching Jake Kalinowski win the 50 free, Ashley Hall and Kelsey George winning both diving boards, Sarah Wardecke setting league records in both breaststroke events, breaking every school relay record for men and women and Molly Finn being the first woman in the Horizon League to win the 200 butterfly four years in a row."

"Besides Horizon League, many of my favorite memories come from the winter training trip in Florida. Having the entire team together for 10 straight days creates a lot of great memories."

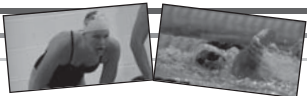
What meet, other than the Horizon League Championships, are you looking forward to most this upcoming season?

"The entire team looks forward to the Green Bay dual meet every year. This year we have them at home in Milwaukee. That meet always brings out the best in every swimmer from both Milwaukee and Green Bay. It is an extremely competitive meet and neither side thinks they are going to go home with a loss. It's a very healthy, friendly, rivalry that we are better for every year because of it being on the regular-season schedule."

What was your biggest surprise, and biggest disappointment, last season?

"The biggest surprise last year was being so close to winning the men's championship. Being a very young team, you never know if they will step up at the championships or crumble under the pressure. I knew we could compete for second but was pleasantly surprised when we were still competing to win up until the final events."

"As far as disappointments, I think the only time we were disappointed last season was with our loss to Green Bay in the dual meets. It is a meet that brings out a lot of emotion, which truly does not have any meaning at the end of the season, but it's about pride and wanting to win that meet every year. It's a big confidence booster going into the final meet of the season."

Kyle Clements Assistant Coach Second Season



Kyle Clements begins his second season as an assistant swimming coach at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. He joined Erica Janssen's staff in early September of last season.

In his first year, he helped lead the team to lower school records on 57 different occasions over the course of the season, eventually establishing 46 new league and program standards. In addition, he helped coached conference champions in eight different events.

"Kyle is a tremendous addition to our swimming and diving program here at UWM," Janssen said. "He brings enthusiasm, experience, determination and the familiarity with a variety of programs that I was looking for when naming an assistant to the staff. His knowledge and contacts with recruiting have benefitted the program immediately."

Clements came to Milwaukee from Marshall University, where he served as the volunteer assistant coach for the women's swimming & diving team in his last season.

Clements earned his undergraduate degree in aquatics from Ball State in 2007, while also minoring in teaching aquatics. He spent four years as a student assistant coach for the Ball State swim team while earning his degree.

Todd Hill Diving Coach Seventh Season



Todd Hill enters his seventh season as Milwaukee' diving coach since coming back to UWM following an illustrious diving career with the Panthers.

Hill continued his stellar and award-winning coaching run, earning Horizon League Diving Coach of the Year honors four times in the past five years. Over the past four seasons, his divers have combined to earn 26 Horizon League Diver of the Week honors, with eight advancing to NCAA Zone Diving competition.

He helped the women to league championships on both boards in 2008-09, with Ashley Hall (3-m winner) and Kelsey George (1-m champion) sharing Horizon League Diver of the Meet honors. His women's squad dominated the league meet, placing four divers in the top six on both boards.

He led a team effort in 2007-08, placing seven divers in the top 10 on the one-meter board and seven in the top nine on the three-meter. Hill led the way after finishing second (1-m) and third (3-m) overall.

Hill had the women's league diver of the meet for the third-consecutive year in 2006-07, guiding Crystal Szymanski to the honor after claiming a league title on the one-meter board and second place on the three-meter board, despite her missing well over half the season to injury before coming back. In addition, Emily Duesler claimed All-Horizon First Team honors on the three-meter board.

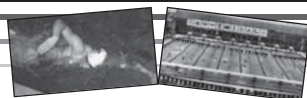
In 2005-06, he helped guide Erin Blemberg to Diver of the Meet honors in back-to-back seasons, with Blemberg setting a new school mark on the three-meter board en route to winning league titles on both boards. Additionally, Panther divers placed 1-2-3 on the three-meter and 1-2-4 on the one-meter at the championships. The previous season, Blemberg won the three-meter crown and took second on the one-meter, as UWM had three finalists on the one-meter board.

In addition to his duties with UWM, Hill is currently the head diving coach for the Schroeder Aquatic Center diving team. He joined the swimming & diving program after working as the head diving coach for Whitefish Bay High School and Homestead High School. During that time, Hill served as the assistant for the Schroeder YMCA diving team.

In becoming the Panther diving coach, Hill had added to an already impressive list of credentials that includes coaching many young athletes to the Junior Zone competition and coaching one Junior National Champion. He has also instructed six high school state champions, numerous high school All-Americans and has led many athletes to become finalists in state competition.

The list also includes seven YMCA National Champions, five AAU National qualifiers, three Junior National qualifiers (while also assisting a Junior National Champion in 2001), five Senior National qualifiers and a compilation of Junior and Senior National Zone competitors too numerous to list.

Besides being considered one of the best diving coaches in the league and area, Hill had a distinguished diving career at UWM. He won Midwest Collegiate Conference Championships three times and was a four-time NCAA Zone qualifier. He was named the MCC Diver of the Year in 1999 and 2000. Hill graduated from UWM in the spring of 2001 with a bachelor's degree in psychology.





Bryce Perica Assistant Coach Second Season



Bryce Perica begins his second season as a member of the Milwaukee swimming & diving coaching staff.

In addition to assisting with recruiting, Perica works primarily with the UWM sprinters. Last season, he helped coach Jake Kalinowski to a Horizon League Championship in the 50 freestyle and school records in the 50, 100 and 200 freestyle events. In addition, every freestyle relay record on both the men's and women's sides was broken over the course of the season.

"Bryce is a huge addition to this staff," Janssen said. "His collegiate swimming experience brings a new vibe to our entire team. I'm looking forward to him continuing to work with the sprint group and continue to develop the top sprinters in the Horizon League."

Perica graduated from the University of Wyoming in 2006 with an undergraduate degree in English. He was a four-time letterwinner on the swim team and was an academic all-conference selection all four years in the Mountain West Conference. During the 2003-2004 season, he swam the freestyle leg of the school record-setting 200 medley relay and had the fastest 50 free on Wyoming's team in the 2004-2005 season.

Perica currently lives in Oak Creek with his wife, Kate.

Chris Zills Sports Information Contact Fifth Season



Chris Zills is the UWM Sports Information contact for the Milwaukee swimming & diving teams. He joined the athletic department in July of 2005, after spending four and a half years as the head sports information director at Marian University in Fond du Lac, Wis.

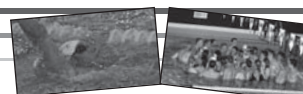
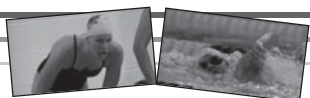

Home meets in **BOLD**





The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee women's swimming & diving team had a season for the record books last year. The team broke 25 school and league records, set a program record for both dual victories (13) and dual winning streak and then won four individual league titles en route to finishing in second place at the Horizon League Championships. The team ended the season with the swimming & diving athlete of the year, both co-divers of the league meet and the diving coach of the year. Not a bad haul for a team that lost just four seniors.

"Getting second place last season was a great experience," Milwaukee head coach **Erica Janssen** said. "We swam very well and wanted to win, but we were happy with second and how everyone did. We couldn't have asked for more based on our weak areas heading into the meet."

The team may have graduated just a handful of seniors, but replacing Molly Finn – who holds seven current school records and one league record and won six individual league titles in her career – and Ashley Hall – the co-league diver of the meet, will not be an easy task.

"It's hard because you could always count on Molly to win," Janssen said. "Our job is to set ourselves up so when a swimmer like Molly graduates, we have someone else that can step into that role and we don't miss a beat. We already have people in place that may not be quite as good as Molly, but can do a good job stepping into that role."

The team enjoyed a lot of success last season, including the noted winning streak that spanned October through February without a dual loss.

"I don't put that much emphasis on dual meets but it always feels good to win," Janssen said. "It's not that I care about winning, but I do care about losing. It really helps the girls' confidence level when we start winning events at meets like Wisconsin. Our schedule is really tough this season ... I don't know if we are going to win any meets in October. But, it's tough and they have to get used to swimming against faster opponents and building that confidence level so that when they step up in at conference they are ready."

Sprints

Sarah Wardecke had no problem making the adjustment to college swimming and put together an incredible sprint season – she won the 50 and 100 freestyle five times each – and set freshman records in both.

"Sarah is one of the most talented swimmers I have ever seen in my life," Janssen said. "She is just a kid that wants to do well and I knew we would be extremely lucky if she decided to come to Milwaukee. Sarah wins ... Sarah competes. She wants to be the best by yards and yards."

Junior Ellie Gross and sophomore Heidi Niespodzany also had solid seasons, with each scoring in the sprints at the league meet.

"Ellie, Heidi and then Kelsey Ogle will be swimming a little bit for us this year," Janssen said. "It will be kind of an unknown with some freshmen in there but I feel really comfortable about it. Randee Cardinal and Parker Watson will be right there contributing this season as well."

Distance

Junior Danielle Wenger had an incredible season last year, capped off with Horizon League Swimming & Diving Athlete of the Year honors at the league meet after winning titles in the 1000 freestyle (in a league-record time) and also in the mile with a school-record time. She ended the season with 16 individual victories and will lead the way in the distance events.

