PANTHER COACHES

Pete Corfeld **Head Coach** **18th Year**

UW-Milwaukee, '86 • Cross Country, Distance, Middle Distance

In his 18th season as the head men's and women's cross country and track & field coach, Pete Corfeld continues to make his mark as one of the most successful coaches the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee has ever seen.

"Pete has done a tremendous job of building his program so that it is at the top of the Horizon League year in and year out," UWM AD Bud Haidet said. "He's our longest-tenured coach and we are fortunate to keep him and see his program continue to succeed."



He added the 25th, 26th and 27th league titles to the Panther trophy case last year as the men swept the indoor and outdoor championships for the second-straight season. The women won their indoor meet for the first time since 2003 after second-place finishes the two years prior. Corfeld was also honored with three coach of the year awards, giving him 26 such honors since coming to UWM.

The Panthers have established themselves as the premier track and field program in the Horizon League under Corfeld. The Milwaukee men have won eight indoor titles in the last nine years, including five straight from 1997-2001. Outdoors, the Panthers claimed league titles from 1998-2002 before winning each of the last three.

Not to be outdone, the women annually finish among the league leaders come championship time. They have won titles

NCAA Qualifiers Under Corfeld

both indoors and outdoors in 2001 and 2003. They also laid claim to an indoor championship in 2000 and again last season after winning outdoors in 1998 and 2002.

UWM's men have also posted a pair of second-place finishes to accompany 16 indoor and outdoor titles. With the exception of the 2003 seasons, Milwaukee has not finished below second since 1995.



The Panther women, meanwhile, have finished first or second in all eight seasons of the Horizon League's indoor meet and have finished below second at either meet just once (third at 2002 outdoor) since 1996.

In sweeping the 2005 men's championships, the Panthers set league records at both meets for points and margin of victory. Indoors, UWM finished with 197 points, 109 better than second place (88). It then did itself one better at the outdoor meet, scoring 231 points, 120 points over the runner up (111).

Meanwhile, the women posted second-place finishes at both meets. The Panther women have finished first or second in all eight seasons of the Horizon League's indoor meet and have finished below second at either meet just once (third at 2002 outdoor) since 1996.

In 2001, UWM became the first school in league history to win all four league crowns.

Corfeld works primarily with the middle distance and distance groups in addition to the cross country squads. UWM has had one of the nation's top 4x800m relays. In 2005, the quartet was ranked 10th in the nation with its school-record time of 7:26.17.

Individually, Angie Huebner was named the 2005 Horizon League Track Newcomer of the Year at the outdoor league meet and won the 2006 league indoor 5000m title. Jeremy Majors has qualified for the NCAA Regionals in the 800m in each of the last two years.

Corfeld's cross country program has produced 44 all-league performers since the Panthers entered a conference for the 1992 season. He has also coached two individual champions and two Newcomer of the Year honorees.

In the fall, the Milwaukee women had three runners earn all-

league honors for the first time in school history.

Despite not winning a cross country championship since leaving the Mid-Continent Conference, UWM has continually performed in the upper half of the league standings. After winning a women's crown in 1992 and both the men's and women's championships in 1993, Milwaukee has boasted a pair of men's league individual champions while rarely finishing below fourth.

Corfeld, the longest tenured coach currently at UWM, has built well-respected track and field and cross country teams that consistently compete with other schools across the league, region and country.

Under his direction, four different student-athletes have qualified for the NCAA Championships, with Tim Kenney, Cory Peterson and Angie Molter all competing at the NCAA Track and Field Championships, while Chad Zehms was a qualifier in the NCAA Cross Country Championships in 1995. Peterson would later make two more appearances in the NCAA Championships, along with qualifying for the U.S. Olympic Trials in the 800m run in 1996 and placing third in the 800m at the USATF Indoor Championships. Molter was the first UWM female to compete in the NCAA Championships, running the 10,000m in 1996.

Also, last year Josh Nygren earned the Horizon League's prestigious Coleman Medal of Honor. He is the program's third recipient of the honor after Paul McGinley in 2000 and Jonathon Manke in 2002.

Corfeld's coaching career began in 1983, when he was the head track and field coach at Milwaukee Area Technical College. At MATC, he was named Region XIII and conference coach of the year three times. Corfeld graduated from UWM in 1986 with a bachelor's degree in science. He was named assistant coach for sprints, hurdles and relays at the University of Northern Colorado, where he also worked on a master's degree. In 1989, after completing his degree, he was named the head cross country and track and field coach at UWM. Since taking over the Panther track program, Corfeld has helped to elevate UWM to a regional and national program.

Corfeld and his wife, Linda, reside in Whitefish Bay, Wis.

PANTHER COACHES

Jason Francis Assistant 3rd Year

Indiana, '01 • Sprints, Hurdles, Pole Vault, Multi-Events

Jason Francis enters his third season as an assistant track and field coach at UWM. Francis works with the sprints, hurdles, high jump, pole vault and multi-events.

"We are pleased to have Jason in our program," Corfeld said. "He is a track guy, so he really knows his stuff. With his multi-event background, he has knowledge in all areas of track and field, especially the pole vault."



Last season, Milwaukee won 19 league men's and women's indoor and outdoor league titles over his events. Joy VanLaanen also cleared an NCAA Provisional height in the pole vault and reset the school record in the event by almost 10 inches. Jenni Saarinen broke both of the Panthers' multi-event records and was league field newcomer of the year both indoors and outdoors.



In his first season with UWM, the team broke five league records and seven school marks during the 2005 season.

A 2001 graduate of Indiana State University, Francis spent the 2003-04 season as a volunteer assistant pole vault coach at Lewis University in Romeoville, Ill.

In his only season with the Flyers, Francis produced both the indoor and outdoor Division II National Champion and two more All-Americans in the event at both meets. He

joined the Lewis staff upon completion of his masters degree in exercise science from Indiana State in 2003. In 2002-03 Francis volunteered with the Sycamore track team, coaching five athletes to top-six finishes at the league meet in the pole vault.

Francis' affiliation with Indiana State began as a student-athlete, as he competed in the pole vault and decathlon. Four times he was named to the all-conference team, including in 2001, when he won the outdoor conference championship in the decathlon. A Downers Grove, Ill., native, Francis began at DuPage Junior College after a standout prep career at Downers Grove North High School.

Francis is USATF Level II certified in jumping events, sprints, hurdles, relays and combined events.

Stefan Rüdiger Assistant 4th Year

Potsdam (Germany) • Jumps, Throws

Stefan Rüdiger is in his fourth season as an assistant coach for the UWM track and field team. Rüdiger works with the Panther throwers, as well as the triple and long jumpers.

"Stefan has brought an extensive knowledge of track and field to our program," Corfeld said. "His understanding of the sport continues to enhance our throws and jumps. He has also enhanced the level of expectations for UWM athletes."



In three years with the Milwaukee program, Rüdiger has coached 19 individual league champions and three regional qualifiers over the jumping and throwing events. Last season, Milwaukee claimed titles in seven jumping and throwing events, including the outdoor men's long and triple jumps, where UWM occupied five of the six scoring places at the league meet.

Jenni Saarinen also broke the school outdoor long jump record and was one of three freshmen to crack the school's top-10 in the outdoor triple jump.

Throwers Nick Gretz (shot put/discus) and Nick Wichert (hammer) each competed at the 2005 NCAA Midwest Regional, following Nick Davis, who competed in the high jump in 2004. In addition, he has coached two league performers of the meet and seven newcomers of the year.

Rüdiger came to the United States from Germany, where he was a three-year member of the German National Team in the javelin.

The fourth-year collegiate coach has also coached four years of high school competition in his home country and most recently was in training to be a part of the German bobsled team to compete in the Olympics.

As a student at the University of Potsdam, Rüdiger worked with javelin world-record holder Uwe Hohn and Frank Moller, a competitor on the 4x400m Olympic relay at the 1988 Seoul games.

Rüdiger was a part of Germany's four-man team that placed second in the German Junior Championships in 2002 and 2003 for the bobsled. He was also a part of the four-man team that placed second at the World Junior Championships in 2003.

He received his masters degree in economics from UWM in 2004 and is currently working towards his Ph.D.



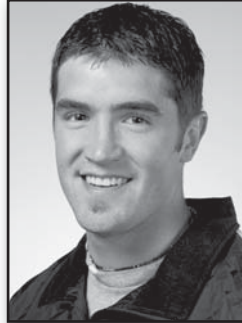
Jeremiah Snyder

1st Year

Volunteer Assistant • UW-Milwaukee

Jeremiah Snyder joins the UWM coaching staff as a volunteer assistant after a standout career that wrapped up last season.

A native of Germantown, Wis., Snyder lettered all four years for the Panthers. He competed primarily in the pole vault and won two league championships in the event, including the 2006 indoor crown. Snyder also earned all-league second team honors twice, finishing as runner up both indoors and outdoors in 2005.



Snyder holds the distinction of being one of just two Milwaukee athletes to clear 15-7 in the pole vault both indoors and outdoors. That height has him tied for second in school history outdoors and third indoors.

