PANTHERS NOT CONTENT WITH TOP-TWO STATUS IN HORIZON LEAGUE

MILWAUKEE HAS 24 TOP-TWO FINISHES AT LAST 25 LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP MEETS

Many teams would be content having established themselves as one of the top two programs in their league. For the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee women's track and field team, top-two is not good enough.

The Panthers have tasted success with 11 indoor and outdoor Horizon League championships in the last 13 years to their credit. At the 14 league meets in which it has not claimed a title, Milwaukee has taken second place a remarkable 13 times.

With 24 top-two finishes over the last 25 meets, the team knows it can compete for a championship. But, with 11 titles and 13 second-place finishes, the Panthers know they want to turn those numbers around.

Head coach Pete Corfeld and associate head coach Jason Francis once again returns a strong corps of contributors, while adding another talented freshman class. This is a formula that has netted the coach 36 league championships in his career and 36 league coach of the year awards.

Senior Kelsey Conrad is coming off a standout season in 2009 in every sense of the word. She was the league indoor athlete of the year, the outdoor track performer of the meet, won four individual league titles, two relay crowns and broke a pair of school records. She won her titles in the 60m (7.69) and 200m (24.70) indoors and the 100m (11.86) and 200m (24.05) outdoors. Conrad also broke the school indoor 400m record.

She leads the sprint group, which also featured junior Angie Kaufmann and sophomore Katie Duchow last season. Kaufmann was the team's main competitor in the 400m (56.97 indoors, 56.47 outdoors), posting top-five times in school history in the event both indoors and out. In fact, her indoor personal best is third in school history.

Duchow competed primarily in the shorter sprints, qualifying for the finals of the 60m (7.97 PR) and 100m (25.72). She also ran with the league-champion 4x100m relay (46.90).

Milwaukee adds a pair of decorated high school stars to their sprint corps in freshmen Flo Mafany and Chia Okonkwo. Both were four-time state qualifiers in the hurdles and could lend their speed to the sprint events.

In the 800m, sophomore Erika Hanson and junior Tanaiya Fisher lead the way, while senior Laura Ring, a top-10 competitor in school history in the event, redshirted last season. Hanson took second in the event indoors and third outdoors. She also ran with league-champion relays in the distance medley and outdoor 4x400m.

Fisher had a strong sophomore season in 2009, taking third in the indoor 800m (2:21.60) and fourth outdoors (2:16.89). She is also coming off her

second-straight all-league second-team performance during the cross country season in the fall. With the steady improvement she has shown as a Panther, the coaching staff sees no reason she can't be competing for all-league honors in the event. She could also prove a consistent scorer in the mile and 1500m.

Ring is a former league champion in the 800m (2:10.46) and has several all-league second-team awards to her credit. She is also third in school history in the event, both indoors and outdoors.

Sophomores Kristi Schuette, Shannon Brown and Beonca Mitchell each got their first taste of collegiate track last season and will look to continue their improvement in their second season. Schuette and Mitchell competed primarily in the 800m, while Brown also ventured into the mile run and 1500m events.

In the longer distance events, the Panthers are in good shape with a senior leader returning in Abbie Zaspel. Freshman Elise Sigg teamed with Zaspel in cross country to form a solid one-two punch. The fall performance of the pair is a good sight to see for UWM, which will be without recently-graduated Holly Nearman. Nearman was a standout distance runner who won the 5000m and 10,000m at the outdoor championships last season.

Zaspel will look to step into Nearman's shoes as the leader in the distance events. She was second in the 10,000m last season and has earned all-league first team honors in cross country the last two seasons. Sigg was right behind Zaspel at the majority of the cross country meets in the fall and also earned an all-league first-team award.

The team has shown plenty of depth in the distance events in years past, but will look to the pair to lead the team this season. Freshman Megan Gang, another rookie that competed in cross country, could provide Corfeld with the depth he's looking for. She steadily improved throughout her high school career and carried that trend over into her rookie cross country campaign.

Senior Emily Budde, sophomore Calanetta Burrows and freshmen Mafany and Okonkwo form the team's hurdles group. Budde is fifth in school history in the indoor 60m hurdles (9:15), while Burrows enters her second year as the defending league 400m hurdle (1:02.83) champion. Mafany was state runner-up in both the 100m and 300m hurdle events as a prepster in Illinois. Okonkwo was third in the 100m hurdles as a junior and had top-10 finishes as a sophomore and senior.

Budde is one of three seniors that form a strong base of combined event competitors. With Jenni Parish and Kory Olson, the trio has accounted for three league championships and a pair of runner-up finishes in the indoor

pentathlon, as well as two title and two second-place finishes in the outdoor heptathlon.

Parish is in the final season of an already tremendous career. To her credit, she appears on the school's all-time top-10 in 10 events, including school records in the pentathlon (3,700), heptathlon (5,021) and outdoor long jump (19-9 1/2). She has won seven league titles and earned all-league second-team honors four times.

In addition to her combined event exploits, Olson also has a league javelin championship (127-7) and all-league second-team award. She redshirted the 2009 outdoor season and will be completing her eligibility with a full 2010 slate.

The combined events also features sophomores Laura Hamel and Shelby Schaal and freshman Moriah Myles. Hamel took seventh in the heptathlon at the league meet last season, but also had a fourth-place showing outdoors and sixth indoors in the high jump. Schaal competed mostly in the hurdles as a freshman, taking third at the league championships in the 400m hurdles (1:03.91).

Myles comes to UWM having qualified for the state meet in Illinois in the long jump, triple jump and 100m hurdles. She competed at state her junior season in all three events.

Parish returns as a top high jumper, but will have some company in the event from sophomore Ashlee Mongoven and freshman Chantel McConville. The younger sister of perennial men's high jump champ Quinn on the men's team, Ashlee was fifth in the event indoors at the league meet, while taking seventh and competing in the long and triple jumps at the outdoor meet.

McConville holds her high school's record in the high jump, as well as the pole vault. She will compete in both events for the Panthers after qualifying for state in both events. As a junior, she tied for fifth in the pole vault.

Senior Erin Havener paces the Milwaukee pole vaulters, having established herself as arguably the top vaulter in league history. The Ashwaubenon, Wis., native has won league titles in the indoor and outdoor pole vault events in each of her first three seasons. Over the indoor and outdoor events, she has also reset the league record five times. She set the school's outdoor record last season (12-7 1/2) and competed at the NCAA Regional meet for the first time.

Sophomore Courtney Fisher is in her second year at UWM and freshman Sarah Finer will begin her first season with the Panthers. Fisher tied for third at the league's outdoor meet and Finer was a state qualifier as a senior at the same high school that produced Havener.

Arguably the Panthers' strongest field area could be the horizontal jumps, where seniors Beth Zimmerman and Reigna Pierce are among the school's all-time best. Zimmerman sat out 2009 to focus on her studies, but remains the school record-holder in the indoor (39-9 3/4) and outdoor triple jump (39-6 1/2), while sitting second in the indoor long jump (19-5 1/4) and seventh outdoors. She also has a pair of league crowns and six second-team awards on her resume.

Pierce picked up the slack last season, winning the indoor triple jump and taking second in the outdoor triple jump and both long jumps. She is also second to Zimmerman in both triple jump events (39-6 indoors, 39-4 1/2 outdoors), while sitting ninth in the outdoor long jump (18-10 3/4).

Parish has well-documented success in both the long jump and triple jump, while Budde is another scorer in the long jump events. The area gets a boost with the addition of freshmen Samia Taylor and Erika Suchla.

Taylor took fourth at the Wisconsin Division 1 meet in the triple jump and leapt 38-9 in the event for an early-season mark in December. Suchla capped her high school career with a Wisconsin Division 2 championship in the triple jump.

Senior Jamie Woods and freshman Brittany Alsum form Milwaukee's throwing corps. Woods has shown steady improvement through each of her first three seasons in a Panther uniform. Last season, she earned a pair of all-league second team awards in the indoor shot put and the discus throw. She holds the school record in the weight throw (52-8 1/4) and is second in both the discus (142-5) and hammer throw (146-0). She is also fourth in the shot put outdoors (42-6 1/4) and tied for fourth indoors (43-1 1/2).

Alsum was a state runner-up in the discus throw as a junior, one of three appearances at the state meet during her high school career. She also took third as a sophomore and posted a personal-best discus throw of 154-0 in high school.