"It's nice because if you put her in a race, she wins it," Janssen said. "Danielle has such a strong mindset and she just wants to win. She does everything in her power everyday to set herself up for that success."

Other key contributors are seniors Jenny Westfall and Alex Nelson and Gross. Ogle will also be back at full strength after an injury-filled season a year ago.

"Danielle leads that group but having youngsters like Taylor Andrews and

Ashley Yansza, in addition to Alex Nelson and Jenny Westfall, will help immensely," Janssen said. "Kelsey Ogle is back after surgery and will step right back in and is training well so far. Karmyn VandeWettering and Ashley Yansza will also swim some mid-distance and Rachel Rebitski will give us added depth as well. Alex and Jenny had great seasons last year and we expect them to be able to step up even more."

Butterfly

Last season, Molly Finn won the 200 butterfly for the fourth-straight season. That marked the first time a UWM swimmer had ever won four-consecutive league titles in one event in program history. She also took third in the 100 fly, but Milwaukee had very little depth after Finn. Janssen will need someone to fill that hole.

"We will look to Maggi Beck, who is already swimming very well," Janssen said. "We look for her to step into Molly's role and she is ready and determined. We don't have a lot of pure flyers, but some will crossover like Heidi Niespodzany. If we have a weak link, it will still be in the fly."

Backstroke

Two newcomers emerged as solid additions to the backstroke group last season, as sophomore Danielle Chapman ended the season with a freshman-record time in the 200 back at the league meet. Sophomore Jennifer Schober posted the top time in the 100 back, while Wenger also swam backstroke events when needed.

"Danielle Chapman developed out of nowhere for us in the backstroke and ended up breaking records," Janssen said. "She and Wenger will play a large role and then we recruited a large group of freshmen, as that was a hole for us last year. Shea Berg, Jenna Wisdorf and Andrea Chvatal can all step up and fill those spots for us."

Breaststroke

Despite swimming in breaststroke events just a handful of times during the regular season, Wardecke blew away the competition in the 100 and 200 at the league meet. She won Horizon League championships in both races, crushing school and league records in each.

Not only does UWM have Wardecke, but senior Kerry Rossow looks to close out her career on a high note after earning all-league honors in breaststroke on four occasions, including a league crown in the 100 breast as a sophomore. Senior Bailey Nennig also contributed heavily, setting career-best times in each.

"We will put Sarah in if we need to, but we trust Kerry and Bailey to take care of business for us in the breaststroke," Janssen said. "I think, as a whole, this group is one of our strongest assets. We brought in some girls, Shannon Slattery and Emily Blohm, to slide into those roles over the next few seasons."

Individual Medley

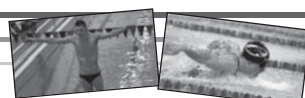
Finn played a large role in the IM events last season, but Nennig had a breakthrough campaign in the events on her way to second-team all-league honors in the 400 where she broke the school record in the preliminaries at the league meet. Senior Ali Winius and Schober were also big contributors, with Winius scoring in each event at the championship meet.

"Bailey had an amazing year and we will look to her again," Janssen said. "We do have a lot of options there as well with Ali and Jennifer. We have also added Taylor Andrews to the mix to give us more depth."

Relays

The team depth was obvious last year, especially in the relays. The women joined the men in the unprecedented feat of setting school records in each and every relay a season ago. The bulk of those swimmers return, so a return shot at more record-breaking attempts seems like a given.

"It will be anybody's game to step up and take over," Janssen said. "The competition will be great but it's almost a no-lose situation. There are a lot of people that have the potential to be successful in these roles."





Diving

The women's diving team continues to roll through the years. It almost feels like the torch continues to get passed on, as the Panthers have had four different divers of the meet in the last five seasons and that continued a season ago with Hall and junior Kelsey George splitting the honors in 2009.

"Hopefully Kelsey can step up and give us more of the same or even better," Janssen said. "The goal will be to put six girls in the top eight in diving at the league meet. And, it's never been done before, but that is the goal."

Horizon League

After finishing second in two of the past three seasons, the Panthers have aspirations of bringing home a league title in 2010. Green Bay will be the defending champion yet again, so it will be a given that it will be strong. Janssen feels there will be four teams that will be competing to win it this season and that Milwaukee will definitely be in the mix.

"The team last year learned that anything can happen," Janssen said. "They learned that we are that good as a team and that we can win. They just needed to fix a few areas and this year they are excited and know we can do it."

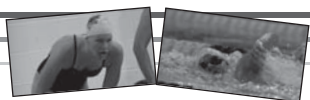

Based on the success of last year's underclassmen, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee men's swimming & diving team will be ready for another stellar season in 2009-10. The freshmen broke eight class records while the team as a whole set 22 new school and league marks. The bulk of the team is set to return, as the Panthers graduated just two seniors who accounted for 30 of the 647 points the team scored in coming in third place at the Horizon League Championships in 2009.

"We knew our freshman class was talented and it played out that way," Milwaukee head coach **Erica Janssen** said. "They didn't break all of those records because they put on a suit. They worked hard and are very talented. And, at the end, coming within 56 points of winning a league championship was a great way to end the season."

Last year's freshmen rewrote the class record book, as Jordan Diel (100 & 200 butterfly), Nathan Rahe (200 & 400 IM), Sam Keele (100 & 200 breaststroke) and Kyle Trelka (50 freestyle & 100 backstroke) each established new standards along the way.

"The freshmen really made the biggest impact on the team as a whole," Janssen said. "That just speaks to the job of recruiting that we did and how dedicated and committed this team is. We may have provided the environment for them to go fast, but they had to do the work, the ones that had to push themselves."

Losing just two seniors really provides a lot of veteran leadership returning, something that is not lost on the head coach.

"It is going to be a big help with the experience we have coming back," Janssen said. "We lost Andrew (Belton) and David (Adams). They scored some points for us, but were not significant scorers overall. So, bringing back last year's freshman class and then, another class that I think is even better, just shows that we are going to be set up for the next few seasons."

Sprints

Junior Jake Kalinowski took his performance to a new level at the Horizon League Championships, winning the title in the 50 freestyle with a school-record performance. In fact, he even broke the league record during the 200 freestyle relay but saw that mark bettered in the finals. In addition to that, he established new school marks in the 100 and 200 free at the league meet as well.

"Jake is going to be a leader in that group after winning the 50 free championship last year," Janssen said. "He is back to do it again and we signed a bunch of freshmen in that sprint group - Caleb Sandvold, Mike Brady, Mike Shalla, Brady Garner ... they are all looking very good in practice already and will help round out our depth as well as our relay spots. Sprinters win championships, since every relay is basically a sprint. If we can get a real solid group of sprinters, we will be set up pretty well."

Senior Ed Lichinsky and sophomore Kyle Trelka were close behind on the top times list in each, with Lichinsky scoring points in both the 50 and the 100 at the championships.

"Ed Lichinsky and Kyle Trelka will swim some sprints as will Jordan Diel," Janssen said. "Otherwise it will be those guys and the incoming freshmen that can hopefully step into those roles and develop."

Distance

Junior Dan Heraly was UWM's top finisher in the distance events last year, setting a school record in the 1000 freestyle along the way. He will be joined by senior Matt Mahoney, but from there the team will be looking for depth.

"Dan Heraly had a good season last year and will look to improve after working very hard this summer," Janssen said. "A big spot for us to fix in recruiting was the distance group and we brought in Ryan Goggans and Zac Kraai to help out with that and Cris Smith as well. They are all doing very well already and we hope they develop to where we will see some positives come from this group quickly."

Butterfly

Milwaukee was very successful in the butterfly events at the league championships, placing three in the top nine and five in the top 13 in the 200 fly as well as three of the top nine in the 100 fly. Leading the way were sophomores Jordan Diel and Evan Green. Diel placed third in the 100 and fourth in the 200 and set freshman records in both and a new school record in the 100 fly.

"Jordan's goal is to make the NCAA championships before he is done and it would be great to do it this year," Janssen said. "I think Jordan will lead that group, but we had four other freshmen last season that were right there with him and everybody is gunning for that top spot. They all have huge goals."

Youth was served in the race. In addition to the pair, sophomores Sky Boggio and Nathan Rahe gave UWM four swimmers whose top times were within 43-hundredths of each other, with Greg Wise right behind them.

"Our group of sophomores that will swim butterfly - Jordan, Sky, Evan and Nathan - they are just going to do what they do and get better," Janssen said. "It's just a great boost to your confidence when you can put four guys in the event and know that one will win. And they all have that same attitude - they all want each other to do well."

Backstroke

The backstroke group was not deep last season, but the swimmers UWM had in the event broke both school records. Senior Jeremy Waldhart earned second team all-league honors with a record-breaking performance in the 200 backstroke, while Trelka took third in the 100 back with a school record as well. Junior Matt Kluczinske also provides solid depth.

"We are hoping to have four or five guys in the 100 and 200 that will be extremely solid and all have the chance of winning an event," Janssen said. "Waldhart, Kluczinske and Trelka are all extremely talented and will help lead that group. In addition, Kevin Ewald and Justin Hasting will be newcomers that will have immediate impact in the backstroke for us."