Snyder will likely complete his undergraduate degree from UWM in art education in May.



Nate Weiland

1st Year

Volunteer Assistant • UW-Milwaukee

Nate Weiland joined the Panther coaching staff this season as a volunteer assistant after four years as a member of Milwaukee's distance and cross country corps.

In his career, Weiland established himself as a consistent performer, earning all-league second team honors in cross country during his final two seasons. As a senior, he took 38th at the NCAA Great Lakes Regional, the third-best regional finish in team history, second only to UWM Hall of Famer Chad Zehms.



On the track, the Waunakee, Wis., native is among the school's all-time leaders in the indoor 3000m and 5000m and the outdoor 10,000m. His 10k time of 30:57.60 is fourth in school history.

Weiland ran a time of 2:32:17 at the Dallas White Rock Marathon in December. He will attempt to qualify for November's Olympic Trials at Grandma's Marathon in Duluth, Minn., in June.

An exercise and fitness major, Weiland is expected to graduate in May.

SEASON PREVIEW

Panthers Looking For Fourth-Straight League Sweep In 2007

Returning talent, depth key in adding to 16 league titles since 1997

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee men's track and field team has established itself as the top team in the league with its recent stretch of league titles and its history of success on the league level.

Milwaukee's men have swept the Horizon League's indoor and outdoor championships in each of the last three seasons. Prior to that, the group won every league crown from 1998-2001.

In all, the Panthers have taken first at 16 of the last 20 league meets, a trend that head coach Pete Corfeld expects to continue.

UWM lost just a handful of athletes to graduation, including Josh Nygren and Nate Weiland in the distance, Gabe Waggoner and Elliot Enright, half of the team's dominant 800m corps, and two of the top pole vaulters in the league in Dan Schultz and Jeremiah Snyder.

As daunting a task as that sounds, Corfeld's cupboard remains stocked with proven talent. Returning are sprinter Trentin Edwards, throwers Nick Wichert and Nick Gretz, Justin Bohler and Adam Schleis in the hurdles and an assortment of field events, jumper Darren Cole and Jeremy Majors, a two-time regional qualifier in the 800m, just to name a few.

Sprints

Edwards paces the sprints category and enters his senior season as the two-time defending league champion outdoors in both the 100m and 200m. He also has an indoor 200m title under his belt and was named the league track newcomer of the year indoors and outdoors as a sophomore and the outstanding track performer outdoors last season.

Junior Lynn Koepke and newcomers Isaiah Adams and Patrick Casey will add depth around Edwards in the sprint events. Adams attended UWM last season but did not compete. As a junior at nearby Greendale High School, he was second in the 100m, 200m and 400m

at the state meet. Casey is a sophomore transfer from UW-Whitewater, which finished third at the Division III Outdoor National Championships last season.

Middle Distance/Distance

Senior Jeremy Majors headlines the Panthers' middle distance group which has put a runner atop the 800m at the last three league indoor meets and the last two meets outdoors. Majors has won the last two outdoor championships in the event and qualified for the NCAA Regionals in the event each of those years.

Senior Justin Gorman also returns with an indoor 800m title on his resume and plenty of experience and success in the middle distance events.

In the longer events, junior Nick Hawley is coming off a breakout cross country campaign in the fall and could lead the corps this season. He was an all-league second team honoree when he took 10th at the league cross country meet and was the top Panther runner at four of the five meets of the season.

Two more cross country runners that could be factors for UWM this season are freshmen Malachi Cate and Ryan Mleziva. Cate took first at his first collegiate race in the fall and was among the team's top three runners the rest of the season. Mleziva was the team's fourth runner for much of the cross country season, as he scored at all four meets he competed.

Hurdles/Multi-Events

Milwaukee returns two of the league's top hurdlers in the aforementioned Schleis and Bohler. The pair were neck and neck much of last season, posting season-best sprint hurdle times that were second and third in school history and separated by just hundredths of a second.

Schleis won the 110m hurdles outdoors as a freshman in 2006, while Bohler was right behind him in second and won the 400m hurdles. Both athletes figure

to pop up prominently in various field events, as both added league titles last season in non-hurdle events.

Freshman Tyler Bucholz will look to add depth as a rookie after a storied prep career in Minnesota. At Robbinsdale Cooper High School he was ranked second in the state in three events and third in another. He also won a state title with the 4x400m relay, demonstrating that he could possibly join Bohler in the longer hurdle events.

Bohler and Bucholz will likely form the Panthers' multi-event group.

Bohler won the league heptathlon event at the indoor meet last season, but elected not to compete in the decathlon outdoors. Instead, he scored in five different events, including a 400m hurdle title and second-place finishes in the 110m hurdles, high jump and long jump.

This season, the league's multi-events will be held a week before the league championships, so it is possible that Bohler could compete in the decathlon and an assortment of other events.

Long Jump/Triple Jump

The Panthers' strongest area last season had to have been the horizontal jumps, where they took five of the six scoring places at the league's outdoor championships in both events. Schleis and Cole lead the group, while sophomore Josh Zill was steady last season.

Schleis found more success in the long jump, where he took second indoors and placed first outdoors. Meanwhile, Cole was the opposite in the triple jump, taking second to departed senior teammate Sean Cludy outdoors and winning the event indoors. Schleis and Cole each scored in both the long and triple jumps both indoors and outdoors.

Zill also placed third, both indoors and outdoors, in the triple jump and added a fifth-place finish in the outdoor long jump.

High Jump/Pole Vault

The pole vault area was hit the hardest by graduation, as Schultz and Snyder were among the top three in school history in the event. The pair accounted for four league titles in their UWM careers.

Sophomores Sean Jaehnig and Adam Podd do return with a year of competition under their belts. Jaehnig took third at the league indoor meet last season and fourth outdoors.

Cole has been one of the team's more consistent performers in the high jump, winning an indoor league title last season. This season he will have help in the form of freshman Quinn Mongoven. Mongoven was a four-time conference champion at Wilmot Union High School

and earned all-state honors twice.

Throws

Corfeld and his staff return one of the most seasoned throwing groups the league has seen in recent years. Heading that list are seniors Gretz and Wichert. Gretz is one of the most decorated throwers in school history, winning four league championships and taking second five times in his career. He was also the league field performer of the meet both indoors and outdoors and qualified for regionals as a sophomore in 2005.

Wichert is the school record holder in the hammer throw and joined Gretz at the regionals in his last active outdoor season. The 2005 hammer throw champion, he redshirted the 2006 outdoor

season and, combined with an indoor redshirt as a freshman, he has one year of competition remaining.

Junior Larry Ehrhorn also returns, while freshman Shane Teigen joins the group after a standout career at Gretz's prep alma mater—Two Rivers High School. Ehrhorn has consistently scored for UWM throughout his first two seasons and has been named all-league once, earning second-team honors indoors in the shot put as a freshman.

Teigen competed just one season in high school, but won conference titles and competed at state in the discus and shot put. He placed third in the discus at the state meet and broke Gretz's school record in the event.

SEASON PREVIEW

Panthers Have Championship Fever After 2006 Indoor Title

Milwaukee has finished second-or-better 18 of last 19 league meets, looking for titles 9 and 10

Since 1997, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee women's track and field program has finished below second place at a Horizon League championship meet just once, winning eight league titles and taking second 10 times.

Last season, the Panthers got a taste of a championship, winning indoors, and enter 2007 looking to add to their already impressive list of accomplishments.

Head coach Pete Corfeld has a load of talent, experience and youth returning this season, while dealing with the loss of a few key athletes.

Tenia Fisher, Katie Slamka and Stephanie Ray and their combined 13 career league titles have graduated. Fisher was a four-time Horizon League Athlete of the Year, while Slamka routinely competed in a variety of events and won a league heptathlon title. Ray established herself as one of the top pole vaulters in the league and school history.

But, senior Timeka Walker, junior Joy VanLaanen and sophomores Jenni Saarinen and Beth Zimmerman are among those returning with their sights set on adding to the UWM trophy case. Each were all high point-scorers at league meets last season and they all figure prominently in the school's top 10 lists in their events. The group also accounted for seven league titles last season and another three all-league second-team awards.

Sprints

Walker enters her senior campaign as the school record-holder in three of the program's four main sprint categories, sitting first in the indoor 60m and 200m and outdoor 200m but second in the outdoor 100m. She also won three league titles last season, bringing her career total to five.

Junior Shannon Buttchen returns with Walker in the sprint events, while freshmen Kelsey Conrad and Stef Ross will join the fray as well. Conrad took second in the 200m and 400m at the Minne-

sota state meet as a senior and added a third-place showing in the 100m. Ross redshirted last season after winning a state 100m championship for Bradley Tech High School in Milwaukee.

Middle Distance/Distance

The Panther distance corps is looking good after a standout cross country season where a school-record three runners earned all-league honors. Sophomore Holly Nearman led the group with a seventh-place finish and first team accolades. After redshirting 2005, her first track season was highlighted by a third-place showing in the 10,000m at the league's outdoor meet.