PANTHERS REMAIN HUNGRY ATOP THE HORIZON LEAGUE

MILWAUKEE HAS WON LAST SIX INDOOR, SIX OUTDOOR LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIPS

It seems cliché to say that winning league titles has become a way of life for the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee men's track and field team. But, the fact of the matter is that the team has achieved unparalleled success and enters 2010 on a league title run the likes the Horizon League has never seen.

Milwaukee has won the last six indoor and last six outdoor championships for 12-straight league titles overall.

All told, the Panthers have 22 league titles to their credit and they enter each year looking to add to that total.

The 2010 season will be business as usual for the Panthers, as the squad returns a breadth of talent and experience. The list of returners include 16 individual league champions, not including relays, the holders of five school records and the holders of five league records.

Two seniors have set themselves apart in league competitions in Tyler Bucholz and Quinn Mongoven. Bucholz has won eight league titles to go with a perfect 9-for-9 showing in league relay events. He also has one school and three league records to his credit. His personal-best times including 21.17 in the outdoor 200m and a school-record 47.61 in the indoor 400m.

Mongoven, on the other hand, has established himself as the league standard in the high jump. He has won both the indoor and outdoor high jump events in each of his first three years. And, over the last two years, he has improved in his horizontal jumps and now regularly scores in the long and triple jumps with a runner-up finish to his credit.

As with any successful program, head coach Pete Corfeld relies on a steady stream of talented newcomers. It was true last year with rookies Ben Crogan and Nick Dalske each breaking school records and winning league titles. Crogan broke the school's indoor and outdoor pole vault records and is the only Panther to ever clear 16 feet in the event. Dalske won a league title in

the 400m hurdles and lowered the school record by almost eight-tenths of a second.

With a solid base of returners and talented newcomers, Corfeld and his staff look forward to competing for more league titles this season and seasons to come.

Bucholz is the standout in the area of sprints, but will be without Isaiah Adams, a perennial league title contender in the 200m and 400m events. Adams was a two-time 400m champion with six more all-league second-team awards to his credit, but is forgoing his senior season to concentrate on completing his degree.

But, the Panthers are confident in the emergence of junior Cory Yttre last season and think he can join Bucholz to form another solid one-two punch. At the outdoor league championships last season, Yttre finished as runner-up to Adams (47.11) in the 400m, but joined his teammate in eclipsing the school and league records in the event with a time of 47.48. He is also a part of the perennial league-champion 4x400m relay and has run 21.59 in the 200m.

Junior Jared Foerch will be looking for a breakout season of his own. After competing against Yttre in high school at the state meets, Foerch has provided the team with depth in the sprint events his first two seasons. The progress he has made, he could be poised to score consistently for Milwaukee this season.

Freshman Ryan Weir was a standout in both the 400m and 800m for Ripon High School in Wisconsin. He won a state title in the 400m as a senior with a time of 48.37 and narrowly missed the state record in the event. He also took fifth in the 800m (1:55.91) and could add depth to that event.

The 800m was highlighted last season by sophomore Jake Spaciell. In his first season, he took seventh in the event indoors. Junior Andrew Manuel, who competed primarily in the 400m his first season, began competing in the 800m last season.

Freshmen Toney Fisher and John Mariani will also likely compete in the 800m this season. Fisher competed in the event at the Wisconsin state meet as a senior in high school, while Mariani was an all-state and all-conference competitor during his prep career.

Milwaukee has many different weapons in the longer distance events, led by cross country runners that are coming off a standout campaign in the fall. Freshman John Simons and sophomore Chris Schuenke led the squad and were all-league second-teamers. The cross country squad featured a strong top five led by this duo.

Simons' freshman campaign saw him earn league newcomer of the year honors. Schuenke, on the other hand, showed his growth from his first to second season in a collegiate program. The progress was evident towards the end of his freshman track season when he took third in the 3000m steeplechase at the league championships. He is the top returner in that event.

Freshman Jake Reilly and senior Mike Sorenson rounded out a solid four-person pack the cross country team featured at many of its meets. Reilly solidified his standing as the team's No. 3 runner, despite having never competed in a cross country meet prior to the fall. Sorenson has been a solid contributor throughout his career for UWM in both cross country and track.

Junior Thomas Wells and freshman Bobby Glotfelty were two more consistent contributors in cross country that will look to carry over their success into track. Wells did not compete in track last season, but came on strong towards the ends of the cross country season. Glotfelty had a solid fall and will bring a strong prep competition background into his first track campaign.

Senior Ryan Mleziva redshirted the cross country season, but returns as one of the squad's top distance runners. He has been a consistent scorer and team leader during his track career. Another senior returning is Jason Axt, who gives Corfeld flexibility with his ability to run the gamut of events from 3000m to the 10,000m.

Sophomore Dan Uphoff, redshirt freshmen Ryan Baumgartner and Alex Francis and true freshman Kyle Kocher round out the distance group. Uphoff has a full year of collegiate competition under his belt and both Baumgartner and Francis redshirted last track season while competing in cross country. Kocher cut his teeth in the fall and will look to get his footing his rookie track season.

With the departure of Adam Schleis to graduation, the hurdles will have a youthful look this season, as the top returning hurdlers are mostly sophomores. Schleis won five league titles during his career and holds the school records for the shorter hurdle events.

Senior Josh Zill stands out as the most experienced hurdler, with top-10 times both indoors and outdoors in the shorter hurdle events, but focused more on jumps last season. Dalske, with his league title in the 400m hurdles, highlights the list, while he will be joined by fellow sophomores Crogan and Drew Feuk. The latter two primarily competed in the event for their combined events, but still were able to post top-10 times in school history indoors.

In the field events, Mongoven's exploits and flexibility stick out, but he simply leads what is a talented group of competitors in the events.

During his final season, Mongoven will likely have his eyes set on closing out four-straight league high jump titles at the indoor and outdoor events, while also looking to break the school's indoor record (6-11 3/4) that has eluded him thus far and returning to the NCAA Regional meet. It should

also be noted that he has the best outdoor long jump (23-2 1/2) of those returning, as well as the second-best indoor long jump and both triple jumps.

Crogan was the second-best Panther in the high jump last season to go with his pole vault and combined event standing. The first athlete in school history to clear 16 feet in the pole vault, he established school records of 16-3 1/2 indoors and 16-0 3/4 outdoors. In the high jump, he cleared the fifth-best height (6-8) in school history indoors and the eighth-best outdoors.

UWM's indoor pole vault record that was broken by Crogan was set by another then-rookie in Garrett Vetesnik. The Richland Center, Wis., native initially broke the mark with his height of 15-11. He also excelled in the event outdoors, where his best height of 15-7 is tied for fourth all-time. The duo head into their second season in a Panther uniform as the league favorites in the event.

The team will have another full-time pole vaulter competing for it in sophomore transfer Zack Gowdy. During his freshman season at Jamestown College in 2008, Gowdy tied for third at the indoor conference championships and has a personal-best height of 14-6.

Jake Whitewater is another second-year competitor for Milwaukee that burst on the scene as a freshman. He won a league title in the indoor long jump (22-11 3/4) and was an all-league second-team performer in both the indoor and outdoor triple jump events. He was the league's field newcomer of the year indoors, an award given to Crogan at the league's outdoor meet.

Zill will add depth in many of the jumping events, as he has competed in the long, triple and high jump events throughout his career. As a junior, Zills posted top-six jumps in school history in the triple jump (48-1 3/4) and snared all-league second-team awards, both indoors and outdoors. He also cracked the top-10 in the indoor long jump (22-7) and was again an all-league selection.

Feuk and Crogan head the combined event athletes. Both earned all-league second team honors as freshmen. Feuk was runner-up in the decathlon outdoors and posted the third-best heptathlon score in school history indoors. Crogan was second in the heptathlon indoors and scored the second-most points in school history.

The pair will be joined by freshmen Dan Simon and Ryan Rayeske. Simon excelled in the pole vault in high school, tying for fourth at the state meet in the event and breaking his high school's record in the event. Rayeske was a two-year letterwinner at nearby Franklin High School.

Sophomore Matt Jensen returns as the only thrower on the roster. As a redshirt freshman in 2009, he scored in all but one throwing event during league competitions. He was third in the discus throw (150-11) and fifth in both the weight throw and hammer throw (152-6).

PETE CORFELD

Head Coach • 21st Year • Milwaukee, 1986
Cross Country, Distance, Middle Distance, Throws

In his 21st season as the head men's and women's cross country and track and field coach, Pete Corfeld continues to make his mark as one of the most successful coaches the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee has ever seen.