Breaststroke

Sam Keele and Brady Huemann each had great freshman seasons in the breaststroke events. Keele set new class records in each and went on to finish sixth in both at the league championships. Huemann swam in the finals in the 200 and also scored in the 100.

"Sam and Brady both just want to get better," Janssen said. "They both had great freshmen years and then we look for Sho Young to step right in and contribute like those guys did last year."

Individual Medley

Another very deep event for the team, the Panthers will look to add to it and continue to make its strong parts stronger. Waldhart set a school record in the 400 IM in finishing fourth, while Kluczinske and a large group of now-sophomores bring the depth in Keele, Green, Wise, Rahe and Huemann.

"It feels good to have depth in the IM's," Janssen said. "We will throw Justin Hastings into the mix and it will help a lot. The men are looking to be so solid across the board in that we don't think we will have a weak link. We feel we fixed the spots where we were weak."

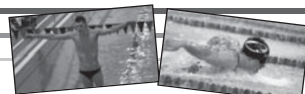
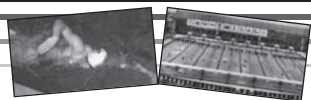
Diving

UWM was thin and young at diving last season, but made a solid showing at the league championships. Sophomores Jake Koll (fifth on both boards) and Shane Conner (eighth and 10th) return as well as a pair of newcomers in James Hortman and Carlos Rios.

"Diving will be an unknown for us," Janssen said. "Jake and Shane did a great job last year, but they were both young and had to learn. I think they are going to step up this year and help out the two freshmen."

Relays

Milwaukee made history last season, setting school records in each and ev-





ery relay. That will be a tough task to top, but Janssen returns the bulk of the student-athletes who set those times last season, so she is looking forward to the challenge.

"It is tough, but it is a good problem to have," Janssen said. "Every single relay seems to have six or seven guys that can compete for the spots. It could come down to who is the best that day and we will go from there. It will be difficult to pick relays this season and I feel we will be solid A-B-C-D across the board."

Horizon League

The men's side was supposed to be a two-team race a year ago heading into

the championships, but in the end there were five teams in the mix with UIC coming out – a bit unexpectedly – on top. Things look the same heading into this season, in that anything can happen.

"The league just keeps getting better," Janssen said. "It was great and exciting for five teams to still be in the mix at the championships on day three last year. Every one has signed a good class and it will be the same this year. It's anybody's game and UIC proved that last year. That was one of the greatest things about last year. Everyone who scored out the meet had another school winning handily, but UIC just took over. It just proves that anything can happen on any day and we feel we can do the same thing."

**RECORD BREAKERS**

The women's swimming & diving team broke four Horizon League, 14 school records and seven freshmen records a season ago. They included the following:

500 Freestyle: School record - Danielle Wenger

Wenger lowered the record in the 500 freestyle on three occasions during the season, first against Green Bay (5:04.01) and then again as a split of her record performance in the 1000 free at the league championships (4:57.23). She topped that again in the actual race, going 4:55.29 to break the original record of 5:04.27 set by Kelsey Ogle in 2008.

1000 Freestyle: League & School record - Danielle Wenger

Wenger originally broke her own record of 10:17.43 (set in 2008), with a new league-record time of 10:14.43 at the University of Chicago Jan. 23. She lowered it again at the league championships with a time of 10:06.65.

1650 Freestyle: School record - Danielle Wenger

Wenger took first place all three times she swam the 1650 free on the season, breaking what was her own record (17:13.65 set in 2008) with a time of 16:53.14 to win the title at the league championships.

100 Butterfly: School record - Molly Finn

Finn finally added the school record in the 100 fly as a senior, first going 57.93 at the Falcon Invitational Dec. 5 to eclipse the mark of 58.06 set by Julie Olson in 2005. She topped that with a time of 57.87 at the same meet before touching the wall in 55.94 in the preliminaries at the league championships.

200 Butterfly: League & School record - Molly Finn

Finn continued to lower the school mark in the 200 fly, one that she originally set as a freshman at 2:05.01. She won her fourth-straight league crown in the event with a time of 2:01.37.

**100 Breaststroke: League, School & Freshman record
Sarah Wardecke**

Wardecke was swimming the 100 breast for just the third time all season at the league championships when she went 1:03.19 to break the school and freshman records (Shannon Berndt, 1:03.81 in 2007) and set a new league mark as well. She bettered that in the finals with a time of 1:02.49 to claim the title.

**200 Breaststroke: League, School & Freshman record
Sarah Wardecke**

Once again, Wardecke was swimming the 200 breast for just the fifth time all season at the league championships when she went 2:16.73 to break the school and freshman records (Shannon Berndt, 2:19.82 in 2007) and set a new league mark as well.

200 IM: School record - Molly Finn

Finn again broke her own mark in the race, lowering the standard in the prelims at the league meet (2:04.16) and then again in the finals (2:03.08). Her record from 2008 was 2:06.75, while she first broke the school mark as a freshman at 2:07.30.

400 IM: School record - Bailey Nennig

Nennig knocked nearly 10 seconds off her career-best time over the course of the season, eventually going 4:26.05 in the prelims at the league meet to break the former school mark of 4:28.32 set by Finn in 2006.

**200 Freestyle Relay: School record
Wardecke, Chapman, Gross, Nennig**

The 200 free relay record fell at the league meet, with the team taking third in a time of 1:35.33 to break the mark of 1:35.56 set in 2007 by Lindsay Caldwell, Megan Skiba, Jamilla Edwards and Jess Kelly.

**400 Freestyle Relay: School record
Niespodzany, Nennig, Wenger, Wardecke**

The next relay to fall was the 400 freestyle, as the second-place time of 3:28.50 narrowly edged the former mark of 3:28.93 set by Caldwell, Heather Sawatzki, Finn and Kelly (then a league-record) in 2006.

800 Freestyle Relay: School record**Gross, Nennig, Wenger, Niespodzany**

The 800 free relay record got shattered, with the mark getting lowered by over seven seconds in 7:32.15. That broke the mark of 7:39.78 set by Kelsey Ogle, Wenger, Finn and Ellie Gross in 2008.

200 Medley Relay: School record**Wenger, Rossow, Finn, Wardecke**

The former 200 medley relay record of 1:46.35, set by Wenger, Kerry Rossow, Amanda Nelson and Jess Kelly in 2008 was handily beaten, as the Panthers touched the wall in 1:44.88 in 2009.

400 Medley Relay: School record**Wenger, Rossow, Finn, Wardecke**

Lastly, the school record of 3:51.09 in the 400 medley relay, set by Julie Olson, Caldwell, Finn and Jess Kelly as a league record in 2006, was taken down by a time of 3:48.90 at the league meet.

50 Freestyle: Freshman record**Sarah Wardecke**

Wardecke first broke the record, 24.11 held by Lindsay Caldwell, with a 23.88 showing in a relay at the league meet. She bettered that in both the preliminaries (23.87) and the finals (23.76) of the league event.

100 Freestyle: Freshman record**Sarah Wardecke**

Wardecke jumped into the mix immediately, breaking Caldwell's freshman mark in the 100 free of 52.64 in just her second meet of the season, going 52.25 against Wright State Oct. 31.

200 Freestyle: Freshman record**Heidi Niespodzany**

Niespodzany broke and then lowered the freshman record in the 200 free, as her time of 1:54.37 at the Falcon Invitational Dec. 5 first toppled the mark of 1:54.62 set by Kelsey Ogle. She then lowered it to 1:53.57 in the preliminaries at the league championships.

500 Freestyle: Freshman record**Heidi Niespodzany**

Niespodzany added to her resume with the freshman record in the 500 free at the league meet, touching the wall in 5:01.26 to take nearly three seconds off the old standard of 5:04.27 set by Ogle as well.

200 Backstroke: Freshman record**Danielle Chapman**

Chapman made her league-championship performance in the 200 backstroke a good one, as she broke the record of 2:07.72, held by Julie Olson, with a 2:06.17 time in the prelims. She one-upped that with a 2:05.45 showing in the finals.

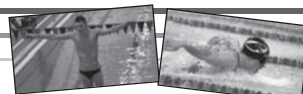
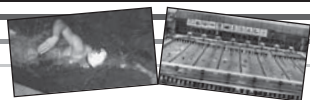
Milwaukee added six Horizon League Swimmer or Diver of the Week awards to its resume in 2008-09, giving them a league-best 25 in the past three seasons.

Danielle Wenger earned the final one at the end of January, while **Bailey Nennig** (Dec. 10) and **Sarah Wardecke** (Nov. 19) were also named swimmer of the week during the regular season.

Ashley Hall was honored as diver of the week on three occasions (Dec. 10, Nov. 12 and Nov. 5), giving her a league-high total of eight over her final two seasons. In addition to that, she was also named U.S. Army Horizon League Scholar-Athlete of the Week in late-January, earning herself that accolade four times during her time at UWM.

RECORD-BREAKING REGULAR SEASON:

The Panthers finished the season with a dual meet record of 13-3. Included in that was a stretch of 13-consecutive wins (not losing from Oct. 31 through Feb. 7 of the regular season) - good enough to tie the school record for a winning streak. The 13 victories did set a record as well, topping the 11 that the team had in 1991-92 (11-1).