Junior Angie Huebner, who took 12th, and senior Kourtney Nault, who was 13th, earned second team honors in cross country. Huebner returned from an injury to regain her form and finish as the team's second runner at the end of the season. She won the indoor 5000m last season and has scored in every distance event over her first two seasons. Nault has emerged as a strong threat in the distance events, taking fifth in the indoor 5000m last season.

Junior Erin Magargee nearly joined the group in cross country all-league honors, taking 15th to miss the second team by one place. Magargee has consistently gotten better, scoring at every meet in the fall and finishing among UWM's top 3 three times.

With the loss of Fisher and Griffin McNulty to graduation, the middle distance was hit hard. But, Corfeld plans to develop new talent in that area. Freshman Laura Ring, coming off her first cross country season, could compete in the shorter distance events for Milwaukee. Ring has 800m experience, holding the Wilmot Union High School record and competing at the state meet in the event.

Hurdles

The hurdles are the first of four areas where Saarinen is expected to be a fac-

tor. But, in the case of the hurdles, the incumbent is senior Taryn Cozine, who enjoyed her best season in 2006. She ran the seventh-best 100m hurdle time in school history and took third in the 400m hurdles at the league outdoor meet. Saarinen competed in the 100m hurdles at the outdoor meet and tied Cozine's 100m hurdle time.

Senior Andrea Ziebell also returns, while Rasheedah Helm joins the group after an impressive prep career. She won state titles in her last two years in the 100m hurdles, holds her school's record in the event and competed at the state meet in a handful of other sprint and relay events.

Multi-Events

Saarinen set Milwaukee records in both its indoor and outdoor multi-events. She scored 3459 points in winning a league title in the pentathlon indoors, then scored 4993 points at the Drake Relays in the heptathlon. At the outdoor meet, she did not compete in the heptathlon, but rather scored in all five events she entered, including a school-record long jump of 19-9 ½ to win the long jump and a second-place finish in the javelin.

This season, the league's multi-events will be held a week before the league championships, so it is possible that Saarinen could compete in the heptathlon and an assortment of other events.

Sophomore Kory Olson also returns in the multi-events after taking fifth in the pentathlon at the league indoor meet last season. She also competed in the triple jump, taking fifth, and the long jump. Outdoors, however, she suffered an injury during the multi's at the league meet and took seventh. At full health this season, she could lend depth to the multi-events and more.

Long Jump/Triple Jump

The Panthers have cornered the market in the league's long jump competition, winning 17 of the last 21 long jump championships. VanLaanen and Saa-

rinen split titles last season, with VanLaanen taking top honors indoors and Saarinen outdoors. VanLaanen is coming off an injury that cost her the 2006 outdoor season and may redshirt this indoor season, as well.

Zimmerman posted the second-best triple jumps, indoors and outdoors, in school history last season and took second at both league meets. She teamed with classmate Kicha Cary to give UWM a solid one-two punch in the event. Cary also finish among the school's top 10 in each event and finished fourth at both league meets.

Freshman Reigna Pierce was a three-time state qualifier in the triple jump at Racine Horlick High School and could continue UWM's recent success with underclass jumpers. As a senior at Horlick,

she was second in the state.

High Jump/Pole Vault

VanLaanen headlined the pole vault for Milwaukee last season when she met the NCAA Provisional height of 12-11 1/2 and broke the school record by almost 10 inches. She went on to win the league pole vault crown before suffering an injury at a last chance qualifier.

Sophomore Jes Weyandt and freshman Erin Havener are a pair of young pole vaulters who won state titles in the pole vault as seniors in high school after second-place finishes as juniors. Weyandt cleared a career-best 11-5 3/4 outdoors last season and placed fourth at the league meet.

Saarinen placed third in the high jump at both league meets, while also posting

the fifth-best indoor and second-best outdoor heights in school history. Her indoor jump actually came during the pentathlon, while her outdoor leap was during the heptathlon at Drake.

Throws

With the addition of two throwers, the Panther women could be their deepest in this area in a while. Freshmen Jamie Woods and Ashley Zander join the program that has not competed a female thrower outside of the javelin at a league meet since the 2003 outdoor meet.

Woods competed at state five times over the shot put and discus events, taking seventh in the shot put as a senior. Zander, meanwhile, holds school records in both the shot and discus events at Bonduel High School in northeast Wisconsin.

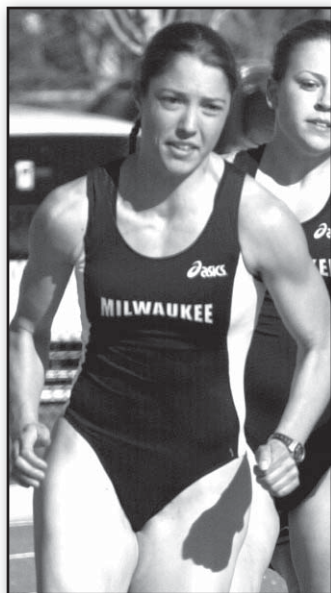

RECORDS/HISTORY

Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference

Like a majority of the schools in the University of Wisconsin System, UW-Milwaukee spent time in the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC).

The University began competition in the Wisconsin Normal Conference in 1913, with records indicating the men's team had won the inaugural track & field championships in 1915.

The conference, as well as member institutions underwent multiple name changes, eventually becoming the Wisconsin State University Conference (WSUC). UWM left the WSUC in 1964.

Records indicate the Milwaukee women competed in the Women's WIAC (WWIAC) from 1976 until 1984. The conference instituted an indoor league meet beginning in 1977.

In 1997, the WSUC and WWIAC merged to form the co-ed WIAC.

Men's WSUC Championships

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee is on record as having won 33 WSUC Outdoor Championships in the 46 years between 1915 and 1964. The Green Gulls, as was the school's nickname from 1927-56, won 26-straight titles from 1928-53. There were no championship meets for four years during World War II from 1943-46.

Carlos Santiago

Chancellor

Carlos E. Santiago is the seventh Chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. In this position, he is the chief administrative officer of the university, and a partner with a great number of constituents on and off campus.

Chancellor Santiago also holds the academic rank of Professor of Economics at UWM. As a labor economist, he has regional expertise in the Caribbean and Central America, with special emphasis on Puerto Rico. His research interests include labor market issues, problems of structural adjustment and debt, and labor migration to the United States. He has received grants and fellowships from a variety of organizations including the Ford Foundation, Rockefeller Foundation, Fulbright Association, National Science Foundation, and Russell Sage Foundation.



He formerly held the position of Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at the University at Albany, State University of New York and functioned as the Chief Operating Officer of the campus. He also formerly held the post of Associate Provost and Dean of Graduate Studies. He served as Associate Director of the Center for Latino, Latin American and Caribbean Studies (CELAC), and was Chair of the University Faculty Senate at the University at Albany for the academic year 1996-1997.

With the University at Albany, Provost Santiago was a member of its National Collegiate Athletic Association Certification Steering Committee, worked closely with the athletics department on academics- and admissions-related issues, and was involved with the New York Giants annual National Football League summer training camp held at the University at Albany.

"Universities must focus on creating the scholar-athlete," Chancellor Santiago said. "Winning is nice, but first and foremost you have to focus on the academics. UWM clearly has that mindset, as shown by last year's outstanding performance both in the classroom and



on the playing field. I will be a strong supporter of this unbeatable approach to academics and athletics."

Dr. Santiago is the author or co-author of five books focusing on Puerto Rican society and economy, with the latest being the forthcoming "Puerto Ricans in the United States: The Development of a Commuter Nation," co-authored with Edna Acosta-Belén. He has co-edited another book and has published more than 30 articles and book reviews in a wide variety of scholarly journals. Along with Dr. Acosta-Belén, Dr. Santiago also is a founding co-editor of the Latino Research Review and is a member of the U.S. Congressional Hispanic Caucus International Relations Advisory Group.

Dr. Santiago's wife, Azara Santiago-Rivera, has also joined the faculty at UWM. She is an associate professor of educational psychology in the School of Education.

Chancellor Santiago has a Ph.D. in economics from Cornell University (1982) and M.A. degrees in economics from Cornell University (1979) and the University of Puerto Rico (1975).

Like most other boys growing up in Puerto Rico, Dr. Santiago played baseball year-round and aspired to follow national heroes Roberto Clemente and Orlando Cepeda to Major League Baseball. Dr. Santiago played third base throughout high school and earned a place on his division's all-star team. In recent years, his sporting interests have included golf, tennis, downhill skiing, walking and jogging. He also helped coach softball teams for his daughters.

UWM Athletic Board

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Athletic Board plays a role in connecting the athletic department to the rest of the campus community. Made up of a variety of staff and faculty members, students and alumni, the board meets monthly and gets involved in a number of the activities of the athletic department.