"Pete has done a tremendous job of building his program so that it is at the top of the Horizon League year in and year out," UWM athletics director George Koonce said. "He's our longest-tenured coach and we are fortunate to keep him and see his program continue to succeed."



Corfeld has guided his teams to 33 league indoor and outdoor track titles and three cross country crowns. His 36 league titles are by far more than any other coach in school history. Last season, his men's team claimed league crowns at both the indoor and outdoor meets for an unprecedented sixth-straight year.

In 2007, the Panthers won men's and women's Horizon League championships at both the indoor and outdoor meets. The four-meet sweep was just the second by any league school in history. The first team to accomplish the feat was by his Milwaukee teams in 2001.

Individually, six athletes were recognized as outstanding performer or

newcomer of the year, while the program accumulated 35 individual championships over the two meets.

The 2007 success did not end at the league meet, as a then-school-record eight athletes competed at the NCAA Mid-east Regional. Nick Gretz qualified for the NCAA Championships and Amber Curtis finished sixth in the discus, making her eligible for the NCAA Championships. The throwers' performances netted UWM points at the regional meet for the first time.

Last season's titles marked the 11th and 12th-straight for the Milwaukee men, while the sweep was its ninth since 1998. All told, the men's program has won 22 of the last 25 league meets. That stretch includes 11 of the 12 outdoor championships the league has sponsored.

While the men have found unparalleled success, the women have not been far behind. In fact, over the last 25 league meets dating back to 1997, Milwaukee has failed to secure a top-two finish just once. That string includes 11 league championships.

Both teams have been dominant in their success as four times a Panther team has won a league meet by over 100 points. The program holds league records on both the men's and women's sides for points in an outdoor championship and margin of victory. In 2003, UWM won the women's title with 252 points, 171 ahead of second place. Two years later, it was the men that tallied 231 points, pacing second place by 120.

Corfeld has been recognized for his success many time over, garnering League Coach of the Year honors 36 times in his career. He has coached eight league athletes of the year and 58 outstanding performer and newcomer of the year recipients. Tenia Fisher (2003-06) was just the second athlete in league history, in any sport, to be recognized as athlete of the year three times in one sport (indoor track).





Corfeld works primarily with the middle distance and distance groups in addition to the cross country squads. UWM had the 10th-fastest 4x800m relay in the country in 2005, with the quartet posting a school-record time of 7:26.17.

Corfeld's cross country program has produced 58 all-league performers since the Panthers entered a conference for the 1992 season. He has also coached two individual champions and three newcomer of the year honorees.

In 2008, the Milwaukee women took second place at the league championship and had four runners earn all-league honors for the second-straight year. For the 2008 team, three of those all-league awards were first-team honors. The second-place finishes are the team's best since joining the Horizon League. In 2007, all-league first-teamer Holly Nearman took 12th at the NCAA Great Lakes Regional for all-region honors. It was the highest finish at a Division I regional by a Panther ever. He was also named league coach of the year, the first time in league history the award went to the second-place team coach.

Despite not winning a cross country championship since leaving the Mid-Continent Conference, UWM has continually performed in the upper half of the league standings. After winning a women's crown in 1992 and both the men's and women's championships in 1993, Milwaukee has boasted a pair of

men's league individual champions while rarely finishing below fourth.

Corfeld, the longest-tenured coach currently at UWM, has built well-respected track and field and cross country teams that consistently compete with other schools across the league, region and country.

Under his direction, seven different student-athletes have qualified for the NCAA Championships. In addition to Gretz, Tim Kenney, Cory Peterson and Angie Molter all competed at the NCAA Track and Field Championships, while Chad Zehms was a qualifier in the NCAA Cross Country Championships in 1995. Peterson would later make two more appearances in the NCAA Championships, along with qualifying for the U.S. Olympic Trials in the 800m run in 1996 and placing third in the 800m at the USATF Indoor Championships. Molter was the first UWM female to compete in the NCAA Division I Championships, running the 10,000m in 1996.

Corfeld's athletes have also excelled off the track, as Josh Nygren earned the Horizon League's prestigious Coleman Medal of Honor in 2006. He was the program's third recipient of the honor after Paul McGinley in 2000 and Jonathon Manke in 2002.

Corfeld's coaching career began at St. Mary's Academy in 1980. Three years later he became the head track and field coach at Milwaukee Area Technical College. At MATC, he was named Region XIII and conference coach of the year three times. Corfeld graduated from UWM in 1986 with a bachelor's degree in science. He was then named assistant coach for sprints, hurdles and relays at Northern Colorado, where he also worked on a master's degree. In 1989, after completing his degree, he was named the head cross country and track and field coach at UWM. Since taking over the Panther track program, Corfeld has helped to elevate UWM to a regional and national program.

Corfeld and his wife, Linda, reside in Whitefish Bay, Wis.

JASON FRANCIS

Associate Head Coach • Sixth Year • Indiana State, 2001
Sprints, Hurdles, Pole Vault, Jumps, Combined Events

Jason Francis is in his third season as associate head coach with the Panthers after serving three seasons as an assistant coach. Francis works with the sprints, hurdles, jumps, pole vault and combined events. He also oversees the program's recruiting efforts, strength and conditioning program and assists in monitoring academic progress.



"We are pleased to have Jason in our program," Corfeld said. "He is a track guy, so he really knows his stuff. With his multi-event background, he has knowledge in all areas of track and field, especially the pole vault."

Francis has coached 106 individual league champions since coming to Milwaukee. Three Panthers have also achieved NCAA provisional marks and seven have had NCAA regional marks. Also, school records in his events have fallen 47 times over his first five seasons.

That success has carried over into team championships, as he has helped the Panther men to indoor and outdoor Horizon League Championships in each of his five seasons. The women, meanwhile, won the back-to-back indoor titles in 2006-07, added an outdoor championship in 2007 and indoor title in 2009.



A 2001 graduate of Indiana State University, Francis spent the 2003-04 season as a volunteer assistant pole vault coach at Lewis University in Romeoville, Ill.

In his only season with the Flyers, Francis produced both the indoor and outdoor Division II National Champion and two more All-Americans in the event at both meets. He joined the Lewis staff upon

completion of his masters degree in exercise science from Indiana State in 2003. In 2002-03 Francis volunteered with the Sycamore track team, coaching five athletes to top-six finishes at the league meet in the pole vault.

Francis' affiliation with Indiana State began as a student-athlete, as he competed in the pole vault and decathlon. Four times he was named to the all-conference team, including in 2001, when he won the outdoor conference championship in the decathlon. A Downers Grove, Ill., native, Francis began at DuPage Junior College after a standout prep career at Downers Grove North High School.

Francis is USATF Level II certified in jumps, sprints, hurdles and relays, combined events and throws.

NATE WEILAND

Assistant Coach • Fourth Year • Milwaukee, 2007
Distance, Cross Country

Nate Weiland is in his second season as an assistant with the Panther track and cross country programs after joining the staff in 2007 as a volunteer assistant. He assists head coach Pete Corfeld with the distance runners and cross country teams.

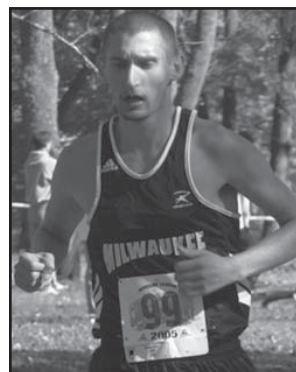


"As a former athlete that has gone through the program, Nate is able to enlighten the younger athletes on its nuances," Corfeld said.

"He is still training at a high level and the example he sets is a great motivator for the team."

In each of his first two seasons, the Panther women have taken second at the Horizon League Cross Country Championships, while both teams were third in 2009. Eleven women have earned all-league honors in that time, including four first-team honors and three in 2008 alone. On the men's side, UWM improved from an eighth-place finish in 2007 to take third place in 2008.

UWM also has shown well at the NCAA Great Lakes Regional. The squad posted the program's second-best Division I regional finish ever in 2006 when it took 14th. Then in 2007, Holly Nearman was the highest-finishing women in the program's Division I history, taking 12th.



Weiland joined the coaching staff after four years as a member of Milwaukee's distance and cross country corps.

In his career, Weiland established himself as a consistent performer, earning all-league second team honors in cross country during his final two seasons. As a senior, he took 38th at the NCAA Great

Lakes Regional, the third-best regional finish in team history and second only to UWM Hall of Famer Chad Zehms. On the track, the Middleton, Wis., native is among the school's all-time leaders in the indoor 3000m and 5000m and the outdoor 10,000m. His 10k time of 30:57.60 is fourth in school history.