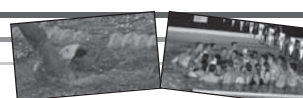
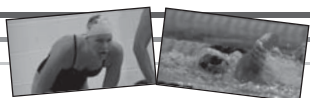

**RECORD BREAKERS**

The men's swimming & diving team broke 13 school records, eight freshmen records and one Klotsche Natatorium mark a season ago. They included the following:

50 Freestyle: School record - Jake Kalinowski

Kalinowski broke Josh Baseheart's six-year old record of 20.23 in the 50 free on two occasions at the Horizon League Championships. The first time came as a relay leadoff, where his time of 20.17 broke the league mark as well. Following the prelims (where the league mark was lowered), Kalinowski lowered his own standard with a time of 20.12 to bring home the title.

100 Freestyle: School record - Jake Kalinowski

Kalinowski knocked over a second off his previous season-best in the finals of the 100 free at the league championships. His time of 44.61 toppled Baseheart's record of 44.65 set in 2002.

200 Freestyle: School record - Jake Kalinowski

Kalinowski went 3-for-3 in the sprints, erasing Baseheart from the record book in the process. In the 200, his time of 1:38.46 narrowly edged the 1:38.51 that Baseheart put up in 2002.

1000 Freestyle: School record - Dan Heraly

Heraly had an impressive showing in the 1000 free at the league championship meet, knocking over 20 seconds off his previous season-best time in going 9:25.60. That time handily passed the former mark of 9:29.29 set by Robby Leibold in 2008.

**100 Butterfly: School & Freshman record
Jordan Diel**

Diel lowered the freshman record (49.80 by Andrew Babcock) on three occasions over the course of the season, first doing so with a time of 49.75 at the Falcon Invitational Dec. 5. he lowered it again to 49.38 in the prelims at the league meet and then did it one better when he beat Chase Gravengood's school record time of 49.18 with his third-place showing of 48.71.

**100 Backstroke: School & Freshman record
Kyle Trelka**

Trelka took over two seconds off his previous season-best time in the 100 back at the league meet, breaking the school record of 50.88 held by Bill Kuri (2001) and the freshman standard of 50.89 (also Kuri) with a time of 50.15 in the preliminaries.

**200 Backstroke: School record * Klotsche Natatorium record
Jeremy Waldhart**

Waldhart lowered the school record to 1:47.68 in the preliminaries of the race at the league meet. That broke the mark of 1:50.47 set a season ago by Tyler Jefferson. He also set a new Klotsche Natatorium record when his time of 1:51.76 against Western Illinois beat the record he set in 2008 of 1:52.96.

400 IM: School record - Jeremy Waldhart

Waldhart put together a brilliant performance in the 400 IM at the league championships. His time in the prelims of 4:00.47 narrowly missed the school mark of 3:59.32 (set by Gravengood in 2007), but did knock over eight seconds off his season-best prior. He then proceeded to get the record, going 3:58.20 in the finals.

**200 Freestyle Relay: School record
Kalinowski, Lichinsky, Belton, Trelka**

The 200 free relay record was one of the oldest in the record book, set at 1:23.17 in 2000 by Kuri, VanDenWymelenberg, Babcock and Schmaling. The record fell easily, as UWM would touch the wall in 1:21.44.

**400 Freestyle Relay: School record
Trelka, Kalinowski, Lichinsky, Belton**

The same group of Kuri, VanDenWymelenberg, Babcock and Schmaling also held the 400 free relay record, also set in 2000 at 3:02.48. The squad knocked almost two seconds off the standard, settling for a time of 3:00.68.

Just one season after Bill McCarty, Chase Gravengood, David Yugo and Tyler

Jefferson set the record at 6:45.25, the Panthers broke the standard again. This time they came in at 6:43.16.

The team knocked over two and a half seconds off the former record of 1:32.97 when they came in at 1:30.43. The former mark, held by Gravengood, Cody Smith, Ross Bittner and Jefferson, was set in 2007.

Lastly, a 3:20.78 showing in the 400 medley relay wiped the record book clean for each relay entry. That mark beat the former standard of 3:22.33, set in 2003 by Procto, Fyock, Vergeer and Baseheart.

Baseheart lost yet another of his records when Trelka went 20.72 as an exhibition swim at the league championships. That broke the former mark of 20.85.

**200 Butterfly: Freshman record

Diel earned freshman marks in both butterfly events, breaking Gravengood's mark of 1:51.86 when he went 1:51.25 in the preliminaries at the league championships.

**100 Breaststroke: Freshman record
Sam Keele**

Keele broke the mark in the preliminaries at the Horizon League Championships and then lowered it in the finals. His time of 57.34 first broke the mark of 57.42 held by Jared Sobczak and then was lowered to 57.27 in the finals.

**200 Breaststroke: Freshman record
Sam Keele**

Keele pulled off the breaststroke double with his time in the preliminaries at the league meet. He touched the wall in 2:06.47 to break the former mark of 2:06.52 held by Kyle Fyock.

**200 IM: Freshman record
Nathan Rahe**

Rahe doubled up on the freshman mark in the 200 IM, breaking it in the prelims (1:53.24) and then lowering that standard in the finals (1:51.89). The former mark of 1:53.32 was held by Gravengood.

**400 IM: Freshman record
Nathan Rahe**

Rahe erased Gravengood's 400 IM freshman mark on two occasions at the league meet as well. His time in the prelims of 4:02.12 beat Gravengood's record of 4:03.29 and he went on to lower that to 4:02.04 in the finals.

REGULAR SEASON CARRY-OVER:

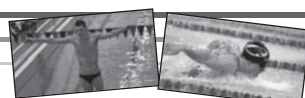
Milwaukee finished 10-5 in dual meets on the year, its most victories since the 1995-96 campaign. For the nine seasons prior to 2008-09, the high-water mark for dual wins by the men's team had been six.

GOOD IN THE CLASSROOM AS WELL

Jeremy Waldhart led by example in the pool as well as in the classroom. Last season, Waldhart was selected as the U.S. Army Scholar-Athlete of the Week on three occasions - a league-high. That gives him a career total of four weekly honors, while he was also named U.S. Army Scholar-Athlete of the Month in November (Waldhart won six of the 11 races in which he swam during November and was runner-up in two others). At the end of the season, he was selected to the Academic Winter All-Horizon League team and the *ESPN The Magazine* Second Team Academic All-District for the second-straight season.

YOUNG GUNS:

Youth was served for Milwaukee last season, as several newcomers recorded numerous individual victories on the year. The freshmen class was definitely a solid contributor for UWM, accounting for 22 individual victories on the season. **Kyle Trelka** led the way with six, **Jordan Diel** and **Sam Keele** each had four, **Evan Green** and **Nolan Sinkler** posted three wins, **Nathan Rahe** accounted for two and **Shane Conner** one on the diving board.

The records just kept falling in front of the home crowd for both Milwaukee swimming & diving teams at the 2009 Horizon League Championships held in Brown Deer, Wis. In the end, 41 school marks fell with the women placing second and the men finishing in third place.

Several highlights led the way for the Panthers, including a pair of league titles from **Danielle Wenger** and **Sarah Wardecke**. In addition to that, **Molly Finn** also pulled off an unprecedented feat and **Ashley Hall** and **Kelsey George** ended up with a title apiece on the diving boards.

Wenger had a memorable week, repeating as the champion in the 1000 and 1650 freestyles in record-breaking fashion. She set new Horizon League records in both of her victories and also established a new school record in the 500 freestyle, placing second. She went on to become the second-ever UWM swimmer to earn Horizon League Female Swimming & Diving Athlete of the Year.

Despite competing in her first-ever league meet, Wardecke became the third Milwaukee freshman to capture two league titles (Wenger and Molly Finn were the others), winning the 100 and 200 breaststroke in league-record fashion despite swimming in the races on just six occasions during the course of the regular season.

Molly Finn had a great week, topping it with her fourth-consecutive league title in the 200 butterfly in a new school and league-record time. She became just the sixth athlete in league history to win conference titles four times in the same event (and the first-ever Panther), setting a new league record in the process. Finn also placed second in the 200 IM and third in the 100 fly at the championships, setting another school record in the 200 IM.

Bailey Nennig also contributed heavily with a solid week, earning second-team all-league honors in the 400 IM (setting



a school record in the preliminaries) and taking third in both the 200 IM and 200 breaststroke.

Hall (3-m winner) and George (1-m champion) shared Horizon League Diver of the Meet honors. The women's squad dominated the league meet, placing four divers in the top six on both boards, helping **Todd Hill** to his fourth diving coach of the year honor in the past five seasons.

The relay teams were nothing short of amazing, as each and every one of them set a new school record during the meet. Four of the teams took third, while the 400 freestyle relay squad of Heidi Niespodzany, Bailey Nennig, Wenger and Wardecke earned second team all-league honors.

On the men's side, UWM recorded its third-straight third-place effort, finishing just 56 points behind league champ UIC.

Jake Kalinowski had a record-breaking week, setting new school records in the 50, 100 and 200 freestyle while claiming the league championship in the 50 free. He actually broke the Horizon League record on the 200 free relay leadoff, only to see that mark get bettered in the prelims of the actual race. He placed fourth in both the 100 and 200 free.