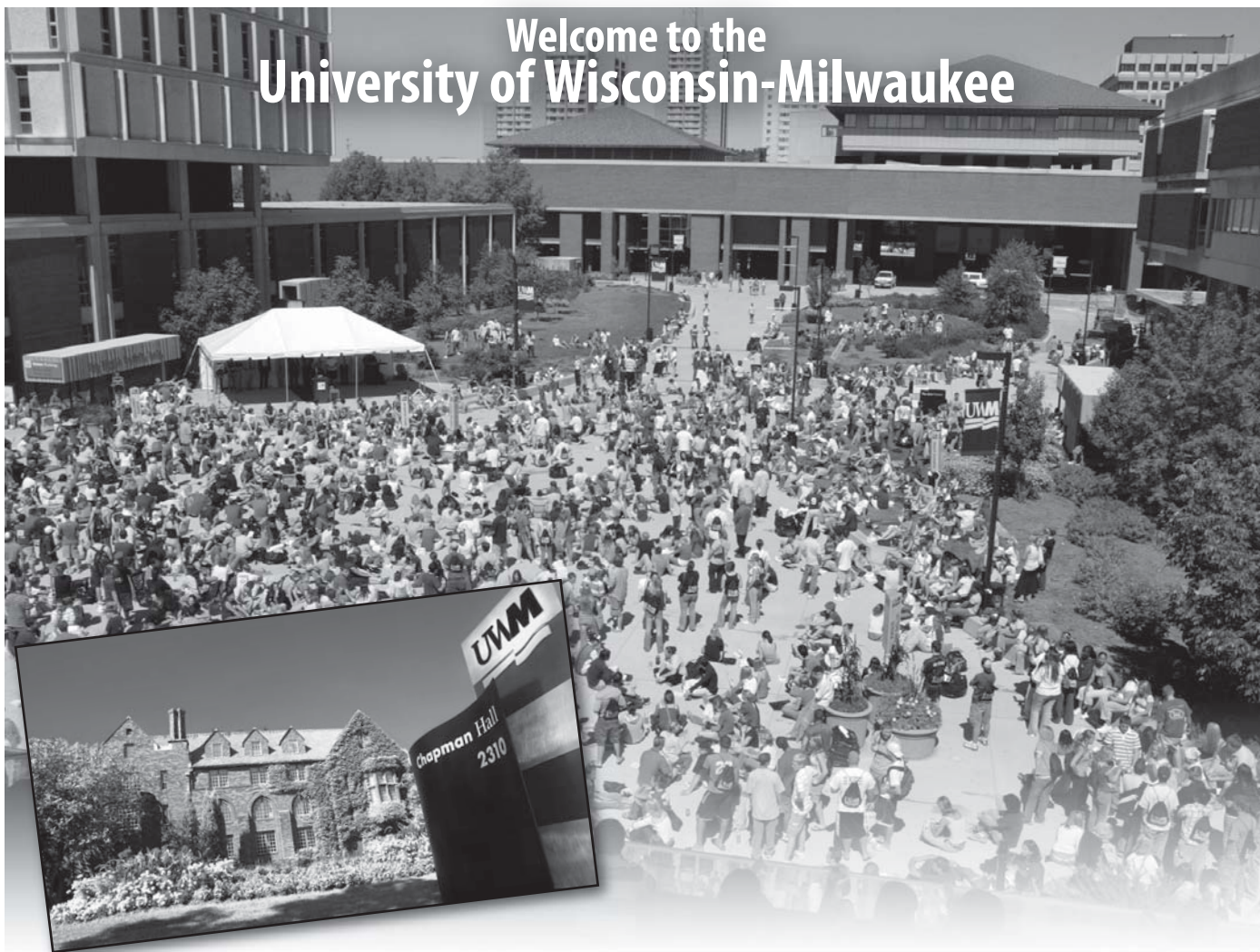
The board's stated mission includes fostering an environment in which a diversified UWM athletic, intramural and recreation program can be competitively and finan-