Weiland continues to compete, winning the 2008 and 2009 Al's Run in Milwaukee after being runner-up in 2007. He also competed at the Boston Marathon in 2008, taking 288th with a time of 2:45:11. He also owns finishes of 23rd overall at the Grandma's Marathon in Duluth, Minn., in 2007, 23rd (50:50) at the Metronix USATF 10-Mile Championships in conjunction with the Minneapolis Marathon and seventh at the Philadelphia Half Marathon (1:08.48).

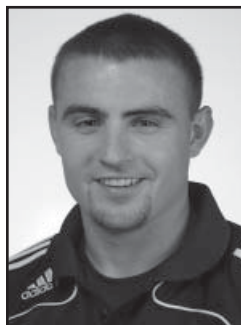
Weiland graduated from Milwaukee in 2007 with a degree in exercise and fitness.

TRAVIS ANDERSON

Assistant Coach • Third Year • Oregon, 2007 • Sprints, Hurdles

Travis Anderson is in his third season as the assistant strength and conditioning coach at Milwaukee and he assists the Panthers in the areas of sprints and hurdles.

Anderson was a three-time All-American at Oregon, helping the Ducks' 4x400m relay qualify for the NCAA Championships in each of his four years outdoors and twice indoors.



He was a part of the top five 4x400m relay times in school history indoors and 12 of the top 13 times outdoors. Anderson and his teammates also posted runner-up finishes at the West Regional three times, taking third once. Individually, he posted the fourth-best indoor 400m time in school history of 47.50.

Anderson graduated from Oregon in 2007 with a degree in geography and psychology.

B.J. PARISH

Volunteer Coach • First Year • Arkansas State, 2008 • Throws

B.J. Parish is in his first year as a volunteer assistant with the Milwaukee track and field teams. He will work with the Panther throwers.

Parish comes to UWM after completing one season as a volunteer assistant at his alma mater, Arkansas State.

Parish competed for ASU from 2003-08, capping his career with a standout senior season. He won both Sun Belt Conference titles in the heptathlon indoors and the decathlon outdoors, setting conference records in both events. He also qualified for the NCAA Championships his senior season, taking 15th.

The Mavern, Ark., native also holds the distinction of being the last ASU athlete to compete as an "Indian" before the University changed its nickname to the Redwolves.

Parish graduated from Arkansas State in 2008 with his degree in physical education and health. He married current Panther Jenni Saarinen this past summer. The couple resides in Milwaukee.

**TIMEKA WALKER**

Volunteer Coach • Third Year • Milwaukee, 2006 • Sprints

After a standout four-year career with the Panthers, Timeka Walker is in her third year as a volunteer assistant with the program. She assists coaches in working with the sprinters.

In a career that concluded with the 2007 season, Walker won nine Horizon League individual championships and broke three school records while ranking second in another event.

She capped her career by winning each league event she competed in as a senior, pacing the field in the 60m (7.71) and 200m (25.41) indoors and the 100m (11.81) and 200m (24.31) outdoors. She broke the league 200m record with a time of 23.94 in the prelims and was named the Outstanding Track Performer of the meet.

Walker was also a part of league championship teams at the 2006 and 2007 indoor meets and the outdoor meet in 2007.

A graduate of UWM, she earned her degree in psychology in 2006 before working toward a second degree in sociology in her final season.

**CAITLIN SCHETTER**

Volunteer Coach • First Year • UW-La Crosse, 2009 • Jumps

Caitlin Schetter has joined the Milwaukee staff this season as a volunteer assistant while she attends graduate school at UWM. She will work with the Panther jumpers.

Schetter recently completed an outstanding track and field career at UW-La Crosse. She won three national championships in the long jump (2008 indoor and 2009 indoor/outdoor) and was honored as an All-American 13 times.

She was also named NCAA National Field Athlete of the Year twice and was named the NCAA Midwest Region Field Athlete of the Year three times.

Schetter also excelled in the classroom while pursuing her degree in communication studies. She was named the USTFCCA's NCAA Division III Indoor and Outdoor Field Scholar Athlete of the Year as a senior. She graduated from UWL in 2009.

A native of Kiel, Wis., Schetter pursuing her master's degree in Milwaukee's Lubar School of Business and also works in the University human resources department.

**Wisconsin Intercollegiate
Athletic Conference**

Like a majority of the schools in the University of Wisconsin System, Milwaukee spent time in the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC).

The University began competition in the Wisconsin Normal Conference in 1913, with records indicating the men's team had won the inaugural track & field championships in 1915.

The conference, as well as member institutions underwent multiple name changes, eventually becoming the Wisconsin State University Conference (WSUC). UWM left the WSUC in 1964.

Records indicate the Milwaukee women competed in the Women's WIAC (WWIAC) from 1976 until 1984. The conference instituted an indoor league meet beginning in 1977.

In 1997, the WSUC and WWIAC merged to form the co-ed WIAC.

**MEN'S WSUC
CHAMPIONSHIPS**

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee is on record as having won 33 WSUC Outdoor Championships in the 46 years between 1915 and 1964. The Green Gulls, as was the school's nickname from 1927-56, won 26-straight titles from 1928-53. There were no championship meets for four years during World War II from 1943-46.

City of Milwaukee

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Milwaukee, The Genuine American City, is steeped in tradition and history, alive in growth and development. From the sparkling clean water of Lake Michigan, to the rich heritage of our ethnic neighborhoods, Milwaukee invites you to discover its unique, diverse community.

Heralded as "The City of Festivals," Milwaukee hosts more than 15 annual festivals, including the world's largest music festival, Summerfest, and over a dozen ethnic festivals all held along Milwaukee's spectacular lakefront.

The RiverWalk, which meanders through the heart of downtown, recently received a \$13 million facelift, and development continues to the north and south. Fine food, cultural venues, eclectic shops, exciting nightlife and a wide array of distinctive sports bars are located along the RiverWalk. Also prevalent along the RiverWalk are many brewpubs and microbreweries. Gondolas and water taxis frequently travel Milwaukee's scenic RiverWalk area.

The Historic Third Ward is quickly becoming the "off-Broadway" of Milwaukee's arts scene. It is home to the new Broadway Theatre Center as well as another, smaller, experimental theatre. In addition, this restored warehouse district features a number of art galleries, the well-regarded Milwaukee Institute of Art and Design, coffee houses, cafes, and antique stores. An abundance of new housing in the form of loft-style apartments and condominiums are also becoming a part of the landscape in the Historic Third Ward.

Milwaukee's museum scene is also active. The Milwaukee Art Museum has wrapped up a \$100 million expansion featuring a dramatic wing-like sculpture rising high above Milwaukee's lakefront. The Milwaukee Public Museum is in the midst of a \$6.5 million project establishing a permanent interpretation of "Butterflies Alive!," the museum's most successful exhibit ever. The Milwaukee County Zoo is well-known as one of the finest in the nation.



Milwaukee also loves its sports. The city put its stamp on Major League Baseball with the arrival of Miller Park in the spring of 2001. The \$400 million, one-of-a-kind ballpark features a convertible roof and natural grass. Offering the finest in ballpark amenities, Miller Park is a park within a park - that is, it includes places to tailgate along the Menomonee River, a sports-themed restaurant, and an elegantly finished restaurant, the .300 Club. Miller Park also played host the Major League All-Star Game in 2002.

Two of the city's other professional sports teams, including the NBA's Milwaukee Bucks, play at the downtown Bradley Center. In addition, the U.S. Cellular Arena downtown is now the home of the UWM men's basketball team, as well as the Milwaukee Wave of the Major Indoor Soccer League. The arena has undergone major renovations and also hosts a number of concerts and other special events.

The Milwaukee Mile, an auto racing track located at State Fair Park, is home to a NASCAR Busch Series and an Indy Racing League event, added just this year. Plus, the sports landscape also includes an annual PGA event and one of the best county park systems in the nation.

Milwaukee is also a tourist and business destination for travelers around the state and nation. The Midwest Express Center downtown serves as the city's main convention center, and draws groups from around the world to host their annual activities in Milwaukee.

Milwaukee is also easy to get to, located at the intersections of interstates 94 and 43. Milwaukee's General Mitchell International Airport has nearly 20 airlines and over 500 daily departures and arrivals, and Amtrak runs daily non-stop trains to Chicago.