Jeremy Waldhart earned second team all-league honors in the 200 backstroke, setting a new school record in the preliminaries of the race. He also took fourth in the 400 IM with a new school-record time as well.

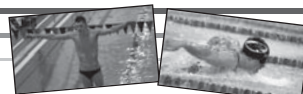
Other top finishers for the Panthers included **Dan Heraly** (fourth in the 1000 and seventh in the 500 free), **Jordan Diel** (third in the 100 butterfly with a school record), **Kyle Trelka** (third in the 100 backstroke, with a new school record in the preliminaries), **Nathan Rahe** (fifth in the 200 IM) and **Sam Keele** (sixth in both breaststroke events). **Jake Koll** led the divers with a fifth-place showing on both boards. The men's relays were just as impressive, breaking each school record as well.

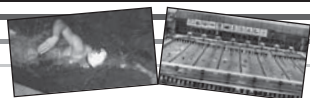

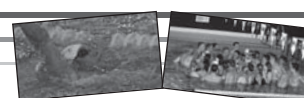

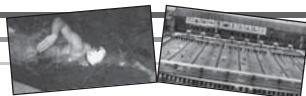
Milwaukee, The Genuine American City, is steeped in tradition and history, alive in growth and development. From the sparkling clean water of Lake Michigan, to the rich heritage of our ethnic neighborhoods, Milwaukee invites you to discover its unique, diverse community.

Heralded as "The City of Festivals," Milwaukee hosts more than 15 annual festivals, including the world's largest music festival, Summerfest, and over a dozen ethnic festivals all held along Milwaukee's spectacular lakefront.

The RiverWalk, which meanders through the heart of downtown, recently received a \$13 million facelift, and development continues to the north and south. Fine food, cultural venues, eclectic shops, exciting nightlife and a wide array of distinctive sports bars are located along the RiverWalk. Also prevalent along the RiverWalk are many brewpubs and microbreweries. Gondolas and water taxis frequently travel Milwaukee's scenic RiverWalk area.

The Historic Third Ward is quickly becoming the "off-Broadway" of Milwaukee's arts scene. It is home to the new Broadway Theatre Center as well as another, smaller, experimental theatre. In addition, this restored warehouse district features a number of art galleries, the well-regarded Milwaukee Institute of Art and Design, coffee houses, cafes, and antique stores. An abundance of new housing in the form of loft-style apartments and condominiums are also becoming a part of the landscape in the Historic Third Ward.

Milwaukee's museum scene is also active. The Milwaukee Art Museum has wrapped up a \$100 million expansion featuring a dramatic wing-like sculpture rising high above Milwaukee's lakefront. The Milwaukee Public Museum is in the midst of a \$6.5 million project establishing a permanent interpretation of "Butterflies Alive!," the museum's most successful exhibit ever. The Milwaukee County Zoo is well-known as one of the finest in the nation.





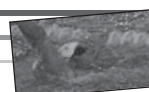
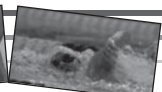
Milwaukee also loves its sports. The city put its stamp on Major League Baseball with the arrival of Miller Park in the spring of 2001. The \$400 million, one-of-a-kind ballpark features a convertible roof and natural grass. Offering the finest in ballpark amenities, Miller Park is a park within a park - that is, it includes places to tailgate along the Menomonee River, a sports-themed restaurant, and an elegantly finished restaurant, the Metavante Club. Miller Park also played host the Major League All-Star Game in 2002.

Two of the city's other professional sports teams, including the NBA's Milwaukee Bucks, play at the downtown Bradley Center. In addition, the U.S. Cellular Arena downtown is now the home of the UWM men's basketball team, as well as the Milwaukee Wave of the Major Indoor Soccer League. The arena has undergone major renovations and also hosts a number of concerts and other special events.

The Milwaukee Mile, an auto racing track located at State Fair Park, is home to a NASCAR Busch Series and an Indy Racing League event, added just this year. Plus, the sports landscape also includes an annual PGA event and one of the best county park systems in the nation.

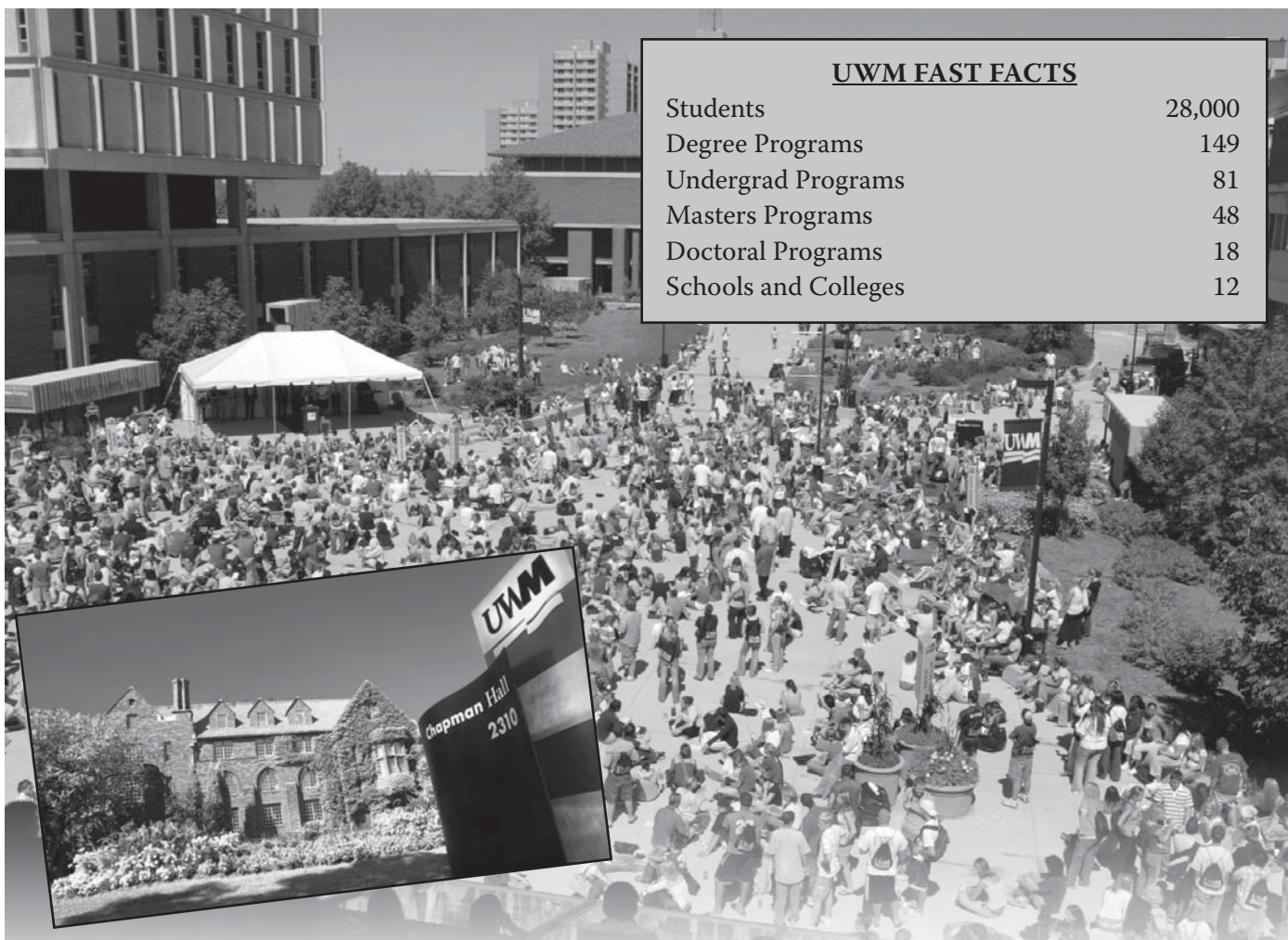

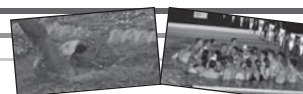
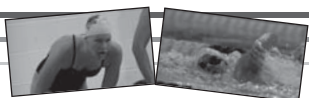
65 percent of alumni remain in Southeastern Wisconsin and

include many of Milwaukee's business, cultural and community leaders. More than 100,000 UWM grads live in all 50 states and abroad.

Among UWM's many distinguished graduates are Golda Meir (Education '17), the former prime minister of Israel, for whom the UWM library is named. Other distinguished grads include Ben Marcus, founder of the Marcus Corporation, and Robert A. Uihlein Jr., the former president, chairman and CEO of Schlitz Brewing

Notable graduates in the sports world include the late NAS-CAR champion Alan Kulwicki (Mechanical Engineering '77) and former NFL All-Pro defensive back Mike Reinfeldt (Business '75), vice president and chief financial officer of the Seattle Seahawks of the National Football League. Reinfeldt previously worked for the Green Bay Packers. NFL referee Bill Carollo, who officiated the 2003 Super Bowl, is also a UWM grad.

U.S. World Cup standout and Major League Soccer star Tony Sanneh also attended UWM, as did Illinois men's basketball coach Bruce Weber.





Carlos Santiago
Chancellor



Carlos E. Santiago is beginning his sixth academic year as the Chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

Santiago is UWM's seventh Chancellor. In this position, he is the chief administrative officer of the university and a partner with a great number of constituents on and off campus.