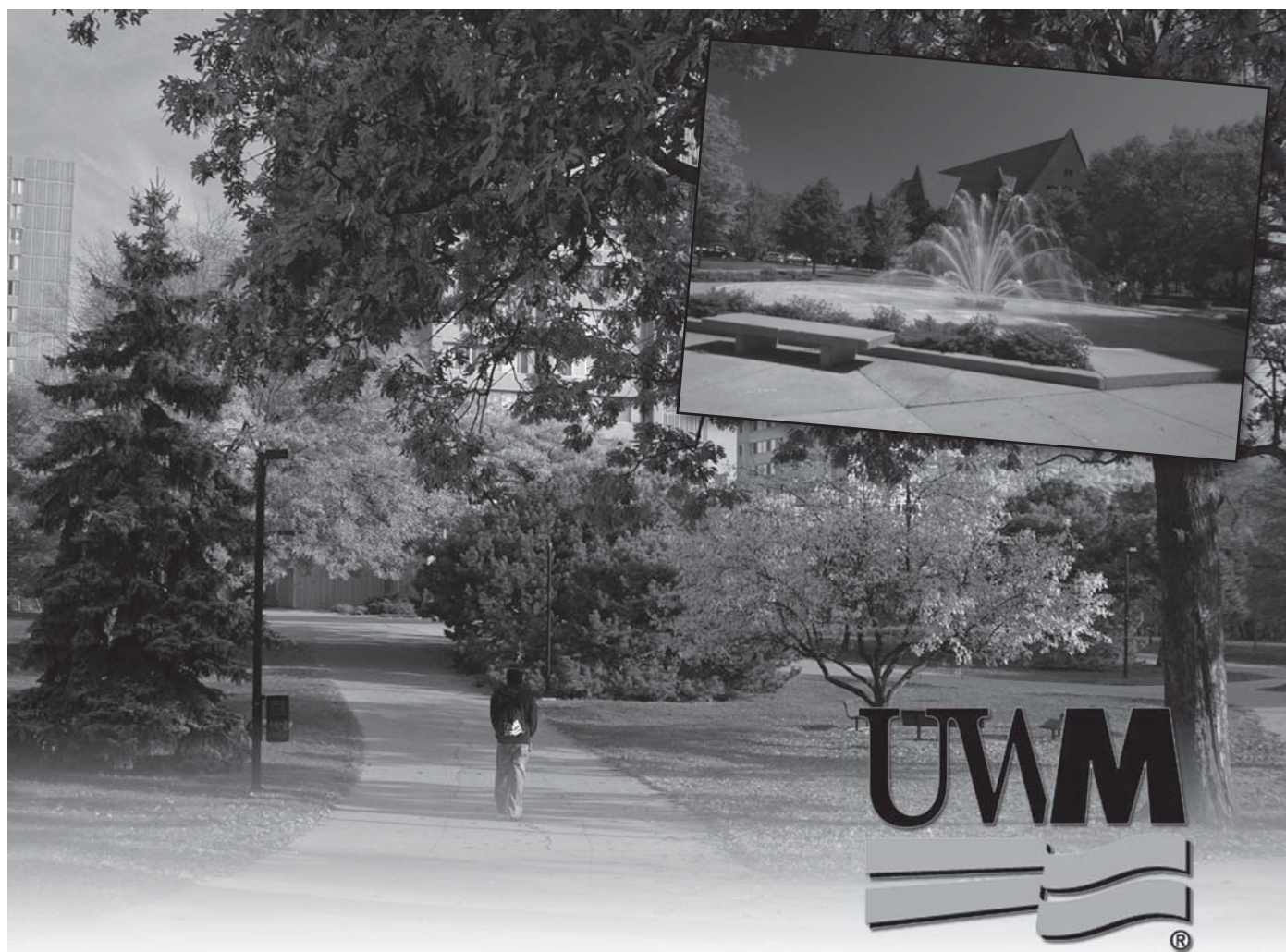

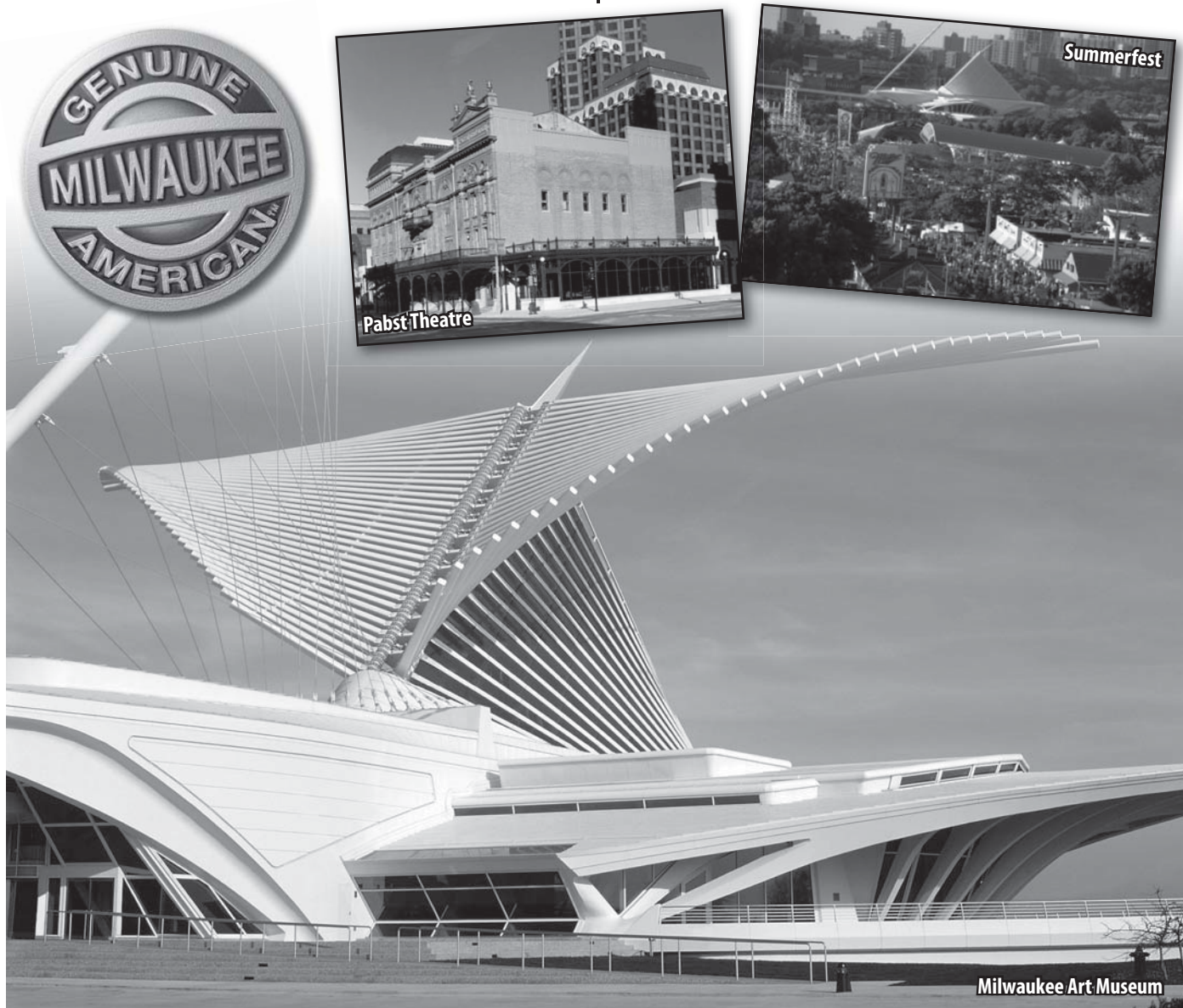
Milwaukee, The Genuine American City, is steeped in tradition and history, alive in growth and development. From the sparkling clean water of Lake Michigan, to the rich heritage of our ethnic neighborhoods, Milwaukee invites you to discover its unique, diverse community.

Heralded as "The City of Festivals," Milwaukee hosts more than 15 annual festivals, including the world's largest music festival, Summerfest, and over a dozen ethnic festivals all held along Milwaukee's spectacular lakefront.

The RiverWalk, which meanders through the heart of downtown, recently received a \$13 million facelift, and development continues to the north and south. Fine food, cultural venues, eclectic shops, exciting nightlife and a wide array of distinctive sports bars are located along the RiverWalk. Also prevalent along the RiverWalk are many brewpubs and microbreweries. Gondolas and water taxis frequently travel Milwaukee's scenic RiverWalk area.

The Historic Third Ward is quickly becoming the "off-Broadway" of Milwaukee's arts scene. It is home to the new Broadway Theatre Center as well as another, smaller, experimental theatre. In addition, this restored warehouse district features a number of art galleries, the well-regarded Milwaukee Institute of Art and Design, coffee houses, cafes, and antique stores. An abundance of new housing in the form of loft-style apartments and condominiums are also becoming a part of the landscape in the Historic Third Ward.

Milwaukee's museum scene is also active. The Milwaukee Art Museum has wrapped up a \$100 million expansion featuring a dramatic wing-like sculpture rising high above Milwaukee's lakefront. The Milwaukee Public Museum is in the midst of a \$6.5 million project establishing a permanent interpretation of "Butterflies Alive!," the museum's most successful exhibit ever. The Milwaukee County Zoo is well-known as one of the finest in the nation.



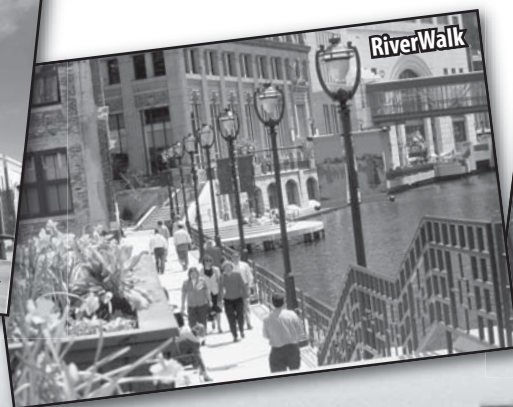
Milwaukee also loves its sports. The city put its stamp on Major League Baseball with the arrival of Miller Park in the spring of 2001. The \$400 million, one-of-a-kind ballpark features a convertible roof and natural grass. Offering the finest in ballpark amenities, Miller Park is a park within a park - that is, it includes places to tailgate along the Menomonee River, a sports-themed restaurant, and an elegantly finished restaurant, the .300 Club. Miller Park also played host the Major League All-Star Game in 2002.

Two of the city's other professional sports teams, including the NBA's Milwaukee Bucks, play at the downtown Bradley Center. In addition, the U.S. Cellular Arena downtown is now the home of the UWM men's basketball team, as well as the Milwaukee Wave of the Major Indoor Soccer League. The arena has undergone major renovations and also hosts a number of concerts and other special events.

The Milwaukee Mile, an auto racing track located at State Fair Park, is home to a NASCAR Busch Series and an Indy Racing League event, added just this year. Plus, the sports landscape also includes an annual PGA event and one of the best county park systems in the nation.

Milwaukee is also a tourist and business destination for travelers around the state and nation. The Midwest Express Center downtown serves as the city's main convention center, and draws groups from around the world to host their annual activities in Milwaukee.

Milwaukee is also easy to get to, located at the intersections of interstates 94 and 43. Milwaukee's General Mitchell International Airport has nearly 20 airlines and over 500 daily departures and arrivals, and Amtrak runs daily non-stop trains to Chicago.

Bud Haidet

Athletic Director

Athletics has been a way of life for UWM Director of Athletics Bud Haidet, and Haidet is busy making success a way of life for the UWM Athletics Department.

In fact, the department has experienced unprecedented success on and off the playing surface under Haidet. This past year, UWM won the McCafferty Trophy, the Horizon League's All-Sports Trophy, for the fourth time in six years. UWM won 10 league titles and claimed a third-straight regular season league title in men's basketball. UWM has also won the women's all-sports award in five of the last six years and the men's all-sports award for two-straight years.



The biggest highlight of last year came after the Horizon League basketball season was completed. The Panther men again made their mark in the NCAA Tournament, beating Big 12 power Oklahoma before falling to eventual national champion Florida. At the same time, the Panther women were battling with Michigan State in the NCAA Tournament, only to fall in the contest. Those basketball accomplishments came on the heels of a 2005 post-season run that saw the Panther men advance to the Sweet 16 and garner national recognition.

Basketball is far from the only sport where UWM has experienced tremendous success. In fact, both the men's and women's soccer teams advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament this past year. The men knocked off Bradley before falling in overtime to national runner-up New Mexico, while the women beat Purdue before falling to Marquette on a last-second goal.

The success at UWM actually started long ago. UWM finished second in the McCafferty Trophy standings during the 1997-98 school year and during the 1999-2000 school year. In fact, following the 1999-2000 season, UWM finished just one point out of first place and won the MCC men's all-sports championship. The Panthers then won the league's all-sports trophy for the first time after the 2000-01 season, and then won it again after the 2003-04 campaign.

Many of UWM's teams have also gained national recognition under Haidet. The great success of the men's basketball team also includes an NCAA berth in 2003 and a National Invitation Tournament appearance in 2004. The men's soccer team has qualified for the five of the last six NCAA Tournaments and has been ranked as high as eighth in the nation. The women's volleyball team has qualified for six of the last nine NCAA Tournaments while women's soccer has made four NCAA Tournament trips since 2001 and advanced to the second round in each of the last two seasons. The women's basketball team also made the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and baseball has been a regular in the NCAA Tournament.

UWM has also earned the reputation for hosting successful Horizon League Championships. The men's basketball tourna-

ment has regularly set attendance records in Milwaukee while tournaments for women's basketball, men's and women's soccer and women's volleyball have all drawn accolades.

In the classroom, 67 UWM student-athletes were named to the Academic Honor Roll this past spring, the highest number in the league. Numerous Panthers have also won league and national academic awards. And, the current cumulative grade point average of all student-athletes is above 3.0.

Haidet has also directed an upgrade in facilities for all of UWM athletics. The recently-completed Klotsche Center renovation - the Pavilion - has vastly improve the office and training space for the athletic department. Haidet has also led the extremely successful move by the men's basketball team to the U.S. Cellular Arena in downtown Milwaukee and shown the way for improvements at Henry Aaron Field and Engelmann Field, which had lights installed prior to the 2006 soccer seasons.