Carlos Santiago

Chancellor • Sixth Year At UWM

Carlos E. Santiago is beginning his sixth academic year as the Chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

Santiago is UWM's seventh Chancellor. In this position, he is the chief administrative officer of the university and a partner with a great number of constituents on and off campus.

Chancellor Santiago also holds the academic rank of Professor of Economics at UWM. As a labor economist, he has regional expertise in the Caribbean and Central America, with special emphasis on Puerto Rico.



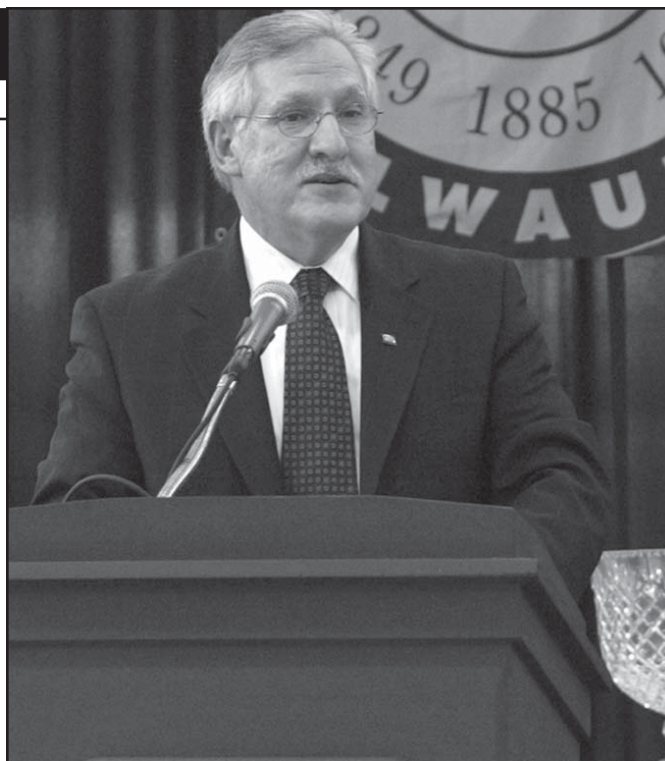
Cooperation and collaboration to strengthen UW-Milwaukee's research portfolio, academic excellence and diversity have been the highest priorities of Chancellor Santiago since his arrival on July 1, 2004. Among the primary results that UWM has achieved during his tenure:

- Securing a historic reinvestment by the State of Wisconsin in the university's and Southeastern Wisconsin's future, especially in the targeted areas of advanced automation, biomedical engineering, health care and freshwater science.
- Completing the record-setting Campaign for UWM, the most ambitious fund-raising effort in university history.
- Developing Access to Success, the campus blueprint to enhance access to higher education while promoting greater success for all students.
- Initiating a master planning process to create a template for regional growth away from the university's extremely compressed primary campus.
- Creating the UWM Research Foundation to support research and innovation, and the UWM Real Estate Foundation to partner with the public and private sectors to develop and hold real estate for the university's benefit.

Santiago also has a strong background in working with athletics.

With the University at Albany, State University of New York, where he held the position of Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs, Santiago was a member of its National Collegiate Athletic Association Certification Steering Committee, worked closely with the athletics department on academics and admissions-related issues, and was involved with the New York Giants annual National Football League summer training camp held at the University at Albany.

"Universities must focus on creating the scholar-athlete," Chancellor Santia-



go said. "Winning is nice, but first and foremost you must focus on the academics. UWM's consistent performance -- in both winning championships and placing leading numbers of students on the Horizon League's Academic Honor Roll -- demonstrates our commitment to both of these objectives."

Dr. Santiago is the author or co-author of five books focusing on labor and economic development issues, with the latest being "Puerto Ricans in the United States: A Contemporary Portrait," co-authored with Edna Acosta-Belén. He has co-edited another book and has published more than 30 articles and book reviews in a wide variety of scholarly journals. Along with Dr. Acosta-Belén, Dr. Santiago also is a founding co-editor of the Latino Research Review and was a member of the U.S. Congressional Hispanic Caucus International Relations Advisory Group.

Dr. Santiago's wife, Azara Santiago-Rivera, is also part of the faculty at UWM. She is an associate professor of educational psychology in the School of Education.

Chancellor Santiago has a Ph.D. in economics from Cornell University ('82) and M.A. degrees in economics from Cornell University ('79) and the University of Puerto Rico ('75).

Like most other boys growing up in Puerto Rico, Dr. Santiago played baseball year-round and aspired to follow national heroes Roberto Clemente and Orlando Cepeda to Major League Baseball. Dr. Santiago played third base throughout high school and earned a place on his division's all-star team.

In recent years, his sporting interests have included golf, tennis, downhill skiing, walking and jogging. He also helped coach softball teams for his

Rita Cheng

Provost and Vice Chancellor

Rita Cheng is the Provost and Vice Chancellor at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, a position she has held since April 2005.

Cheng joined UWM in 1988 as an assistant professor of accounting in the School of Business Administration. Within the School of Business Administration, she held the title of A.O. Smith Professor of Accounting, first as an associate professor from 1994 to 2002 and then as a professor from 2002 to 2004.



She also served as Special Assistant to the School of Business Dean for Affirmative Action from 1994 to 2003. She has also served the university in several high-level administrative capacities in recent years. She was the Interim Dean of the School of Continuing Education in 2004 and 2005, Associate Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs from 2002 to 2005 and Associate Dean of the School of Business Administration from 1998 to 2003.

She holds a bachelor's degree from Bishop's University in Quebec, an MBA from the University of Rhode Island and a Ph.D. from Temple University.

Cheng has also been actively involved with the athletic department throughout her career, serving as faculty athletics representative from 1996-2004, while also being a regular in the stands at most Panther events.

Maureen Keyes

Faculty Athletic Representative

Maureen Keyes is beginning her third year as the Faculty Athletic Representative for UWM. She is also an associate professor in the Department of Exceptional Education.

Keyes' academic work has focused on school reform related to special education. Her research interests include spirituality and leadership for justice. Keyes taught children with disabilities in the public schools, including Milwaukee Public Schools, for almost 20 years. She has written papers and book chapters and co-authored the book, "Meeting the Needs of Students of All Abilities." Keyes earned her undergraduate degree from UW-Whitewater, her master's degree from UW-Oshkosh and her Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin.



In her role as faculty athletic representative, Keyes provides oversight and advice in the administration of the athletics program. In particular, she reviews academic performance and the delivery of academic services to the student-athlete. She is also involved in the monitoring of the personal welfare of the student-athletes and institutional compliance with NCAA and conference regulations.

George Koonce

Director of Athletics • First Year At UWM

George Koonce is the new Director of Athletics at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

Koonce comes to UWM from Marquette University, where he served as a Senior Associate Athletic Director.

He was named to the post on March 17 and officially took over in mid-April.

Koonce spent nine seasons as a player in the National Football League, eight of those coming as a starter with the Green Bay Packers. While in Green Bay, he helped the Packers win their first Super Bowl championship in 29 years.

He also spent a season as a player with the Seattle Seahawks before working as the special assistant to the athletic director at East Carolina University and as the director of player development with the Packers.

In his most recent position at Marquette, Koonce was primarily involved with fundraising, community relations and student welfare. He also served as the sport administrator for the women's soccer program.

"I have every confidence that the experience and familiarity George Koonce has with Milwaukee and Wisconsin fans will greatly benefit the UWM Panthers," UWM Chancellor Carlos Santiago said when announcing the hiring of Koonce. "His energy and enthusiasm will further elevate a strong program built by outgoing director Bud Haidet and his excellent staff."

"I am humbled and thankful for the opportunity to lead an athletic program that has the background and tradition this program has," Koonce said. "This is a great opportunity for me and my family, but with opportunity comes accountability and responsibility. I welcome the challenge of doing my part to help not only the athletic department but the University as a whole. I truly believe in athletics being integrated into the University and in the University becoming an active part of the athletic program. I think it is a perfect fit and I am eager to get started."

Koonce's wide-ranging experiences include a stint as the director of player development in Green Bay. In that role, he assisted players in adjusting to life on and off the field in the NFL.

After a successful college football career at East Carolina, Koonce returned to the school as the special assistant to the athletic director in December of 2003. While at ECU, he was extensively involved in special fundraising projects, including raising \$1 million for the basketball program and over \$5 million for football practice facilities, meeting rooms and renovations of



the academic center. He also earned a master's degree in sports management from the school in 2006.