Chancellor Santiago also holds the academic rank of Professor of Economics at UWM. As a labor economist, he has regional expertise in the Caribbean and Central America, with special emphasis on Puerto Rico.

Cooperation and collaboration to strengthen UW-Milwaukee's research portfolio, academic excellence and diversity have been the highest priorities of Chancellor Santiago since his arrival on July 1, 2004. Among the primary results that UWM has achieved during his tenure:

- Securing a historic reinvestment by the State of Wisconsin in the university's and Southeastern Wisconsin's future, especially in the targeted areas of advanced automation, biomedical engineering, health care and freshwater science.
- Completing the record-setting Campaign for UWM, the most ambitious fund-raising effort in university history.
- Developing Access to Success, the campus blueprint to enhance access to higher education while promoting greater success for all students.
- Initiating a master planning process to create a template for regional growth away from the university's extremely compressed primary campus.
- Creating the UWM Research Foundation to support research and innovation, and the UWM Real Estate Foundation to partner with the public and private sectors to develop and hold real estate for the university's benefit.

Rita Cheng is the Provost and Vice Chancellor at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, a position she has held since April 2005. Cheng joined UWM in 1988 as an assistant professor of accounting in the School of Business Administration. Within the School of Business Administration, she held the title of A.O. Smith Professor of Accounting, first as an associate professor from 1994 to 2002 and then as a professor from 2002 to 2004. She also served as Special Assistant to the School of Business Dean for Affirmative Action from 1994 to 2003. She has also served the university in several high-level administrative capacities in recent years. She was the Interim Dean of the School of Continuing Education in 2004 and 2005, Associate Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs from 2002 to 2005 and Associate Dean of the School of Business Administration from 1998 to 2003. She holds a bachelor's degree from Bishop's University in Quebec, an MBA from the University of Rhode Island and a Ph.D. from Temple University. Cheng has also been actively involved with the athletic department throughout her career, serving as faculty athletics representative from 1996-2004, while also being a regular in the stands at most Panther events.



Santiago also has a strong background in working with athletics.

With the University at Albany, State University of New York, where he held the position of Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs, Santiago was a member of its National Collegiate Athletic Association Certification Steering Committee, worked closely with the athletics department on academics and admissions-related issues, and was involved with the New York Giants annual National Football League summer training camp held at the University at Albany.

"Universities must focus on creating the scholar-athlete," Chancellor Santiago said. "Winning is nice, but first and foremost you must focus on the academics. UWM's consistent performance -- in both winning championships and placing leading numbers of students on the Horizon League's Academic Honor Roll -- demonstrates our commitment to both of these objectives."

Dr. Santiago is the author or co-author of five books focusing on labor and economic development issues, with the latest being "Puerto Ricans in the United States: A Contemporary Portrait," co-authored with Edna Acosta-Belén. He has co-edited another book and has published more than 30 articles and book reviews in a wide variety of scholarly journals. Along with Dr. Acosta-Belén, Dr. Santiago also is a founding co-editor of the Latino Research Review and was a member of the U.S. Congressional Hispanic Caucus International Relations Advisory Group.

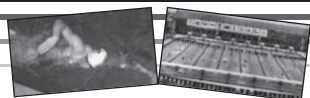
Dr. Santiago's wife, Azara Santiago-Rivera, is also part of the faculty at UWM. She is an associate professor of educational psychology in the School of Education.

Chancellor Santiago has a Ph.D. in economics from Cornell University ('82) and M.A. degrees in economics from Cornell University ('79) and the University of Puerto Rico ('75).

Like most other boys growing up in Puerto Rico, Dr. Santiago played baseball year-round and aspired to follow national heroes Roberto Clemente and Orlando Cepeda to Major League Baseball. Dr. Santiago played third base throughout high school and earned a place on his division's all-star team.

In recent years, his sporting interests have included golf, tennis, downhill skiing, walking and jogging. He also helped coach softball teams for his daughters.

Jim Hill is the Vice Chancellor of Student Affairs at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. The athletic department is part of the Division of Student Affairs. Hill has served at UWM for over two decades. Since 1996, he has been dean of students. Prior to that, he was associate dean of student affairs from 1990 to 1996 and associate director of student financial aid from 1987 to 1990. Before coming to Milwaukee, Hill was the coordinator of financial at the University of Missouri-Kansas City from 1975 to 1987. He holds a bachelor's degree from Central Missouri State and both his master's and doctorate from UMKC.





George Koonce is the new Director of Athletics at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

Koonce comes to UWM from Marquette University, where he served as a Senior Associate Athletic Director.

He was named to the post on March 17 and officially took over in mid-April.

Koonce spent nine seasons as a player in the National Football League, eight of those coming as a starter with the Green Bay Packers. While in Green Bay, he helped the Packers win their first Super Bowl championship in 29 years.

He also spent a season as a player with the Seattle Seahawks before working as the special assistant to the athletic director at East Carolina University and as the director of player development with the Packers.

In his most recent position at Marquette, Koonce was primarily involved with fundraising, community relations and student welfare. He also served as the sport administrator for the women's soccer program.

"I have every confidence that the experience and familiarity George Koonce has with Milwaukee and Wisconsin fans will greatly benefit the UWM Panthers," UWM Chancellor Carlos Santiago said when announcing the hiring of Koonce. "His energy and enthusiasm will further elevate a strong program built by outgoing director Bud Haidet and his excellent staff."

"I am humbled and thankful for the opportunity to lead an athletic program that has the background and tradition this program has," Koonce said. "This is a great opportunity for me and my family, but with opportunity comes accountability and responsibility. I welcome the challenge of doing my part to help not only the athletic department but the University as a whole. I truly believe in athletics being integrated into the University and in the University becoming an active part of the athletic program. I think it is a perfect fit and I am eager to get started."

Koonce's wide-ranging experiences include a stint as the director of player development in Green Bay. In that role, he assisted players in adjusting to life on and off the field in the NFL.

After a successful college football career at East Carolina,

Koonce returned to the school as the special assistant to the athletic director in December of 2003. While at ECU, he was extensively involved in special fundraising projects, including raising \$1 million for the basketball program and over \$5 million for football practice facilities, meeting rooms and renovations of the academic center.

He also earned a master's degree in sports management from the school in 2006.

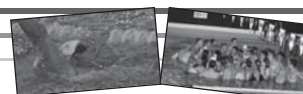
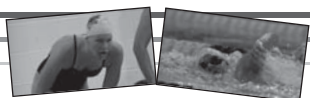
His variety of experiences – those as a collegiate and professional athlete as well as those as a director of and resource for those athletes – has helped him hone a very succinct and direct message for the mission of the UWM athletic department under his watch.

"Our concern is the student-athlete," Koonce said. "We have to put an emphasis on making sure we have the proper resources and programs in place so they can be successful on the field and off the court. That extends into the community, where we have to make sure we not only integrate them into the campus setting but into greater Milwaukee."

Koonce's NFL career included 720 career tackles (447 solo), nine sacks, one forced fumble, five fumble recoveries and five interceptions, two of which he returned for touchdowns. In all, he played in 128 NFL games, making 118 starts between his eight years in Green Bay and one season in Seattle.

He has been widely recognized for his athletic accomplishments, earning enshrinement in four different halls of fame. Koonce was inducted into the National Junior College Hall of Fame in 2000 before also earning a place in the East Carolina University Athletic Hall of Fame 2002, the Chowan College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003 and West Craven (NC) High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005.

Koonce is also currently pursuing his interdisciplinary Ph.D. in sports administration at Marquette.

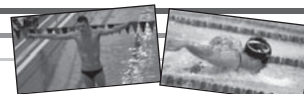
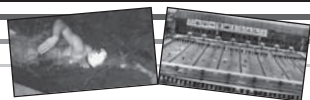

The UWM Athletic Offices are located in the Pavilion, located on the northeast corner of campus. The parking garage adjacent to the Pavilion is accessible from both Edgewood and Downer. If you enter from the garage, turn left in the Pavilion lobby and the athletic offices are on the left. If you arrive through the main entrance on the east side of the building, the athletic offices are on the right.





The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's Athletics Department is committed to enhancing the opportunities of academic, athletic and personal success of every student-athlete. A partnership has been created between the academic and athletic communities on campus to give all student-athletes an opportunity to achieve academic success.

UWM has had a full-time athletic academic advisor since 1998, reinforcing its commitment to its student-athletes' academic success. All new student-athletes meet with their advisor on an individual basis to assess specific needs. Programs for academic advancement are developed, including monitoring courses, grades and academic progress. The Academic Assistance Center, located in the new Pavilion, provides student-athletes with a quiet place to study and one-on-one tutoring opportunities. The academic center also houses a full computer lab and numerous tutoring rooms.

Tom Vollman is UWM's full-time athletic academic advisor, working closely with all student-athletes. Vollman has developed a comprehensive program for academic enhancement while also providing tutoring and support service assistance, coordinating coursework and monitoring grade reports, academic progress and degree completion requirements.



PRIORITY REGISTRATION - ACADEMIC MONITORING

Student-athletes receive priority when registering for classes. Academic advisors provide ongoing assistance with class scheduling and career planning. Progress reports from the professors of each student-athlete are sought periodically throughout the year, and academic progress is monitored regularly.