Over Haidet's tenure, athletics at UWM has moved from NAIA Division II to NCAA Division I status, and from independent status to membership in two athletic conferences, raising the bar of competition each time. Haidet notes that the strong commitment to athletics by the institution and student association has greatly contributed to the rapid and successful growth of the program. He also feels past student-athletes, coaches and administrators helped set in motion the success UWM enjoys.

Haidet is active in numerous NCAA activities. He has completed Level I-III NCAA Athletics Management courses and was a member of two NCAA Division I Peer Review Certification teams and two NCAA committees. He is was recently the chair of the Horizon League's Executive Council and is active in all of the league's activities.

Prior to coming to UWM, Haidet was an athletics administrator at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, where he earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees. Last fall, he was inducted into the Miami Athletics Hall of Fame. A former captain in the marine corps, Haidet enjoys weight training, hiking and fishing, and spending time with his wife, Beth, stepson, Drew, four children and 13 grandchildren.

Chuck Lang

Associate Athletic Director

Chuck Lang joined the UWM athletic department in the fall of 2002 as an associate athletic director. As the associate director of external affairs, Lang's duties include supervising the assistant director of external operations, the athletic business office and the fundraising coordinator.

Most importantly, he serves as the chief financial administrator. This includes overseeing policy development, public relations and negotiation and construction of all major contracts.



Lang is also in charge of the men's and women's soccer programs at UWM and has helped to oversee the Panther men's basketball team's transition to the U.S. Cellular Arena in 2003. He has also played an integral role in the expanded radio and television coverage for UWM basketball and has taken the lead for the department on developing an integrated marketing plan for all of UWM's sports.

The expansion of UWM's marketing efforts have included an extensive deal with Clear Channel for radio coverage and advertising, a deal with the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel for increased advertising and an agreement with Weigel Broadcasting for extensive television coverage on CBS-58 and WMLW in Milwaukee. UWM has also experienced a steady rise in season ticket sales over the last five years.

Jason Clark

Assistant Athletic Director

Jason Clark was named the assistant athletic director for external operations in April of 1999. Clark serves as the marketing director for UWM's athletic department while also participating in other external affairs.

His main responsibilities are sponsorship sales, marketing, promotions and advertising for all 15 of UWM's varsity sports. In addition, he oversees the Panther Media Network, helping to coordinate UWM's relationships with Clear Channel Communications on the radio side and Weigel Broadcasting on the television side.



Clark also helps to coordinate some special events for the athletic department, including the annual men's basketball golf outing and the athletic department's participation in the Wisconsin State Fair. He also coordinates the activities of the UWM cheerleaders and the school's mascot, Victor E. Panther.

Joe Rodriguez

Faculty Athletic Rep.

Joe Rodriguez is beginning his second year as the Faculty Athletics Representative for the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

Rodriguez is an Associate Professor in the Department of History at UWM, where he has taught for the past 14 years. He is also the Director of the Urban Studies Programs at UWM. Rodriguez has been published in the areas of U.S. Latino history and U.S. urban history. He is currently researching the ways the Milwaukee media represents urban development.



In his role as faculty athletic representative, Rodriguez provides oversight and advice in the administration of the athletics program. In particular, he reviews academic performance and the delivery of academic services to the student-athlete. He is also involved in the monitoring of the personal welfare of the student-athletes and institutional compliance with NCAA and conference regulations.

Steve Lautz

Compliance Coordinator

Stephen Lautz is starting his fourth year as the compliance coordinator for UWM Athletics.

Prior to coming to UWM, Lautz was a law clerk and associate for Bond, Schoeneck and King in Overland Park, Kan., for four years. He represented colleges and universities on matters involving NCAA legislation and conducted investigations of alleged NCAA rules violations. He was also involved in conducting audits of athletic departments, particularly in the areas of recruiting, summer camps and clinics.



He did his undergraduate work at Gustavus Adolphus before attending law school at the University of Kansas. He also served as Editor-in-Chief of the Kansas Journal of Law and Public Policy.

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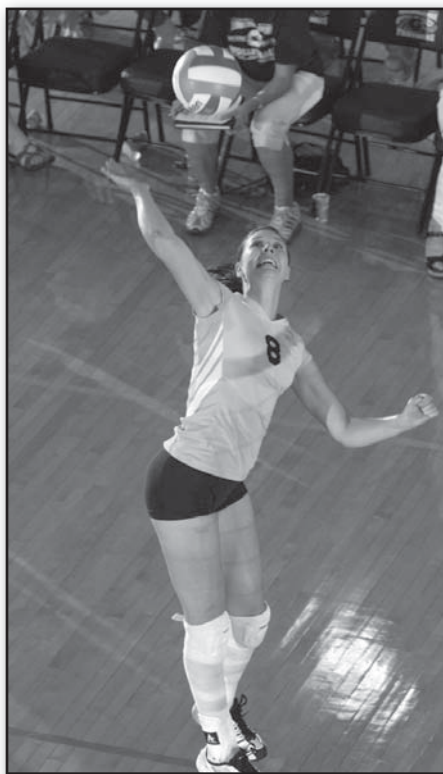
UWM Athletics - A Winning Way

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee has moved itself into a prominent position both regionally and nationally in the world of intercollegiate athletics.

For the fourth time in the last six years, UWM found itself on top of the Horizon League when the 2005-06 school year ended. The Panthers claimed the league's McCafferty Trophy, given to the top athletic program in the league. UWM also won the award in 2000-01, 2003-04 and 2004-05, and has won five of the last six women's all-sports awards along with the last two men's sports awards.

UWM earned the McCafferty Trophy thanks to another great year by a number of teams during the 2005-06 seasons. UWM's fall sports squads of men's soccer, women's soccer and women's volleyball all won Horizon League titles while the men's and women's soccer teams advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. It was the fifth-straight appearance in the second round for the men, while the women beat Purdue in a penalty kick shootout to advance to the second round for the first time ever.

Then last winter, UWM's men's basketball team won its third-straight regular season Horizon League title, won the league tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The appearance in the tourney was the third in four years for the men, who have now won three NCAA Tournament games over the past two seasons. One year removed from a run to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament, the Panthers knocked off Oklahoma in the first round before falling to eventual national champion Florida. The Panther women's basketball team also won the league and advanced to the NCAA Tournament, while the men's track and field team won both indoor and outdoor league crowns and the Panther women won an indoor league title.



Good things have been happening in UWM athletics for some time. In the 2002-03 season, UWM won five league titles and sent four teams to NCAA Tournament play. The Panther men's soccer team was ranked as high as eighth in the nation and the men's basketball team made its first NCAA Tournament appearance. UWM's first McCafferty Trophy came after the Panthers won nine league titles in the 2000-01 school year.

UWM student-athletes have also become known for their work in the classroom. This past spring, 67 student-athletes were named to the Horizon League Academic Honor Roll. UWM student-athletes also regularly appear on the league's academic all-league teams and the cumulative grade-point average for the athletic department consistently is above 3.0.

Quality facilities are also a part of the athletic scene at UWM. The new Pavilion, an addition to the Klotsche Center, opened in January of 2006 and now houses all

of the athletics offices, as well as new locker rooms, team rooms, training rooms, weight rooms and an academic center. The facility, which also includes a tremendous amount of space for the general student population, rates as one of the best athletic office and workout facilities in the Horizon League.

The project also included a renovation of the 5,000-seat Klotsche Center, which is home to the women's volleyball, women's basketball and track and field teams. The facility now has air conditioning and a new sound system, as well as two new concession stands. Plus, with it standing adjacent to the new Pavilion, fans attending events can park in the Pavilion's new parking garage and attend events without ever stepping outside. The swimming and diving teams have their own pool in the Klotsche Center, located on the lower level.

UWM's men's basketball team has played at the U.S. Cellular Arena in downtown Milwaukee since the 2003 Horizon League Tournament. The move downtown has been a successful one, with attendance records set each season the Panthers have played in the historic building.

Meanwhile, UWM's other recent facility improvements have come at the soccer and baseball fields. On-campus Engelmann Field, home of the Panther soccer

teams, is renowned to be one of the best collegiate soccer facilities in the country. Lights have been added to the field this summer, and a new team room has also been developed. The Panther baseball team plays at Henry Aaron Field, while occasionally getting the chance to play at Miller Park. Extensive work on the field, fencing and dugouts has been completed over the last few years, with plans for additional renovations on the table.

Athletics has a long history at UWM. Some sports records date back to the late 1800's and UWM fielded a football team until 1974. UWM has played on all levels of NCAA competition, including stints as a Division II and Division III institution along with its current run in Division I. UWM athletics also spent some years in NAIA competition. The school's athletic teams have also competed in the Wisconsin state school league for a number of years, while competing in the Mid-Continent Conference and Midwestern Collegiate Conference/Horizon League since moving to Division I.

UWM has 15 varsity athletic teams and offers its prospective student-athletes aid in the form of athletic scholarships. Full and partial scholarships are available in all 15 varsity sports. Full scholarships include the cost of room and board, in addition to tuition and books. Scholarships are based on athletic ability and academic success.

The UWM Athletic Offices are located in the new Pavilion, located on the northeast corner of campus. The parking garage adjacent to the Pavilion is accessible from both Edgewood and Downer. If you enter from the garage, turn left in the Pavilion lobby and the athletic offices are on the left. If you arrive through the main entrance on the east side of the building, the athletic offices are on the right.