His variety of experiences — those as a collegiate and professional athlete as well as those as a director of and resource for those athletes — have helped him hone a very succinct and direct message for the mission of the UWM athletic department under his watch.

"Our concern is the student-athlete," Koonce said. "We have to put an emphasis on making sure we have the proper resources and programs in place so they can be successful on the field and off the court. That extends into the community, where we have to make sure we not only integrate them into the campus setting but into greater Milwaukee."

Koonce's NFL career included 720 career tackles (447 solo), nine sacks, one forced fumble, five fumble recoveries and five interceptions, two of which he returned for touchdowns.

In all, he played in 128 NFL games, making 118 starts between his eight years in Green Bay and one season in Seattle.

He has been widely recognized for his athletic accomplishments, earning enshrinement in four different halls of fame.

Koonce was inducted into the National Junior College Hall of Fame in 2000 before also earning a place in the East Carolina University Athletic Hall of Fame 2002, the Chowan College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003 and West Craven (NC) High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005.

Koonce is also currently pursuing his interdisciplinary Ph.D. in sports administration at Marquette.

Kathy Litzau

Associate Athletic Director

After spending 14 seasons as the head volleyball coach at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Kathy Litzau became an associate athletics director and senior woman administrator.

Litzau is overseeing a variety of sports as well as the areas of student-athlete support services and student welfare. She is also acting as the liaison between the athletic department and the campus and community while coordinating community relations projects for the department.



As UWM's volleyball coach, Litzau was named Horizon League Coach of the Year seven times while leading the Panthers to eight Horizon League regular season titles. Her 131 Horizon League victories were by far the most of any active league coach. In all, Litzau led the Panthers to 271 wins in her career.

Litzau is a graduate of Notre Dame, where she played volleyball for four years and was the team captain and most valuable player her senior season. 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UWM Athletics - A Winning Way

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee has moved itself into a prominent position both regionally and nationally in the world of intercollegiate athletics.

In fact, UWM has consistently shown it is the top athletic program in the Horizon League. The school has won the league's McCafferty Trophy five times in the last nine years, including a stretch of three-straight victories from 2003-04 to 2005-06. UWM has also won the women's all-sports awards eight times and the men's all-sports award three times.

The 2008-09 was another banner one for Panther sports, with the year capped by the claiming of another McCafferty Trophy. In the fall, UWM's volleyball and women's soccer teams each won Horizon League regular season and tournament titles, with both squads advancing to the NCAA Tournament. Then, later in the year, the men's track and field team captured both the indoor and outdoor league titles. Plus, the women's track and field won the indoor team title, bringing to 33 the number of team track titles UWM has won since 1998. The women's cross country and women's swimming and diving teams each captured second-place finishes.

But the 2008-09 season was far from the first successful one for Panther athletics. In 2007-08, UWM captured four league team titles and three second-place finishes. The women's soccer and volleyball squads each won regular season crowns while the men's track and field team again swept the indoor and outdoor titles.

In 2006-07, UWM teams won seven league titles while a number of individuals also claimed league crowns. The success started in the fall as both the women's soccer and women's volleyball teams won the league regular season crown, with the volleyball squad also capturing the league tourney title. Both teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament, where the women's soccer team moved to the second round for the second-straight season. UWM also swept the track and field titles, with both the men and the women claiming indoor and outdoor championships.



In 2005-06, UWM saw both of its soccer teams win league titles and advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, while the men's and women's basketball teams also played in the NCAA Tourney. The men again caught the eyes of the nation with a win over Oklahoma in the first round before being eliminated by eventual national champion Florida in the second round.

The men's basketball team also helped put UWM athletics on the national map in 2004-05. UWM pulled off upset wins over Alabama and Boston College to advance to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The Panthers were eventually eliminated from the tournament by national runner-up Illinois, but UWM had already captured the hearts and minds of the nation's college basketball fans.

You have to go even further back to find the true start of the great run of success at UWM. In the 2002-03 season, UWM won five league titles and sent four teams to NCAA Tournament play. The Panther men's soccer team was ranked as high as eighth in the nation and the men's basketball team made its first NCAA Tournament appearance. UWM's first McCafferty Trophy came after the Panthers won nine league titles in the 2000-01 school year.

UWM student-athletes have also become known for their work in the classroom. This past spring, 81 student-athletes were named to the Horizon League Academic Honor Roll. UWM student-athletes also regularly appear on the league's academic all-league teams and the cumulative grade-point average for the athletic department consistently is above 3.0, with a 3.119 cumulative GPA the mark as of this past June.

Quality facilities are also a part of the athletic scene at UWM. The new Pavilion, an addition to the Klotsche Center, opened in January of 2006 and now houses all of the athletics offices, as well as new locker rooms, team rooms, training rooms, weight rooms and an academic center. The facility, which also includes a tremendous amount of space for the general student population, rates as one of the best athletic office and workout facilities in the Horizon League.

The project also included a renovation of the 5,000-seat Klotsche Center, which is home to the women's volleyball, women's basketball and track and field teams. The facility now has air conditioning and a new sound system, as well as two new concession stands. Plus, with it standing adjacent to the new Pavilion, fans attending events can park in the Pavilion's new parking garage and attend events without ever stepping

outside. The swimming and diving teams have their own pool in the Klotsche Center, located on the lower level.

UWM's men's basketball team has played at the U.S. Cellular Arena in downtown Milwaukee since the 2003 Horizon League Tournament. The move downtown has been a successful one, with attendance records set each season the Panthers have played in the historic building.

Meanwhile, UWM's other recent facility improvements have come at the soccer and baseball fields. On-campus Engelmann Field, home of the Panther soccer teams, is reknowned to be one of the best collegiate soccer facilities in the country. Lights were been added to the field two summers ago, and a new team room has also been developed. The baseball team plays at Henry Aaron Field and also plays a doubleheader annually at Miller Park. Extensive work on the field, fencing and dugouts has been completed over the last few years, with a new scoreboard added to the facility in 2008.

Athletics has a long history at UWM. Some sports records date back to the late 1800's and UWM fielded a football team until 1974. UWM has played on all levels of NCAA competition, including stints as a Division II and Division III institution along with its current run in Division I.

Celebrating its 30th anniversary in 2008-09, the Horizon League continues to aspire toward its goal of being one of the nation's leading athletics conferences while being recognized as a leader in the development of student-athletes as leaders and role models.

The Horizon League membership features ten public and private institutions that have impressive academic reputations and a storied tradition of broad-based athletic programs. Current membership includes Butler University, Cleveland State University, the University of Detroit Mercy, the University of Illinois at Chicago, Loyola University Chicago, Valparaiso University, the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Wright State University and Youngstown State University.

The Horizon League's primary focus is on adding value to the educational experience through its four platforms of athletic performance, academic achievement, community outreach, and personal responsibility and accountability. It is the League's belief that athletics is a powerful and visible resource tool that can be used to enhance student-athletes' collegiate experience. The Horizon League's goals are to enhance the holistic university experience for the student-athlete, to create an affiliation of institutions with similar athletic goals, and to adhere to the principals of integrity, diversity, excellence and growth.

The Horizon League sponsors competition in 19 sports – nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and tennis) and ten for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis and volleyball). In all sports, all teams participate in their respective postseason League championships regardless of regular-season performance, allowing all student-athletes an opportunity to qualify for NCAA championships.

The League receives automatic bids to NCAA

championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

The Horizon League is headquartered in Indianapolis, the "Amateur Sports Capital of the World," with offices in the Pan American Plaza (201 S. Capitol Avenue), located a block from Lucas Oil Stadium and just minutes from Conseco Fieldhouse, the State Capitol Building, Victory Field and the NCAA national office.

• A Proud History

Founded on June 16, 1979, as the Midwestern City Conference with six charter members, the League changed its name to the Midwestern Collegiate Conference in 1985 and added women's sports for the 1986-87 academic year. Charter members of the conference included current members Butler and Loyola as well as the University of Evansville, Oklahoma City University, Oral Roberts University and Xavier University. Among other current members, Detroit joined in 1980, and Cleveland State, UIC, Green Bay, Milwaukee and Wright State came aboard in 1994 in the largest non-merger conference expansion in history, with Youngstown State joining in 2001 and Valparaiso in 2007.

On June 4, 2001, the Horizon League unveiled its current name and ushered in a new dynamic direction that has brought the League closer to its stated goal of being one of the nation's top ten conferences with a focus on enhancing the student-athletes experience by upgrading the League's market and competitive positions.