TUTORS

Individuals and group tutors are available in all subjects to student-athletes upon request. The new Pavilion has private tutoring and study rooms for student-athletes.

STRUCTURED STUDY

All freshmen are required to attend study table for eight hours per week. Students meet Monday through Thursday for two hours per night and are monitored by a member of the coaching staff. Upperclassmen with a cumulative grade point average of less than 3.0 are also required to attend, however their hours are pro-rated based on their GPA.

POST-GRADUATE OPPORTUNITIES

UWM boasts a 95 percent job placement rate through the on-campus Career Development Center. Approximately 200 employers interview on-campus each year. Workshops are offered to assist student-athletes in planning their career paths. Numerous internships and job opportunities are available in the metro Milwaukee area, the business and economic center of Wisconsin.

UWM is a member of the NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills Program. The mission of the NCAA and UWM is to maintain intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the campus educational program and the student-athlete as an integral part of the student body. With this in mind, the UWM program, "SUCCESS," was created to support student-athlete development and to enhance the quality of the student-athlete experience within the university setting.

The life skills program includes five major commitments:

- **Commitment to Academic Excellence** – support academic progress toward intellectual development and graduation
- **Commitment to Athletic Excellence** – build philosophical foundations for the development of athletic programs that are broad-based, equitable and dedicated to the well-being of the student-athlete.
- **Commitment to Personal Development** – support the development of a well-balanced lifestyle, encouraging emotional well-being, personal growth and decision-making skills
- **Commitment to Career Development** – encourage the student-athlete to develop and pursue career and life goals
- **Commitment to Service** – engage the student-athlete in service to his/her campus and surrounding communities

STUDENT-ATHLETE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

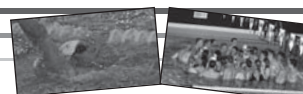
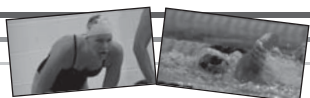
The UWM Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) is composed of current Panther student-athletes. It is assembled to provide insight into the student-athlete experience by promoting, fostering, designing and implementing programs that encourage academic achievement, professional development, health-conscious life choices and social responsibility.

The UWM SAAC is committed to the following initiatives:

- Providing student-athletes with the opportunity to effectively communicate with the department administration and offer suggestions to enhance the quality of the student-athlete experience
- Promoting effective communication among coaches, the department administration and student-athletes
- Promoting an awareness of UWM Athletics throughout the campus and the Greater Milwaukee area
- Reviewing NCAA legislative proposals and make recommendations to the department administration

SAAC members serve as liaisons between student-athletes, the athletic administration and the campus community. Athletes are encouraged to communicate concerns and ideas to their captains and/or for discussion at scheduled committee meetings.

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee has moved itself into a prominent position both regionally and nationally in the world of intercollegiate athletics.

In fact, UWM has consistently shown it is the top athletic program in the Horizon League. The school has won the league's McCafferty Trophy five times in the last nine years, including a stretch of three-straight victories from 2003-04 to 2005-06. UWM has also won the women's all-sports awards eight times and the men's all-sports award three times.

The 2008-09 was another banner one for Panther sports, with the year capped by the claiming of another McCafferty Trophy. In the fall, UWM's volleyball and women's soccer teams each won Horizon League regular season and tournament titles, with both squads advancing to the NCAA Tournament. Then, later in the year, the men's track and field team captured both the indoor and outdoor league titles. Plus, the women's track and field won the indoor team title, bringing to 33 the number of team track titles UWM has won since 1998. The women's cross country and women's swimming and diving teams each captured second-place finishes.

But the 2008-09 season was far from the first successful one for Panther athletics. In 2007-08, UWM captured four league team titles and three second-place finishes. The women's soccer and volleyball squads each won regular season crowns while the men's track and field team again swept the indoor and outdoor titles.

In 2006-07, UWM teams won seven league titles while a number of individuals also claimed league crowns. The success started in the fall as both the women's soccer and women's volleyball teams won the league regular season crown, with the volleyball squad also

capturing the league tourney title.

In 2005-06, UWM saw both of its soccer teams win league titles and advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, while the men's and women's bas-

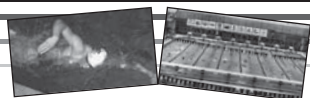


ketball teams also played in the NCAA Tourney. The men again caught the eyes of the nation with a win over Oklahoma in the first round before being eliminated by eventual national champion Florida in the second round.

The men's basketball team also helped put UWM athletics on the national map in 2004-05. UWM pulled off upset wins over Alabama and Boston College to advance to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The Panthers were eventually eliminated from the tournament by national runner-up Illinois, but UWM had already captured the hearts and minds of the nation's college basketball fans.

UWM student-athletes have also become known for their work in the classroom. This past spring, 81 student-athletes were named to the Horizon League Academic Honor Roll. UWM student-athletes also regularly appear on the league's academic all-league teams and the cumulative grade-point average for the athletic department consistently is above 3.0, with a 3.119 cumulative GPA the mark as of this past June.

Quality facilities are also a part of the





athletic scene at UWM. The Pavilion, an addition to the Klotsche Center, opened in January of 2006 and houses all of the athletics offices, as well as locker rooms, team rooms, training rooms, weight rooms and an academic center. The facility rates as one of the best athletic office and workout facilities in the Horizon League.



The project also included a renovation of the 5,000-seat Klotsche Center, which is home to the women's volleyball, women's basketball and track and field teams. The facility now has air conditioning and a new sound system, as well as two new concession stands. Plus, with it standing adjacent to the new Pavilion, fans attending events can park in the Pavilion's new parking garage and attend events without ever stepping outside. The swimming and diving teams have their own pool in the Klotsche Center, located on the lower level.

UWM's men's basketball team has played at the U.S. Cellular Arena in downtown Milwaukee since the 2003 Horizon League Tournament. The move downtown has been a successful one, with attendance records set each season the Panthers have played in the historic building.

Meanwhile, UWM's other recent facility improvements have come at the soccer and baseball fields. On-campus Engelmann Field, home of the Panther soccer teams, is reknowned to be one

of the best collegiate soccer facilities in the country. Lights were been added to the field two summers ago, and a new team room has also been developed. The baseball team plays at Henry Aaron Field and also plays a doubleheader annually at Miller Park. Extensive work on the field, fencing and dugouts has been completed over the last few years, with a new scoreboard added to the facility in 2008.

Athletics has a long history at UWM. Some sports records date back to the late 1800's and UWM fielded a football team until 1974. UWM has played on all levels of NCAA competition, including stints as a Division II and Division III institution along with its current run in Division I.

The school's athletic teams have also competed in the Wisconsin state school league for a number of years, while competing in the Mid-Continent Conference and Midwestern Collegiate Conference/Horizon League since moving all of its varsity sports to Division I in the fall of 1990.

UWM has 15 varsity athletic teams and offers its prospective student-athletes aid in the form of athletic scholarships. Full and partial scholarships are available in all 15 varsity sports. Full scholarships include the cost of room and board, in addition to tuition and books. Scholarships are based on athletic ability and academic success.

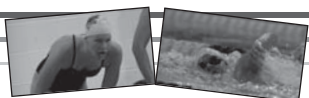

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's newest on-campus building is the Pavilion, which is the home to UWM Athletics.

The Pavilion officially opened its doors to the public in January of 2006 and the building was officially dedicated by Wisconsin Governor Jim Doyle and UWM Chancellor Carlos Santiago on May 2.

Among the new athletics facilities in the building specifically are offices for coaches and staff, a student-athlete-only weight room, new locker rooms for all teams and team rooms and lounges for men's basketball, women's basketball and women's volleyball.



UWM student-athletes are also benefitting from the brand-new sports medicine center in the Pavilion, which more than triples the previous space available for UWM's athletic trainers. The facility also includes a 2,800-square-foot academic assistance center to help student-athletes in the classroom. The new academic center includes a computer lab along with group and individual study and tutoring rooms. A 618-space indoor parking garage is also part of the facility.

UWM's general student population is also benefitting tremendously from the new facility. A new fitness center has expansive rooms for cardio workouts, as well as a weight room. The state-of-the-art area is the most visible from the outside of the facility, as it features two levels of windows.



The recreation center has two expansive levels and houses four sport courts surrounded by a suspended 1/8 mile track. The facility is utilized by individuals seeking open gym space, run and walk space on the track, and the University's intramural programs.

The building also includes academic facilities for the College of Health Sciences along with accommodations for the new Physical Therapy and expanded Sports Medicine programs.

The \$40 million project, which broke ground in June of 2003, came in below budget due to a favorable bidding climate. Half of the funding is coming from UWM parking fees, while the other half is from state funds and student segregated fees. The athletic department has also undertaken a variety of fundraising efforts for even larger enhancements within its space in the facility.

The most distinctive feature of the 135,000-gross-square-foot Pavilion is the extensive use of glass "walls," creating a feeling of openness and allowing expansive views of nearby Downer Woods and the campus.

Architects for the project were Venture Architects of Milwaukee, a joint venture of Kahler Slater Architects and the Zimmerman Design Group. They emphasize that placement and tinting of windows, called "cool daylighting," not only allows a wash of daylight inside while reducing energy needs.