John Ochsenwald Dir. of Sports Medicine

Director of Sports Medicine John Ochsenwald oversees the sports medicine department. Ochsenwald, who assumed his duties in July 1992, supervises assistant trainers and student trainers in all sports, and serves as staff athletic trainer for the men's soccer and men's and women's swimming programs. He is also a clinical assistant professor and teacher in the Athletic Training Education Program.



Ochsenwald came to UWM from the University of Illinois, where he was an assistant athletic trainer for 10 years. At Illinois, Ochsenwald worked primarily with the football, baseball and wrestling teams.

A 1980 graduate of The Ohio State University, Ochsenwald received his master's degree from Illinois in 1982. He worked at Illinois as a graduate assistant athletic trainer before assuming a full-time position there. Ochsenwald and his wife, Jan, have two children, Jenna and Jamie, and make their home in Cedarburg, Wis.

Chuck Serpa Strength and Conditioning Coach

Chuck Serpa serves as UWM's strength and conditioning coach, working with all 15 of the school's varsity sports.

Serpa has spearheaded a number of positive developments in the strength and conditioning program, highlighted by the new dedicated athletics weight room in the new Pavilion. The strength training area features free weights, resistance machinery and specialized motor-skill and coordination equipment, all designed to condition athletes, increasing their strength, power, speed, endurance and agility.



UWM's strength and conditioning program also incorporates plenty of work with athletes to develop and retain natural flexibility, jumping skills and reaction times.

Serpa has also implemented the department's first training manual that contains nutritional information, along with general strength training exercises and sport-specific strength training exercises. He has also brought more structure and organization to the strength and conditioning area. Finally, Serpa has instituted a summer training program so student-athletes can continue their training year-round.

The UWM's Athletic Training Staff is responsible for taking care of the school's student-athletes. This licensed and certified athletic training staff is headed by Director John Ochsenwald. The entire staff is closely involved in the education of about 30 undergraduate athletic training students, whom, in conjunction with the Department of Human Movement Sciences, are working and studying to become certified athletic trainers in the highly successful and nationally accredited Athletic Training Education Program, which is spearheaded by curriculum director Dr. Kyle Ebersole. These undergraduate students assist the certified athletic training staff in the day-to-day care of the student-athlete's sports medicine needs.

The staff includes a select group of sports medicine professionals. The Panthers also have access to other specialized professionals to assist in peak performance.

In addition to teaching the undergraduate athletic training students, the staff provides care on a daily basis to UWM's 295 student athletes. Each year the facilities, equipment, supplies and knowledge are upgraded to progress sports medicine care to UWM's student-athletes. The athletic training staff moved into its new working space in the Pavilion this past January. The state-of-the-art 5,500-square foot athletic training facility added a SwimEx hydrotherapy unit to a more recent progressive equipment addition, an isokinetic testing and strengthening Biodex unit.

THIS IS UWM

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's Athletic Department is committed to enhancing the opportunities of academic, athletic and personal success of every student-athlete. As part of UWM's commitment, a partnership has been created between the academic and athletic communities on campus to give all student-athletes an opportunity to achieve academic success.

UWM has had a full-time athletic academic advisor since 1998, and recently added a second staff member dedicated to academics, reinforcing its commitment to its student-athletes' academic success. All new student-athletes meet with their advisor on an individual basis to assess specific needs. Programs for academic advancement are developed, including monitoring courses, grades and academic progress.

UWM's commitment has paid off. The Panthers have regularly had more student-athletes on the Horizon League Honor Roll than any other league school, and the department's cumulative grade-point average is better than 3.0.

The Academic Assistance Center, located in the new Pavilion, provides student-athletes with a quiet place to study, as well as one-on-one tutoring opportunities. The academic center also houses a full computer lab and numerous tutoring rooms, and provides a closely-monitored atmosphere for studying and academic progress.

• Priority Registration - Academic Monitoring

Student-athletes receive priority when registering for classes. Academic advisors provide ongoing assistance with class scheduling and career planning. Progress reports from the professors of each student-athlete are sought periodically throughout the year, and academic progress is monitored regularly.

• Tutors

Individuals and group tutors are available in all subjects to student-athletes upon request. The new Pavilion has private tutoring and study rooms for student-athletes.

• Structured Study

All freshmen are required to attend study table for eight hours per week. Students meet Monday through Thursday for two hours per night and are monitored by a member of the coaching staff. Upperclassmen with a cumulative grade point average of less than 3.0 are also required to attend, however their hours are pro-rated based on their GPA.

• Post-Graduate Opportunities

UWM boasts a 95 percent job placement rate through the on-campus Career Development Center. Approximately 200 employers interview on-campus each year. Workshops are offered to assist student-athletes in planning their career paths. Numerous internships and job opportunities are available in the metro Milwaukee area, the business and economic center of Wisconsin.

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee is a member of the NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills Program. The mission of the NCAA and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee is to maintain intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the campus educational program and the student-athlete as an integral part of the student body. With this in mind, the UWM program, "SUCCESS," was created to support student-athlete development and to enhance the quality of the student-athlete experience within the university setting.

The life skills program includes five major commitments:

- **Commitment to Academic Excellence** – to support the academic progress of the student-athlete toward intellectual development and graduation.
- **Commitment to Athletic Excellence** – to build philosophical foundations for the development of athletic programs that are broad-based, equitable and dedicated to the well-being of the student-athlete.
- **Commitment to Personal Development** – to support the development of a well-balanced lifestyle for student-athletes, encouraging emotional well-being, personal growth and decision-making skills.
- **Commitment to Career Development** – to encourage the student-athlete to develop and pursue career and life goals.
- **Commitment to Service** – to engage the student-athlete in service to his/her campus and surrounding communities.

As participants in the CHAMPS/Life Skills Program, numerous UWM student-athletes - including two men's basketball players - have been chosen to participate in the NCAA Foundation Leadership Conference. Kalombo Kadima was chosen to be a part of the conference in 2000, while Dan Weisse took part in the conference in 2001. Three women's soccer players from UWM - Fanta Cooper in 1999, Erin Blaedow in 2000 and Erin Shaugnessy in 2003 - have also taken part in the conference, as has Chris Dadaian of the men's soccer team in 2004.

The NCAA Foundation Leadership Conference is one of the largest noncompetitive gatherings of student-athletes representing NCAA Divisions I, II and III. The participating student-athletes are selected from more than 1,000 nominations that were submitted by member institutions that participate in the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills Program.

Criteria for selection to the leadership conference include the student-athletes' demonstrated ability and strong desire to be a leader and potential to benefit significantly from a leadership-development experience.

TOM VOLLMAN

Athletics Academic Advisor

Tom Vollman currently serves as UWM's athletics academic advisor. In addition to developing a comprehensive program for academic enhancement, Vollman is responsible for providing tutoring and support service assistance, coordinating coursework, and monitoring grade reports, academic progress, and degree completion requirements.



Vollman is also extensively involved in the CHAMPS/Life Skills Program at UWM, coordinating academic workshops for student-athletes. He helps to spearhead the athletic department's various community service projects, including the regular "Neighborhood Clean-Up" events the athletic department participates in. Vollman is also part of the planning for UWM's annual Student-Athlete Awards Ceremony and has coordinated a number of student-athlete social activities.

Before joining the UWM Athletics Department staff, Vollman worked as an English instructor with UWM's Academic Opportunity Center. He also taught English, math, literature and history at the Marva Collins Preparatory School of Wisconsin.

Vollman is a native of Cincinnati, Ohio. He earned a Bachelor's degree in both psychology and philosophy from Marquette University in 1999 and then earned a masters degree in Liberal Studies from UWM in 2004.

SHARIF CHAMBLISS

Student-Athlete Tutor/Mentor

Former Big Ten basketball standout Sharif Chambliss has been added to the UWM athletic department staff as a Student-Athlete Academic Support Tutor/Mentor.



In the newly created position, Chambliss will provide both academic and personal support to UWM student-athletes. In particular, he will work closely with student-athletes in need of extra assistance in helping them achieve success in the classroom.

Chambliss, a Racine native who attended St. Catherine's High School, played three seasons at Penn State before transferring to the University of Wisconsin for his final season of eligibility. He started 30 games for the Badgers during the 2004-05 season, helping UW to the Elite Eight. He finished his career eighth in Big Ten history with 255 three-pointers while scoring 1,106 career points.

UWM Lands League-Best 67 On Academic Honor Roll

Panther student-athletes excel again in classroom

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee placed 67 student-athletes on the Horizon League's Spring Academic Honor Roll.

That number tied Butler for the most in the league, continuing a trend of stellar academic performance by UWM student-athletes. For the spring semester, UWM student-athletes again compiled a department-wide grade-point average of better than 3.0.

The list of honorees from UWM is highlighted by 12 student-athletes apiece from both women's soccer and women's track and field/cross country. The list also includes seven members of the women's volleyball team and women's swimming and diving team along with six people apiece from men's track and field/cross country, men's soccer and men's swimming and diving. There were also five women's basketball players, three baseball players, two women's tennis players and one men's basketball player honored.