• Athletic Success

In the past few years, the Horizon League has en-



joyed unprecedented success on the national stage, highlighted by three Sweet Sixteen appearances (Butler 2003, 2007; Milwaukee 2005) and eight wins in the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship in the past six seasons.

In other sports, League teams have won at least one game in their respective NCAA Championships each of the last six seasons in men's soccer (Milwaukee 2002-05, UIC 2006-07), with UIC just one win away from the College Cup in 2007. In softball, League teams won a game in the national tournament four straight years earlier in the decade (UIC 2002, 2004; Wright State 2003; Green Bay 2005) while advancing into the second round in women's soccer three of the last four seasons (Detroit 2004, Milwaukee 2005-06). Green Bay's women's basketball team added to that résumé with a victory in the 2007 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship. Butler's Victoria Mitchell became the League's first NCAA individual champion when she won the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the 2005 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships and then finished fourth at the 2005 NCAA Cross Country Championships.

• Academic Success

Horizon League student-athletes also excel in the classroom as more than 500 have been named to

the Academic Honor Roll each of the past seven semesters for carrying a grade-point average of 3.2 or better, including more than 600 for the fall 2007 and spring 2008 semesters. Forty-eight student-athletes were named to ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-District teams in 2007-08, while 14 earned Academic All-America honors, including a pair of first-team selections.

• Community Service

In addition to its athletics success, the Horizon League has secured a well-earned reputation for its community service initiatives. Each January, member institutions partner with local elementary schools for an art, music and essay contest highlighting the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. with winners recognized at League games on the weekend of Martin Luther King Day.

The Horizon League Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) also has continued a tradition of working with youth in Indianapolis during its annual summer meeting, while the League, its schools and fans donate to Komen for the Cure for breast cancer awareness during its annual women's basketball championship. On campus, student-athletes have raised money and awareness for such causes as breast cancer, diabetes and hurricane relief, while hosting blood drives, neighborhood clean-ups, Big Brother/Big Sister programs and more.

• Demographics

Horizon League institutions boast a combined

enrollment of more than 130,000 plus nearly a quarter-million living alumni centered in the League's Midwest footprint. League media markets include five of the nation's top 35 in Chicago, Detroit, Cleveland, Indianapolis and Milwaukee, covering more than 10 million television households and encompassing more than nine percent of the nation's television audience.

• Governance

The Horizon League is governed by a Board of Directors comprised of the ten member institutions' chief executive officers.

Dr. David Sweet, President of Youngstown State, serves as Board Chair through June 30, 2010. Ron Strollo, Executive Director of Intercollegiate Athletics at Youngstown State, serves as chair of the Executive Council, and Christine Moeller, Assistant Athletic Director/Senior Woman Administrator at Cleveland State, is the Second Delegate, while Sheila Patterson of Cleveland State serves as chair of the Faculty Athletics Representatives.

• Leadership

Jonathan B. (Jon) LeCrone is in his 17th year as Commissioner of the Horizon League, having been named to the position on May 11, 1992, and is the ninth-longest tenured commissioner among the 33 Division I conferences. He is the fifth commissioner in League history, succeeding Daniel B. "Tucker" DiEdwardo (1989-92), James W. Shaffer (1984-89), Cecil N. Coleman (1980-

84) and James J. McCafferty (1979-80). LeCrone is in the first year of a four-year term on the NCAA Division I Leadership Council after recently completing a five-year term on the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee.

• McCafferty Trophy

The Horizon League annually awards the McCafferty Trophy in recognition of its all-sports champion in honor of its first commissioner, James J. McCafferty. Cleveland State won its first McCafferty Trophy in school history following the 2007-08 academic year. The Vikings also captured their first Men's All-Sports Award, while Milwaukee claimed the women's honor for the third straight year and seventh time in the past eight years. As an indication of the League's competitive balance, eight of its ten schools won at least one team championship last year.

The J. Martin Klotsche Center is the home to the majority of Panther athletic teams, including both track and field teams.

In 2003, UWM played host to the league indoor championship meet for the second time. It had claimed both the men's and women's league titles when the facility first hosted the meet in 1999.

The Klotsche Center was originally erected in 1977 and a major addition to the facility - named The Pavilion - was completed in early 2006. The \$45 million project added new office space, weight rooms, locker rooms, team rooms and a practice and intramural gymnasium with an upper-level running track. The project also included renovations to the existing Klotsche Center, including air conditioning, a new sound system and new concession stands for the arena.

Milwaukee annually hosts a number of meets at the Klotsche Center, including the UWM Panther Tune Up during the indoor regular season. The track teams also host a handful of developmental meets each year. These developmental meets, which are open to all local competitors, allow a number of Panthers the opportunity to compete before the indoor season begins in mid-January.

The Klotsche Center is used as a practice facility for most of UWM's varsity sports, and serves as the homecourt for volleyball and women's basketball. A four-lane indoor track, added in 1996, is home to the UWM men's and women's track and field teams, and the Klotsche Center pool, located on the lower level, is home to the UWM swimming and diving teams.

It also houses training facilities, weight facilities and more, all within close proximity of the main practice areas.

The Klotsche Center is also home to UWM's intramural program and recreation center. It features a 25-meter pool, racquetball courts, weight rooms, training rooms and classrooms for instructional use, along with upstairs office space and additional storage areas. Renovation work was done recently on many of these areas.

The arena area was first renovated prior to the 1998-99 school year. The \$2 million project included the addition of comfort and chairback seating. In 1996, new wood flooring and a new indoor track were added to the Klotsche Center. The floor has also been renovated with the addition of the Horizon League logo. Last summer, the floor received a makeover with a brand new

Panther logo and the addition of the men's extended three-point line.

The Klotsche Center can hold as many as 5,000 spectators for a sporting event, and the volleyball capacity is approximately 2,000. Track and field events feature trackside seating in addition to team areas in the center of the racing oval. The largest crowd to ever see a sporting event at the Klotsche Center is 5,015, present when the UWM men's basketball team faced Butler in 2003. The volleyball attendance record of 1,102 was set in 2006 when UWM hosted No. 11 Wisconsin.

UWM's freshman convocation is annually held at the Klotsche Center in addition to other special events. During the summer of 2001, the Yugoslavian National played an exhibition here in preparations for the World Championships where it won the gold medal. President George W. Bush also made an appearance at the Klotsche Center in August of 2002.

The Klotsche Center has been home to a number of major sporting events, including the 2003 and 2006 Horizon League Women's Basketball Tournaments, the 2001 league volleyball tournament and the 2001 WIAA Boys' and Girls' Sectional Basketball Championships.

The Pavilion

THIS IS UWM

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The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's newest on-campus building is the Pavilion, which is the home of UWM Athletics.

The Pavilion officially opened its doors to the public in January of 2006, though some work on the structure and the adjacent grounds continued throughout the year. The building was officially dedicated by Wisconsin Governor Jim Doyle and UWM Chancellor Carlos Santiago on May 2, 2006.

Among the athletics facilities in the building are offices for coaches and staff, a student-athlete-only weight room, new locker rooms for all teams and team rooms and lounges for men's basketball, women's basketball and women's volleyball. The UWM Ticket Office is also located just off the main entrance of the Pavilion, providing easy access for those on campus as well as for the general public.

UWM student-athletes are also benefitting from the brand-new sports medicine center in the Pavilion, which more than triples the previous space available for UWM's athletic trainers. The facility also includes a 2,800-square-foot academic assistance center to help student-athletes in the classroom. The new academic center includes a computer lab along with group and individual study and tutoring rooms. A 618-space indoor parking garage is also part of the facility.

UWM's general student population is also benefitting tremendously from the new facility. A new fitness center has expansive rooms for cardio workouts, as well as a weight room. The state-of-the-art area is the most visible from the outside of the facility, as it features two levels of windows. The new recreation center has two expansive levels and houses four sport courts surrounded by a suspended 1/8 mile track. The facility is utilized by individuals seeking open gym space, run and walk space on the track, and the University's intramural programs.

The building also includes academic facilities for the College of Health Sciences along with accommodations for the new Physical Therapy and expanded Sports Medicine programs.

The \$40 million project, which broke ground in June of 2003, came in below budget. Half of the funding is coming from UWM parking fees, while the other half is from state funds and student segregated fees. The athletic department has also undertaken a variety of fundraising efforts for even greater enhancements within its space in the facility. Highlighting those improvements are the greater upgrades made to the men's basketball, women's basketball and volleyball locker rooms.