Taking care of Sports Medicine issues for the student-athletes is UWM's Athletic Training Staff. The licensed and certified athletic training staff includes Director of Sports Medicine **John Ochsenwald** and Assistant Athletic Trainers Becky Worman, Renee Manofsky, Chad Henneberry, Dave Bugalski and Dave Lake.

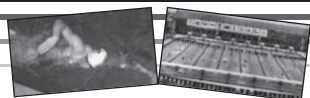
The entire staff is involved in the education of over 40 undergraduate athletic training students. In conjunction with the Department of Human Movement Sciences, these students are working and studying to become certified athletic trainers in the nationally-accredited Athletic Training Education Program, which is spearheaded by Curriculum Director Dr. Jen Earl and assisted by Dr. Stephen Cobb and Dr. Kyle Ebersole. The undergraduate students accrue valuable experiences while assisting the certified athletic training staff in the day-to-day care of student-athletes sports-medicine needs.



Steve Felde has been with University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee since 2006, starting as an assistant strength coach and moving into the director of strength and conditioning position in 2007. He works mainly with men's and women's basketball, baseball, men's and women's soccer and volleyball teams. Before joining UWM, he was a volunteer assistant strength coach at the University of Minnesota, where he assisted the director of strength and conditioning with men's basketball, baseball, football, men's and women's hockey and wrestling. Prior to Minnesota, Felde was intern at Concordia University of Wisconsin where he worked with men's basketball, baseball, football, wrestling and women's soccer.

He earned his bachelor's of science degree in athletic training and exercise leadership from Concordia University of Wisconsin. He is currently earning his Masters degree in sports management from the United States Sports Academy. Felde is a certified strength and conditioning specialist through the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA) and is a certified Club Coach through USA Weightlifting (USAW).

Felde a native of Milwaukee resides in Grafton, Wis., with his wife, Wendie, and their black lab Connor.





Entering its 31st season of operation in the 2009-10 academic year, the Horizon League continues to aspire toward its goal of being one of the nation's leading athletics conferences while being recognized as a leader in the development of student-athletes as leaders and role models.



The Horizon League membership features ten public and private institutions that have impressive academic reputations and a storied tradition of broad-based athletic programs. Current membership includes Butler University, Cleveland State University, the University of Detroit Mercy, the University of Illinois at Chicago, Loyola University Chicago, Valparaiso University, the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Wright State University and Youngstown State University.

The Horizon League's primary focus is on adding value to the educational experience through its four platforms: athletic performance, academic achievement, community outreach, and personal responsibility and accountability. It is the League's belief that athletics is a powerful and visible resource tool that can be used to enhance student-athletes' collegiate experience. The Horizon League's goals are to enhance the holistic university experience for the student-athlete, to create an affiliation of institutions with similar athletic goals, and to adhere to the principals of integrity, diversity, excellence and growth.

The Horizon League sponsors competition in 19 sports – nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and tennis) and ten for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis and volleyball).

The league receives automatic bids to NCAA championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball.

The Horizon League is headquartered in Indianapolis, the "Amateur Sports Capital of the World," with offices in the Pan American Plaza (201 S. Capitol Avenue), located a block from Lucas Oil Stadium and just minutes from Consco Fieldhouse, the State Capitol Building, Victory Field (home of the Indianapolis Indians) and the NCAA national office.

HISTORY

Founded on June 16, 1979, as the Midwestern City Conference with six charter members, the League changed its name to the Midwestern Collegiate Conference in 1985 and added women's sports for the 1986-87 academic year. Charter members of the conference included current members Butler and Loyola as well as the University of Evansville, Oklahoma City University, Oral Roberts University and Xavier University. Among other current members, Detroit joined in 1980, and Cleveland State, UIC, Green Bay, Milwaukee and Wright State came aboard in 1994 in the largest non-merger conference expansion in history, with Youngstown State joining in 2001 and Valparaiso in 2007.

On June 4, 2001, the Horizon League unveiled its current name and ushered in a new dynamic direction that has brought the League closer to its stated goal of being one of the nation's top ten conferences with a focus on enhancing the student-athletes experience by upgrading the League's market and competitive positions.

ATHLETIC SUCCESS

In the past few years, the Horizon League has enjoyed unprecedented success on the national stage, highlighted by three Sweet Sixteen appearances (Butler 2003, 2007; Milwaukee 2005) and nine wins in the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship in the past seven seasons.

In other sports, league teams have won at least one game in their respective NCAA Championships each of the last seven seasons in men's soccer (Milwaukee 2002-05, UIC 2006-08), with UIC just one win away from the College Cup in 2007. In softball, league teams won a game in the national tournament four straight years earlier in the decade (UIC 2002, 2004; Wright State 2003; Green Bay 2005) while advancing into the second round in women's soccer three of the last five seasons (Detroit 2004, Milwaukee 2005-06).

Green Bay's women's basketball team added to that résumé with a victory in the 2007 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship. Butler's Victoria Mitchell became the League's first NCAA individual champion when she won the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the 2005 NCAA Outdoor

Track and Field Championships.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Horizon League student-athletes also excel in the classroom as more than 500 have been named to the Academic Honor Roll each of the past seven semesters for carrying a grade-point average of 3.2 or better, including more than 600 for the last four semesters. Twenty-five student-athletes were named to *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-District teams in 2008-09, while eight earned Academic All-America honors.

DEMOGRAPHICS

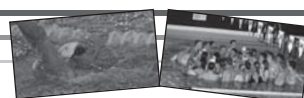
Horizon League institutions boast a combined enrollment of more than 130,000 plus nearly a quarter-million living alumni centered in the League's Midwest footprint. League media markets include five of the nation's top 35 in Chicago, Detroit, Cleveland, Indianapolis and Milwaukee, covering more than ten million television households and encompassing more than nine percent of the nation's television audience.

McCAFFERTY TROPHY

The Horizon League annually awards the McCafferty Trophy in recognition of its all-sports champion in honor of its first commissioner, James J. McCafferty. Milwaukee won its fifth McCafferty Trophy in school history following the 2008-09 academic year. The Panthers also captured their eighth Women's All-Sports Award.

HORIZON LEAGUE NETWORK

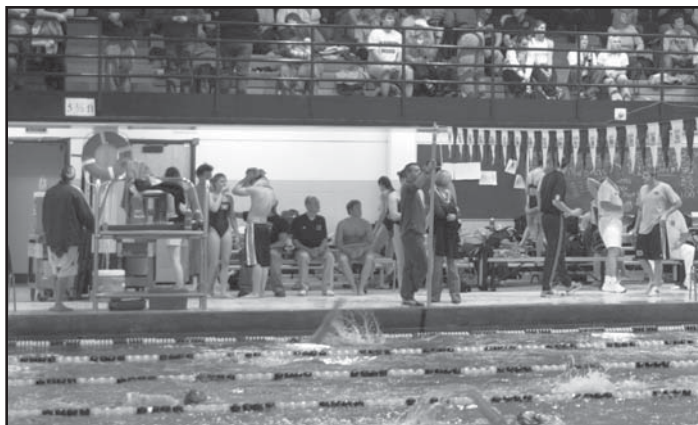
The Horizon League is a recognized leader in video streaming, through the Horizon League Network (HLN), having produced more than 1,200 free, live events in the past four years. HLN also features vignettes of all 19 League championships, weekly highlight videos during the men's and women's basketball season and other special programming.





Klotsche Natatorium

The Home of Panther Swimming & Diving



Erected in 1977, the Klotsche Center has undergone numerous renovations to help keep it a top-notch facility. The latest renovation project added new office space for the department of athletics, locker rooms and weight rooms, a practice gymnasium and new athletic training facilities. The project, called the Pavilion, was completed in January 2006.

The arena area was renovated prior to the 1998-99 school year. The \$2 million project including the addition of comfort and chairback seating. In 1996, new wood flooring and a new indoor track were added to the Klotsche Center. The floor has been renovated recently with the addition of the new Horizon League logo. Also, the addition of the new Panther and UWM logos was completed in the summer of 1999.

The Klotsche Center can hold as many as 5,000 spectators for a sporting event. The largest crowd to ever see a sporting event at the Klotsche Center is 5,015, present when the UWM men's basketball team faced Butler in January of 2003.



The Klotsche Center is used as a practice facility for most of UWM's varsity sports, and serves as the homecourt for volleyball and men's and women's basketball. A four-lane indoor track, added in 1996, is home to the UWM men's and women's track and field teams, and the Klotsche Natatorium, located on the lower level, is home to the UWM swimming and diving teams.

The Klotsche Center has been home to a number of major sporting events, including the 1999 MCC Indoor Track and Field Championships, the 2001 Horizon League Women's Volleyball Championship and the 2001 WIAA Boys' and Girls' Sectional Basketball Championships. The Horizon League Track and Field Championships were in Milwaukee in the spring of 2003 and the league's women's basketball tournament was played in the Klotsche Center during the 2003-04 season.



In 2002, the Klotsche Center played host to a game involving the Yugoslavian National Basketball team and NBA superstar Vlade Divac. The team wound up winning the World Basketball Championships. The arena also played host to an appearance by President George W. Bush late in the year.

The Klotsche Center is also home to UWM's intramural program and recreation center. It features a 25-meter pool, racquetball courts, weight rooms, training rooms and classrooms for instructional use, along with upstairs office space.