Members for the Horizon League Academic Honor Roll must meet three criteria in order to qualify: 1) participation in at least one of the League's 19 sports during the most recent (or current) season; 2) completion of three semesters (or four quarters, where applicable) as a full-time student at the same member institution; and 3) a cumulative grade-point average of at least 3.25 (on a 4.00 scale).

The J. Martin Klotsche Center is the home to the majority of Panther athletic teams, including both track and field teams.

In 2003, UWM played host to the league indoor championship meet for the second time. It had claimed both the men's and women's league titles when the facility first hosted the meet in 1999.

The Klotsche Center was originally erected in 1977 and a major addition to the facility - named The Pavilion - was completed in early 2006. The \$45 million project added new office space, weight rooms, locker rooms, team rooms and a practice and intramural gymnasium with an upper-level running track. The project also included renovations to the existing Klotsche Center, including air conditioning, a new sound system and new concession stands for the arena.

Milwaukee annually hosts a number of meets at the Klotsche Center, including the UWM Panther Tune Up during the indoor regular season. The track teams also host a handful of developmental meets each year. These developmental meets, which are open to all local competitors, allow a number of Panthers the opportunity to compete before the indoor season begins in mid-January.

The Klotsche Center is used as a practice facility for most of UWM's varsity sports, and serves as the homecourt for volleyball and women's basketball. A four-lane indoor track, added in 1996, is home to the UWM men's and women's track and field teams, and the Klotsche Center pool, located on the lower level, is home to the UWM swimming and diving teams.

It also houses training facilities, weight facilities and more, all within close proximity of the main practice areas.

The Klotsche Center is also home to UWM's intramural program and recreation center. It features a 25-meter pool, racquetball courts, weight rooms, training rooms and classrooms for instructional use, along with upstairs office space and additional storage areas. Renovation work was done recently on many of these areas.

The arena area was renovated prior to the 1998-99 school year. The \$2 million project included the addition of comfort and chairback seating. In 1996, new wood flooring and a new indoor track were added to the Klotsche Center. The floor has also been renovated with the addition of the Horizon League logo. The addition of the new Panther and UWM logos was

completed in the summer of 1999.

The Klotsche Center can hold as many as 5,000 spectators for a sporting event, and the volleyball capacity is approximately 2,000. Track and field events feature track-side seating in addition to team areas in the center of the racing oval. The largest crowd to ever see a sporting event at the Klotsche Center is 5,015, present when the UWM men's basketball team faced Butler two seasons ago. The volleyball attendance record of 1,102 was set in 2006 when the Panthers hosted No. 11 Wisconsin.

UWM's freshman convocation is annually held at the Klotsche Center in addition to other special events. During the summer of 2001, the Yugoslavian National played an exhibition here in preparations for the World Championships where it won the gold medal. President George W. Bush also made an appearance at the Klotsche Center in August of 2002.

The Klotsche Center has been home to a number of major sporting events, including the 2003 and 2006 Horizon League Women's Basketball Tournaments, the 2001 league volleyball tournament and the 2001 WIAA Boys' and Girls' Sectional Basketball Championships.

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's newest on-campus building is the Pavilion, which is the home of UWM Athletics. The Pavilion officially opened its doors to the public in January of 2006, though some work on the structure and the adjacent grounds continued throughout the year. The building was officially dedicated by Wisconsin Governor Jim Doyle and UWM Chancellor Carlos Santiago on May 2, 2006.

Among the new athletics facilities in the building are offices for coaches and staff, a student-athlete-only weight room, new locker rooms for all teams and team rooms and lounges for men's basketball, women's basketball and women's volleyball.

UWM student-athletes are also benefitting from the brand-new sports medicine center in the Pavilion, which more than triples the previous space available for UWM's athletic trainers. The facility also includes a 2,800-square-foot academic assistance center to help student-athletes in the classroom. The new academic center includes a computer lab along with group and individual study and tutoring rooms. A 618-space indoor parking garage is also part of the facility.

"Success leaves clues, and with our entire athletic program ranking as the most successful in the league year after year, we now have something that really proves that," UWM men's basketball head coach Rob Jeter said. "The Pavilion is a great place, not just for our team to train but for our players to have the academic assistance center and resources right here. Our athletic training facility is outstanding – it is on par with places like Wisconsin and Marquette that I have been previously. The locker rooms, the team rooms, the weight room – this is a big-time college atmosphere now. It has all the right pieces to make this an even more successful athletic program."

UWM's general student population is also benefitting tremendously from the new facility. A new fitness center has expansive rooms for cardio workouts, as well as a weight room. The state-of-the-art area is the most visible from the outside of the facility, as it features two levels of windows. The new recreation center has two expansive levels and houses four sport courts surrounded by a suspended 1/8 mile track. The facility is utilized by individuals seeking open gym space, run and walk space on the track, and the University's intramural programs. The building also includes academic facilities for the College of Health Sciences along with accommodations for the new Physical Therapy and expanded Sports Medicine programs.

The \$40 million project, which broke ground in June of 2003, came in below budget. Half of the funding is coming from UWM parking fees, while the other half is from state funds and student segregated fees. The athletic department has also undertaken a variety of fundraising efforts for even greater enhancements within its space in the facility. The most distinctive feature of the 135,000-gross-square-foot Pavilion is the extensive use of glass "walls," creating a feeling of openness and allowing expansive views of nearby Downer Woods and the campus.

THIS IS UWM

In its 28th year, the Horizon League continues to aspire toward its goal of being one of the nation's leading athletics conferences while being recognized as a leader in the development of student-athletes as leaders and role models.

The Horizon League membership features nine public and private institutions that have impressive academic reputations and a storied tradition of broad-based athletic programs. Current membership includes Butler University, Cleveland State University, the University of Detroit Mercy, the University of Illinois at Chicago, Loyola University Chicago, the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Wright State University and Youngstown State University. Valparaiso University will officially join on July 1, 2007, expanding the League to 10 members.

The Horizon League, headquartered in Indianapolis, sponsors competition in 19 sports – nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and tennis) and 10 for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis and volleyball). In all sports, all teams participate in their respective postseason League championships regardless of regular-season performance, allowing all student-athletes an opportunity to qualify for NCAA championships. The League receives automatic bids to NCAA championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

• A Proud History

Founded in 1979 as the Midwestern City Conference with six charter members, the League changed its name to the Midwestern Collegiate Conference in 1985 and added women's sports for the 1986-87 academic year. Charter members of the conference included current members Butler and Loyola as well as the University of Evansville, Oklahoma City University, Oral Roberts University and Xavier University. Among other current members, Detroit joined in 1980 and Cleveland State, UIC, UW-Green Bay, Milwaukee and Wright State came aboard in 1994 (along with Northern Illinois University). Youngstown State joined in 2001. On June 4, 2001, the Horizon League unveiled its current name and ushered in a new dynamic direction that has brought the League closer to its stated goal of being one of the nation's top 10 conferences with a focus on enhancing the student-athletes experience by upgrading the League's market and competitive positions.



• Athletic Success

In the past few years, the Horizon League has enjoyed unprecedented success on the national stage, highlighted by two Sweet 16 appearances (Butler 2003, Milwaukee 2005) and five wins in the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship in the past four seasons, including Milwaukee's victory over the University of Oklahoma this past March. In other sports, League teams have won at least one game in their respective NCAA

Championships each of the last four seasons in men's soccer (Milwaukee 2002-05), the last two in women's soccer (Detroit 2004, Milwaukee 2005) and four of the last five in softball (UIC 2002, 2004; Wright State 2003; UW-Green Bay 2005). Butler's Victoria Mitchell became the League's first NCAA individual champion when she won the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the 2005 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships and then finished fourth at the 2005 NCAA Cross Country Championships.

• Academic Success

Horizon League student-athletes also excel in the classroom as more than 500 have been named to the Academic Honor Roll each of the past three semesters for carrying a grade-point average of 3.25 or better. Thirty-five student-athletes were named to *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-District teams in 2005-06 and 11 earned Academic All-America honors, including two first-team selections.

• Community Service

In addition to its athletics success, the Horizon League has secured a well-earned reputation for its community service initiatives. Each January, member institutions partner with local elementary schools for an art, music and essay contest highlighting the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. with winners recognized at League games on the weekend of MLK Day. The Horizon League Student-Athlete Advisory Committee also has continued a tradition of working with youth at the Kaleidoscope Youth Center in Indianapolis during its annual summer meeting. On campus, student-athletes have raised money and awareness for such causes as breast cancer, diabetes and hurricane relief, while hosting blood drives, neighborhood clean-ups, Big Brother/Big Sister programs and more.

• Demographics

Horizon League institutions boast a combined enrollment of more than 130,000 plus nearly 700,000 living alumni centered in the League's Midwest footprint. League media markets include five of the nation's top 35 in Chicago, Detroit, Cleveland, Indianapolis and Milwaukee, covering more than nine million television households and encompassing nine percent of the nation's television audience.