The most distinctive feature of the 135,000-gross-square-foot Pavilion is the extensive use of glass "walls," creating a feeling of openness and allowing expansive views of nearby Downer Woods and the campus.

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's Athletic Department is committed to enhancing the opportunities of academic, athletic and personal success of every student-athlete. As part of UWM's commitment, a partnership has been created between the academic and athletic communities on campus to give all student-athletes an opportunity to achieve academic success.

UWM has had a full-time athletic academic advisor since 1998, and recently added a second staff member dedicated to academics, reinforcing its commitment to its student-athletes' academic success. All new student-athletes meet with their advisor on an individual basis to assess specific needs. Programs for academic advancement are developed, including monitoring courses, grades and academic progress.

UWM's commitment has paid off. The Panthers have regularly had more student-athletes on the Horizon League Honor Roll than any other league school, and the department's cumulative grade-point average is better-than-3.0.

The Academic Assistance Center, located in the new Pavilion, provides student-athletes with a quiet place to study, as well as one-on-one tutoring opportunities. The academic center also houses a full computer lab and numerous tutoring rooms, and provides a closely-monitored atmosphere for studying and academic progress.

• Priority Registration - Academic Monitoring

Student-athletes receive priority when registering for classes. Academic advisors provide ongoing assistance with class scheduling and career planning. Progress reports from the professors of each student-athlete are sought periodically throughout the year, and academic progress is monitored regularly.

• Tutors

Individuals and group tutors are available in all subjects to student-athletes upon request. The new Pavilion has private tutoring and study rooms for student-athletes.

• Structured Study

All freshmen are required to attend study table for eight hours per week. Students meet Monday through Thursday for two hours per night and are monitored by a member of the coaching staff. Upperclassmen with a cumulative grade point average of less than 3.0 are also required to attend, however their hours are pro-rated based on their GPA.

• Post-Graduate Opportunities

UWM boasts a 95 percent job placement rate through the on-campus Career Development Center. Approximately 200 employers interview on-campus each year. Workshops are offered to assist student-athletes in planning their career paths. Numerous internships and job opportunities are available in the metro Milwaukee area, the business and economic center of Wisconsin.

The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee is a member of the NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills Program. The mission of the NCAA and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee is to maintain intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the campus educational program and the student-athlete as an integral part of the student body. With this in mind, the UWM program, "SUCCESS," was created to support student-athlete development and to enhance the quality of the student-athlete experience within the university setting.

The life skills program includes five major commitments:

- **Commitment to Academic Excellence** – to support the academic progress of the student-athlete toward intellectual development and graduation.
- **Commitment to Athletic Excellence** – to build philosophical foundations for the development of athletic programs that are broad-based, equitable and dedicated to the well-being of the student-athlete.
- **Commitment to Personal Development** – to support the development of a well-balanced lifestyle for student-athletes, encouraging emotional well-being, personal growth and decision-making skills.
- **Commitment to Career Development** – to encourage the student-athlete to develop and pursue career and life goals.
- **Commitment to Service** – to engage the student-athlete in service to his/her campus and surrounding communities.

As participants in the CHAMPS/Life Skills Program, numerous UWM student-athletes have been chosen to participate in the NCAA Foundation Leadership Conference. Men's basketball player Kalombo Kadima was chosen to be a part of the conference in 2000, while Dan Weisse took part in the conference in 2001. Three women's soccer players from UWM - Fanta Cooper in 1999, Erin Blaedow in 2000 and Erin Shaugnessy in 2003 - have also taken part in the conference, as has Chris Dadaian of the men's soccer team in 2004. Then, Natalie Chery of the volleyball team was a conference attendee this spring.

The NCAA Foundation Leadership Conference is one of the largest noncompetitive gatherings of student-athletes representing NCAA Divisions I, II and III. The participating student-athletes are selected from more than 1,000 nominations that were submitted by member institutions that participate in the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills Program.

Criteria for selection to the leadership conference include the student-athletes' demonstrated ability and strong desire to be a leader and potential to benefit significantly from a leadership-development experience.

Tom Vollman

Athletics Academic Advisor

Tom Vollman currently serves as UWM's athletics academic advisor.

In addition to developing a comprehensive program for academic enhancement, Vollman is responsible for providing tutoring and support service assistance, coordinating coursework, and monitoring grade reports, academic progress, and degree completion requirements.



Vollman is also extensively involved in the CHAMPS/Life Skills Program at UWM, coordinating academic workshops for student-athletes. He helps to spearhead the athletic department's various community service projects, including the regular "Neighborhood Clean-Up" events the athletic department participates in. Vollman is also part of the planning for UWM's annual Student-Athlete Awards Ceremony and has coordinated a number of student-athlete social activities.

Before joining the UWM Athletics Department staff, Vollman worked as an English instructor with UWM's Academic Opportunity Center. He also taught English, math, literature and history at the Marva Collins Preparatory School of Wisconsin.

Vollman is a native of Cincinnati, Ohio. He earned a Bachelor's degree in both psychology and philosophy from Marquette University in 1999 and then earned a masters degree in Liberal Studies from UWM in 2004.

The UWM Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) is composed of current Panther student-athletes. It is assembled to provide insight into the student-athlete experience by promoting, fostering, designing and implementing programs that encourage academic achievement, professional development, health-conscious life choices and social responsibility.

The UWM SAAC is committed to the following initiatives:

- Providing student-athletes with the opportunity to effectively communicate with the department administration and offer suggestions to enhance the quality of the student-athlete experience
- Promoting effective communication among coaches, the department administration and student-athletes
- Promoting an awareness of UWM Athletics throughout the campus and the Greater Milwaukee area
- Reviewing NCAA legislative proposals and make recommendations to the department administration

SAAC members serve as liaisons between student-athletes, the athletic administration and the campus community. Athletes are encouraged to communicate concerns and ideas to their captains and/or for discussion at scheduled committee meetings.

The UWM SAAC operates in conjunction with the Horizon League SAAC and the NCAA SAAC. Natalie Chery of volleyball and Emily Budde of track and field/cross country are scheduled to represent UWM on the Horizon League SAAC this year.

In August, members of the Horizon League SAAC visited Riley's Children's Hospital in Indianapolis.



Taking care of Sports Medicine issues for the student-athletes is UWM's Athletic Training Staff. The licensed and certified athletic training staff includes Director of Sports Medicine John Ochsenwald and Assistant Athletic Trainers Becky Worman, Renee Reckelberg, Chad Henneberry, Dave Bugalski and David Lake.

The entire staff is involved in the education of over 40 undergraduate athletic training students. In conjunction with the Department of Human Movement Sciences, these students are working and studying to become certified athletic trainers in the nationally-accredited Athletic Training Education Program, which is spearheaded by Curriculum Director Dr. Jen Earl and assisted by Dr. Stephen Cobb and Dr. Kyle Ebersole. The undergraduate students accrue valuable experiences while assisting the certified athletic training staff in the day-to-day care of student-athletes

sports-medicine needs.

The staff also includes a select group of sports medicine professionals, namely the orthopedic physicians Dr. William Smith, Dr. Todd Swenson, and Dr. Don Middleton - all of whom are associated with Columbia Hospital directly adjacent to UWM's campus and the Orthopaedic Hospital of Wisconsin. Providing vital general medicine health care to the Panthers is Team Physician Dr. Brian Hirano who is on staff at Columbia St. Mary's. Additionally, care is also provided by the team of medical providers at Norris Health Center on campus. The Panthers also have access to other specialized professionals to assist in peak performance, such as chiropractor Dr. Kendal Hoard, dentist Dr. Joseph Schell, general surgeon Dr. Richard Cattey, MD, and registered dietician Julia Syburg, RD, all of whom provide expert care for specific sports medicine needs.

John Ochsenwald

Director of Sports Medicine

Director of Sports Medicine John Ochsenwald oversees the sports medicine department. Ochsenwald, who assumed his duties in July 1992, supervises assistant trainers and student trainers in all sports, and serves as staff athletic trainer for the men's soccer program. He is also a clinical assistant professor and teacher in the Athletic Training Education Program.

Ochsenwald came to UWM from the University of Illinois, where he was an assistant athletic trainer for 10 years. At Illinois, Ochsenwald worked primarily with the football, baseball and wrestling teams.

A 1980 graduate of The Ohio State University, Ochsenwald received his master's degree from Illinois in 1982. He worked at Illinois as a graduate assistant athletic trainer before assuming a full-time position there.
